THE following Statute, made on the tenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred, by the Governing Body of New College, Oxford, and sealed on the twenty-third day of October, one thousand nine hundred, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877" :—

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877," 40 and 41 Vict. cap. 48, and approved by the Queen in Council on the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to New College in the University of Oxford, in the matter of Marriage and Residence of Tutorial Fellows, such amending Statute being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose, held on the tenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred, and passed by the unanimous votes of those present and voting.

For Statute III, clause 11, to substitute the following :—"Every Tutorial Fellow not being married at the time of his election shall vacate his Fellowship by marriage, if such marriage shall take place within seven years from the day of his election. Every Tutorial Fellow shall reside in rooms in the College during the usual College Terms, unless the Warden and Fellows at a stated General Meeting shall have given him leave to reside elsewhere, or shall under any Bye-law existing at the time have given him temporary leave of absence; and there shall always be at least four Fellows being Tutors or Lecturers in the College, resident in rooms in the College, during the usual College Terms. So long as that number is complete, a Tutorial Fellow vacating his Fellowship by marriage shall not be incapable of being elected to fill the vacancy so created, if the Warden and Fellows should desire to retain his services as a Tutor or Lecturer. Residence in a private house forming part of the College buildings shall not be deemed to be residence in rooms of the College for purposes of this clause."

Tasmanian Imperial Bushmen	Private J. H. Bisdee	On the 1st September, 1900, Private Bisdee was one of an advanced scouting party passing through a rocky defile near Warm Bad, Transvaal. The enemy, who were in ambush, opened a sudden fire at close range, and six out of the party of eight were hit, including two Officers. The horse of one of the wounded Officers broke away and bolted. Private Bisdee gave the Officer his stirrup leather to help him out of action, but finding that the Officer was too badly wounded to go on, Private Bisdee dismounted, placed him on his horse, mounted behind him, and conveyed him out of range. This act was performed under a very hot fire, and in a very exposed place.

*Décret du 23 Septembre, 1900.*

Décret fixant les ports où peuvent pénétrer en France et en Algérie les navires provenant des localités contaminées de peste. (Inséré au Journal officiel du 3 Octobre, 1900.)

Le Président de la République Française, sur le rapport du Président du Conseil, Ministre de l'Intérieur et des Cultes et du Ministre des Finances. Vu l'Article 1er de la loi du 3 Mars 1822 sur la police sanitaire; Vu le décret du 4 Janvier 1896, portant règlement de police sanitaire maritime; Vu les décrets des 15 Avril, 1897, et 15 Juin, 1899, relatifs aux provenances des ports contaminés de peste.

## Décret:

**ART. PREMIER.** Les navires provenant des localités reconnues contaminées de peste ou portant des objets énumérés à l'Article 3 du décret du 15 Avril, 1897, ne peuvent pénétrer en France ou en Algérie que par les ports de Dunkerque, le Havre, Saint-Nazaire, Pauillac, Marseille et Alger. Le Ministre de l'Intérieur déterminera les autres ports qui pourraient également être ouverts à ces provenances par exception ou sous réserve de conditions spéciales résultant de l'état sanitaire des navires à leur arrivée ou de la nature de leur chargement.

**ART. 2.** L'Article 4 du décret du 15 Avril, 1897, et l'Article 1er du décret du 15 Juin, 1899, sont abrogés.

**ART. 3.** Le Président du Conseil, Ministre de l'Intérieur et des Cultes et le Ministre des Finances sont chargés, chacun en ce qui le concerne, de l'exécution du présent décret, qui sera publié au Journal officiel et inséré au Bulletin des lois. Fait à Paris, le 23 Septembre, 1900.

#### GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Report to Coroner of Death of Lunatics in Poor Law Institutions:—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions in England and Wales;—

To the Boards of Management of the several Asylum Districts formed under the Metropolitan Poor Act, 1867;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the notification of the death of every poor person of unsound mind in any Workhouse or in any other building subject to the government of a Board of Guardians or Joint Committee of two or more Boards of Guardians, or Board of Management, to the Coroner of the District in which such Workhouse or other building is situated:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

#### ARTICLE I. In this Order:—

The expression "Poor Law Institution" means a Workhouse, a Workhouse Infirmary or other Building subject to the government of a Board of Guardians or Joint Committee of two or more Boards of Guardians, or a District Asylum subject to the government of the Board of Management of an Asylum District.

The expression "Superintending Officer" means in the case of a Workhouse, the Master; in the case of a Workhouse Infirmary, the Superintendent, or where there is no Superintendent, the Steward; in the case of an Asylum subject to the government of the Board of Management of an Asylum District, the Medical Superintendent or other Head Officer; and in default of any such persons includes any other Officer whose duties comprise the notification to the pauper's relatives of the death of any pauper in a Poor Law Institution.

The expression "Lunatic" means an idiot or person of unsound mind.

ARTICLE II. Within forty-eight hours after the death of a Lunatic in a Poor Law Institution notice of such death shall be sent by the Superintending Officer of such Institution to the Coroner of the District in which the Institution is situated, and such Notice shall be accompanied by a Statement signed by the Medical Officer or the Medical Superintendent or the Medical man who attended the lunatic in his last illness and containing the following particulars:—

- (1.) The name, sex, and age of the lunatic.
- (2.) Whether married, single, or widowed.
- (3.) The apparent cause of death.

- (4.) The time of, and any unusual circumstances attending, the death; also a description of any injuries known to exist at the time of death or found subsequently on the body of the deceased.
- (5.) The duration of the disease of which the lunatic died.
- (6.) The names and descriptions of any persons present at the death.
- (7.) Whether or not mechanical restraint was applied to the deceased within seven days previously to death, with its character and duration if so applied.

ARTICLE III. This Order shall come into operation from and after the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred.
