West Bank Light—Established.

THE United States Government has given notice that, on and after 31st January, 1901, a fixed light of the 4th order will be established to the southward of West Bank, New York Harbour entrance.

West Bank Light will be elevated 54 feet above high water, and be visible in clear weather from a distance of 12 miles. It will show a red sector from the bearing of S. 11° W., through south and east, to N. 13° E., and white in other directions; it will be exhibited from an iron conical light-house, painted brown, standing on a black pile structure erected in a depth of 21 feet, with
