Amesbury and Military Camp Light Railway Order, 1898.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the Light Railway Commissioners, in the present month of November, by the London and South Western Railway Company (in this Notice called "the Company"), for an Order to amend the Amesbury and Military Camp Light Railway Order, 1898 (in this Notice called "the Order of 1898"), as follows (that is to say):—

Roundhay and District Electric Lighting.

(Application to the Board of Trade under the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 to 1899, for a Provisional Order to Produce and Supply Electricity for all Public and Private Purposes within the Township of Roundhay, in the Rural District of Leeds (Roundhay and Seacroft), in the West Riding of the County of York.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made to the Board of Trade, on or before the 21st day of December next, by the Roundhay and District Electric Lighting Company Limited (hereinafter called "the Undertakers"), for a Provisional Order under the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 to 1899, for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

To authorize the Undertakers to produce, store, supply, sell, and distribute electricity for all public and private purposes, as defined by the said Acts, within the township of Roundhay, in the rural district of Leeds (Roundhay and Seacroft), in the West Riding of the county of York (hereinafter called "the area of supply").

To authorize the Undertakers to place, lay down, erect, maintain, alter, and renew electric lines, mains, and other works in, under, over, and along all public and private streets, roads, and other places within the area of supply.

To authorize the Undertakers to purchase, hold, and acquire, or take on lease any lands or ease-

ments in lands which they may require for the purpose of the intended Order.

To authorize the Undertakers to construct, lay down, alter, renew, and maintain, on lands belonging to or leased by, or to be acquired or leased by, the Undertakers, within the area of supply, such central and other stations, buildings, and other works for the generation, storage, and supply and distribution of electricity and electric currents as may from time to time be necessary for supplying electricity within the said area, or for other purposes of the intended Order, together with all engines, machinery, and apparatus necessary or convenient for the purposes aforesaid.

The following are the names of the streets in which it is proposed that electric lines should be laid down within a specified time:—

Park-lane, otherwise called Old Park-road, Park-avenue, West-avenue, main road from Leeds to Wetherby for a distance of half a mile from Leeds City boundary towards Wetherby, North-lane, Oakwood-lane from the main road from Leeds to Wetherby to Ladywood-road, Ladywood-road.

The names of the streets not repairable by a local authority which the Undertakers propose to take power to break up are as follows:—

Park-avenue, West-avenue.

The following is a list of the railways and tramways which the Undertakers propose to take power to break up:—

The tramways of the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and citizens of the city of Leeds.

To confer upon the Undertakers all or some of the powers of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 to 1888, and of the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, and to incorporate with the intended Order all or some of the provisions of those Acts, with such modifications as may be prescribed or provided for by the intended Order.

To authorize the Undertakers to enter into contracts with local authorities, companies, or persons for the execution and maintenance of works, and the supply of electricity, and to relieve the Undertakers from the consequences of any act or defaults of any such contractors.

A map, showing the boundaries of the proposed area of supply and the streets within which it is proposed that electric lines should be laid down within a specified time, and a copy of this notice, as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited, on or before the 30th day of November instant, for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the West Riding of the county of York, at his office at Wakefield, and with the Clerk of the Rural District Council of Leeds (Roundhay and Seacroft), at his office at the Poor Law Offices, in East-parade, Leeds.
