A PROCLAMATION.

EDWARD, R.

**W**E, considering that it is desirable that Saturday, the second day of February next, should be observed as mentioned in the fourth section of the Statute passed in the thirty-fourth year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventeen, and as a day of General Mourning throughout the United Kingdom, Do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Act aforesaid, appoint Saturday, the second day of February next, as a special day to be observed in manner provided by the said section, and as a day on which business shall be suspended in terms of the said section. And We do hereby appoint and direct that the said Saturday, the second day of February next, shall be observed as a day of General Mourning throughout the United Kingdom, and every part thereof. And We do by this Our Royal Proclamation command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

Given at Our Court at *Saint James's*, this thirtieth day of *January*, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and one.

A PROCLAMATION

For discontinuing the currency of the Doubloon in the Island of Jamaica.

EDWARD, R.

**W**HEREAS by virtue of an Order in Council and Proclamation of the third day of February one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, certain portions of "The Coinage Act, 1870," as amended by section two of "The Coinage Act, 1891," were applied to the Island of Jamaica:

And whereas it is provided by the said Order in Council and Proclamation that any coins coined in a foreign country which at the date of the promulgation of the said Proclamation were by law current and a legal tender in any Colony or Possession to which the said Order in Council and Proclamation extended, should, until Our Proclamation otherwise directed, continue to be so current and a legal tender at the same rate and up to the same amount as theretofore:

And whereas under the provisions so applied We may by Proclamation regulate any matters relative to the coinage and the Mint within Our prerogative which are not provided for by the said Act, and may revoke or alter any Proclamation previously made:

And whereas by virtue of an Act of the Island of Jamaica passed in the third year of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, entitled "An Act to provide for the assimilation of the currency of this Island with the currency of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland," it was provided that the doubloon should be deemed to be legal tender at and after the rate of three pounds four shillings:

And whereas it is expedient that the doubloon should no longer be legal tender in the said Island:

Now, therefore, We do hereby, in pursuance of the recited provisions and of all other powers enabling Us in this behalf, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain that the doubloon shall as from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and one, cease to be current or legal tender in the Island of Jamaica.

Given at Our Court at *Saint James's*, this thirtieth day of *January*, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and one.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following copy of Quarantine Regulations in force in the Somali Protectorate, viz.:—

Somaliland Protectorate.

Queen's Regulations under Article 32 of "The Somaliland Order in Council, 1899."

No. 4 of 1900.—Plague.

PART I.

ART. 1. In these Regulations:—

The term "ship" includes every vessel or boat, bugvalow, or other native craft.

The term "master" used in relation to a ship includes the officer or person for the time being in charge or command of the ship, and includes a pilot.

The term "Health Officer" includes any duly qualified medical practitioner appointed or employed to act in the execution of these Regulations, under the orders of Her Majesty's Consul-General.

The term "harbour-master" includes any person acting for or on behalf of the harbour-master.

The term "healthy ship" means any ship which, though coming from an infected port, has had no death from or case of plague on board, either before departure, during the voyage, or on arrival.

The term "infected ship" means any ship with a case of plague on board, or on board which there has been a case of plague within twelve days. The term "suspected ship" means any ship on which there has been during the voyage, or during the stay of such ship in the port or departure, a case of plague, but on board which there has been no such case within twelve days: Provided that any ship to which a person has been transhipped from an infected or suspected ship shall, by reason thereof, be deemed to be infected or suspected, as the case may be, the period of twelve days being for this purpose reckoned from the date of the last case of plague on board the ship from which the said person is so transhipped.

The term "sanitary station" means any place or places appointed or prescribed by the Consul-General as a sanitary station or stations for the purposes of these Regulations.

The term "observation" means isolation either on board ship or at a sanitary station.

ART. 2. Where these Regulations provide that a person may be permitted to proceed to his place of destination subject to surveillance, such permission shall be granted upon the following conditions:—

(a.) He must satisfy the Medical Officer of Health as to his name, intended place of destination, and his address at such place.

(b.) He must agree to submit himself, and must submit himself, to medical supervision at that place during the prescribed period.

(c.) The place must in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health be conveniently situated for the medical supervision.

PART II.—Arrival of Ships.

ART. 3. An infected or a suspected ship, or a ship arriving from an infected port, shall not

communicate with any ship nor with any port or place in the Protectorate, except Zeyla or Berbera, unless it has received pratique at one of the two ports aforesaid, or at the Port of Aden, Aden being at the time a clean port.

ART. 4. The master of any such ship shall, on arriving at a port in the Protectorate, and before entering the harbour, if by day, hoist a yellow flag, and indicate by signal the port from which such ship has come, or, if by night, exhibit two red lights, one above the other at the main.

The said flag and signal shall be hoisted and kept hoisted, and the said lights shall be exhibited and kept exhibited by day and night respectively until permission is given to remove them.

The said flag and lights are in these Regulations referred to as "plague signals."

ART. 5. The master shall bring his ship to anchor in the position indicated by the Health Officer or harbour-master, and shall not, except as in hereafter provided, allow any communication, except orally or by signal, with the shore, or with any other ship or boat, except the pilot's, health officer's, or harbour-master's boat. If a pilot is taken on board, he shall proceed straight to the bridge.

ART. 6. The Medical Officer of Health, having been informed by the harbour-master of the arrival of the ship, shall, as soon as possible, visit the ship, and make such inquiries and inspection as he thinks necessary for determining whether the ship is an infected, a suspected, or a healthy ship, and for this purpose may require a declaration in writing from the medical officer of the ship, or the master, or both, with respect to any material facts within their knowledge. If he is satisfied that the ship is either an infected or a suspected ship, he shall forthwith give a certificate to that effect in duplicate, and shall give one copy to the master and retain the other.

#### PART III.—Infected Ships.

ART. 7. Every infected ship shall be directed to take up her position at the sanitary station, and such ship shall remain there until the requirements in force at that station have been duly fulfilled. Provided that, should the Health Officer consider, either on account of there being no cases on board, and of the ship having on board a duly qualified medical officer, and a disinfecting stove, or for such other reason as he may consider sufficient, that it is not necessary for the ship to proceed to the sanitary station, he shall certify such opinion in writing, and the ship so certified shall take up any other position that may be appointed by the Health Officer, and in such case the provisions of this part shall, so far as the Health Officer may direct, apply in like manner as if the position so appointed were a sanitary station.

ART. 8. On arrival at the sanitary station the sick shall be immediately disembarked and isolated under the orders of the Health Officer, and no person so isolated shall leave such place of isolation until the Health Officer shall have certified that such person is free from plague.

ART. 9. The other persons on board, except such members of the crew as are required for the care of the ship, shall also be disembarked, and, when necessary, kept under observation at the sanitary station for a period varying according to the sanitary condition of the ship and the date of the last case. Such period must not exceed ten days from the date of the last case, whether that occurred on board ship or during the period of observation on shore. It is also in the discretion of the Health Officer to allow any such persons to proceed to their respective places of destination,

subject to surveillance, for a period not exceeding in any case ten days from the arrival of the ship.

ART. 10. The master shall disinfect or destroy any clothing and bedding and other articles of personal use on board which are likely to retain infection, and shall cleanse and disinfect any part of the ship likely to retain infection, and if the master shall have neglected to do so before the ship arrives in port, the Health Officer shall direct or cause the same to be disinfected, destroyed, or cleansed, as the case may require.

ART. 11. The bilge water shall be pumped out after disinfection, and a wholesome supply of drinking water shall be stored on board.

ART. 12. When the Regulations in this Part, so far as they relate to any ship, have been fully complied with, the Health Officer shall, by an order in writing under his hand, to be delivered to the master, permit the plague signals to be removed and grant pratique.

#### PART IV.—Suspected Ships.

ART. 13. Articles 7, 10, and 11 shall apply to suspected ships in like manner as they apply to infected ships.

ART. 14. Every passenger and member of the crew may be subjected to surveillance for a period not exceeding in any case ten days from the date of the arrival of the ship.

ART. 15. When the Regulations in this Part, so far as they relate to any ship, have been fully complied with, the Health Officer shall, by an order in writing under his hand, to be delivered to the master, permit the plague signals to be removed and grant pratique.

#### PART V.—Healthy Ships.

ART. 16. Every ship which arrives from an infected port, or is otherwise likely to be carrying infection, although she be declared healthy within the meaning of these Regulations, may, at the discretion of the Health Officer, be subjected to the measures prescribed in Article 10 (so far as relates to clothing, bedding, and articles of personal use) and Article 11.

ART. 17. Every passenger and member of the crew of such a ship as last mentioned may be subjected to surveillance for a period not exceeding ten days from the date on which the ship left the port of departure.

ART. 18. When the Regulations in this Part, so far as they relate to any ship, have been fully complied with, the Health Officer shall, by an order in writing under his hand, to be delivered to the master, permit the plague signals to be removed and grant pratique.

#### PART VI.—Miscellaneous.

ART. 19. The Health Officer, for the purpose of exercising any of the duties imposed upon him under these Regulations, may medically examine any and every person on board any ship arriving at any port of the Protectorate.

ART. 20. Where a ship is certified, within the meaning of these Regulations, to be healthy, but has passengers on board who are in a filthy or otherwise unwholesome condition, or is overcrowded with passengers, emigrants, or otherwise, the Health Officer may, if in his opinion it is desirable, with a view to checking the introduction or spread of plague, and on his certifying to that effect, order such ship to proceed to the sanitary station or to such place as he may direct, and may detain under observation or surveillance the passengers and crew for such period not exceeding ten days from the arrival of the ship, as he may direct.

ART. 21. The Health Officer shall in the case of every such ship give directions and take such steps as to cleansing and disinfection as may appear to him to be necessary.

ART. 22. The master of any ship, or any other person, shall answer truly, and, if required, in writing and on oath, all questions put to him by and give all such information to any officer appointed for that purpose by Her Majesty's Consul-General as may be necessary for any purposes of these Regulations.

ART. 23. Any ship which uses a port of the Protectorate as a port of call merely may, instead of submitting to these Regulations, at the choice of the master, remain at such anchorage as may be appointed by the harbour-master during its stay in port. Such ship shall only have such communication with the shore as may be authorized by the Health Officer.

ART. 24. Any person on board any ship arriving at a port of the Protectorate who is ascertained by the Health Officer to be suffering from any illness which such officer suspects may prove to be plague, may either be detained on board the ship or be taken to some hospital or other suitable place appointed for that purpose by the authority, and detained there for a period not exceeding three days in the case of a ship carrying a Medical Officer, and not exceeding five days in the case of a ship not so provided, in order that it may be ascertained whether the illness is or is not plague.

ART. 25. Where any person is found to be suffering from plague, he shall immediately be as far as possible isolated, and shall not be removed from one place to another except by order and under the direction of the Health Officer, and shall not depart from the place where he is, until the Health Officer certifies that he is free from plague.

ART. 26. Nothing in these Regulations shall render liable to detention, disinfection, or destruction any article being part of any mails (other than a parcel mail) conveyed under the authority of the Postal Administration of any Government, or shall prejudicially affect the delivery in due course of any such mail (other than a parcel mail) to the post-office.

ART. 27. The introduction into any port of the Protectorate, as merchandise, of clothing, sacks, and bedding which have been used, whether the same are imported from any infected port, or come from any infected place, is prohibited.

ART. 28. Her Majesty's Consul-General may, by public notification, prohibit the introduction, from any specified infected region, of hides or skins which have not been cured by arsenical preparations or dry salted, or require any such hides or skins, on introduction from any specified infected region, to be disinfected by such means as may be prescribed by the notification. The reasonable costs of the disinfection shall be paid by the importer or consignee, and in case of non-payment the goods may be disposed of in such manner as the Consul-General may direct or approve.

ART. 29. Merchandise from infected ports shall be disembarked under such precautions, other than disinfection, as the officer appointed by Her Majesty's Consul-General may direct, to prevent the introduction of rats, &c., which may be infected.

ART. 30. Nothing in these Regulations shall affect the execution of any powers with respect to the prevention of any diseases other than plague.

ART. 31. These Regulations may be cited as "The Somaliland Plague Regulations, 1900." Berbera, November 8, 1900.

**GENERAL ORDER** of the Local Government Board: (Altering General Accounts Order): Appointment of Stocktaker:—

Conway Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Conway Union:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by General Orders of the Poor Law Board dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1877, and the 14th day of February, 1869, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Conway Union (amongst others), it is required that certain Accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts in the form of the Certificate referred to in the said Orders;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse belonging to the said Union, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

**ARTICLE I.**—The Guardians of the Poor of the Conway Union, as and when they shall think fit to do so, may appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth, and may revoke such appointment. When any such appointment is made it shall be notified to Us forthwith.

**ARTICLE II.**—Every such appointment shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations in force for the time being as to the appointment of Officers by the said Guardians, and a person appointed to the office of Stocktaker shall receive such remuneration as may from time to time be assigned to him by the said Guardians.

**ARTICLE III.**—No person, except with Our consent, shall be appointed to the office of Stocktaker while holding any other office under the Guardians.

**ARTICLE IV.**—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at the Workhouse, and compare the same with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the Accounts termed respectively the "Quarterly Balance of the Provisions

Account" and the "Quarterly Balance of the Necessaries and Miscellaneous Account."

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Clothing Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account."

**ARTICLE V.**—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article IV, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the aforesaid Accounts in the following form:—

"Submitted to me this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 190\_\_\_\_, and found to be correct as regards the quantities of stock remaining in store.

"(Signed) \_\_\_\_\_

"Stocktaker."

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect, he shall make such alteration in the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

**ARTICLE VI.**—The Master of the Workhouse shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article IV, submit to him the stores and Accounts therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

**ARTICLE VII.**—The Master of the Workhouse shall lay each of the said Accounts before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

**ARTICLE VIII.**—So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committee to examine the stores or to enter in any Account the memorandum required by the first above-cited Order.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Premises to which this Order applies.*

1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the borough of Hastings to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of the said borough, and

served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.

(2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the said Local Authority.

*Restriction on Movement of Swine from or to premises to which this Order applies.*

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorized by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

*Movement of Swine for Immediate Slaughter.*

3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies in a suitable vehicle to a slaughter-house situate in the borough of Hastings, for the purpose of immediate slaughter with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority, which Licence shall be in force for not more than two days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the slaughter-house to which the swine are to be moved.

(2.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(3.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Article, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and shall be slaughtered after their arrival at the slaughter-house without unnecessary delay.

*Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicle used for Movement of Swine.*

4.—(1.) Any vehicle which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article, shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the owner of the vehicle as follows:

(i.) The floor of the vehicle and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then

(ii.) The same parts of the vehicle shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then

(iii.) The same parts of the vehicle shall have applied to them a coating of linewash.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings of the vehicle, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed therefrom, shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with animals.

*Movement of Swine to premises to which this Order applies.*

5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of the borough of Hastings, which Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the

number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the place and premises to which the swine are to be moved, and shall only be granted on a Declaration of the owner of the swine or of his agent authorized in writing for this purpose to the following effect—

(a.) that the swine to be moved have been on the premises from which they are to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the granting of the Licence, and that no other pig has been brought on to those premises within such period; and

(b.) that the swine are not affected with swine-fever, and have not during the period of twenty-eight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of swine-fever; and

(c.) that the swine are not in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

(2.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence and Declaration required by this Article, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

*Saving for Regulations of Local Authority.*

6. Movement of swine under this Order is subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of swine into the District of the Local Authority, but nothing in any such Regulation shall permit the movement of swine in contravention of this Order.

*Movement of Swine by Licence of Board.*

7. Notwithstanding anything in this Order, a Licence for the movement of swine may be granted by an Inspector of the Board, but such Licence will only be granted where the Board, after inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render the granting thereof necessary or expedient.

*Granting of Movement Licences.*

8.—(1.) The Local Authority may appoint fit and proper persons for the purpose of granting, subject to the provisions of this Article, Movement Licences for the purposes of this Order.

(2.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the swine to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the swine, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the swine are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of the Local Authority.

*Delivery of Declarations.*

9.—(1.) A Licence granted under this Order for the movement of swine to any premises to which this Order applies is not available except when accompanied by the Declaration on which it is granted.

(2.) The person granting such Licence under this Order shall for the identification of the Declaration produced to him mark the same by signing his name thereon with the date of the production thereof to him.

(3.) The person granting such Licence shall deliver the Declaration produced to him, when so marked, with the Licence, to the person receiving the Licence from him.

*Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.*

10.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being

moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

#### *Local Authority to enforce Order.*

11. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### *Offences.*

12.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order in respect of the cleansing and disinfection of any vehicle used for the movement of swine, the owner, or other person for the time being in charge of the vehicle, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person, with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a pig is not slaughtered as required by this Order, the person to whom the Licence is granted, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### *Interpretation.*

13. In this Order—

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture:

"Swine-Fever Infected Place" means a place for the time being declared to be infected with swine-fever under any Order of the Board: Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894

#### *Commencement.*

14. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and one.

#### *Short Title.*

15. This Order may be cited as the HASTINGS (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1901.

*Port Phillip—Steam Pilot Vessel Established.*

THE Government of Victoria, Australia, has given notice that, on and after 1st January, 1901, the sailing vessels employed in the pilot service off Port Phillip Heads would be replaced by a steam vessel. The steam pilot vessel will have the same characteristics and observe the same regulations as those given for sailing pilot vessels in Australia Directory, Vol. I, 1897, page 430, with the following exceptions:—

a. b. When at anchor with pilots on board, the steam pilot vessel will carry the above lights, with the exception of the side lights.

c. When not engaged on pilotage duties, the pilot vessel will carry the same lights as an ordinary steam vessel.

When the steam pilot vessel leaves the cruising ground for coaling or provisioning, &c., a fore and aft schooner will do duty, but in the event of the steam vessel being absent for a longer period than 48 hours, a suitable steam vessel will be substituted.

#### No. 71.—BAL TIC—THE SOUND.

*Kronborg Light—Additional Light Occasionally Exhibited.*

THE Danish Government has given notice dated 14th January, 1901, that, when Lappegrund Light-vessel is not at her station a red fixed light, elevated 20 feet above high water, and visible from a distance of 9 miles, will be exhibited at Kronborg Battery, at a distance of 85 yards N. 20° E. from Kronborg Light.
