

No. 93.—PACIFIC—KURIL ISLANDS.

Paramushiru Strait—Rock and Wreck.

THE Japanese Government has given notice, dated 1st December, 1900, that a rock, with a depth over it of $1\frac{1}{4}$ fathoms, low water, is reported to exist in Paramushiru Strait with Funa Se bearing S. 8° E., distant 17 cables, and Kabuto Yama S. 25° W.

Approximate position, lat. $50^{\circ} 40\frac{1}{2}'$ N., long. $156^{\circ} 9\frac{1}{2}'$ E.

The wreck of a steam-vessel, with a depth of from 2 to 3 fathoms over it, lies sunk at a distance of three-quarters of a cable S. 73° W. from the rock.

Sitomura, Minne Rock—Position and Particulars of.

THE Japanese Government has given notice, dated 1st December, 1900, of the existence of a rock named Minne, with a depth of 3 fathoms over it, situated with the entrance to Sitomura or Shirakomura River, bearing N. 42° W., distant 7 cables, and Ooni Iwa, S. 33° W.

Registration of Births and Deaths.

NOTICE is hereby given, that in pursuance of the provisions of the twenty-first section of an Act passed in the thirty-eighth year of the reign of Her late Majesty, intituled "The Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874," I, Reginald MacLeod, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, have, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, ordered and declared that on and after the 1st day of April next—

(1) The area of Fulham Registration District shall be made identical with the areas of the two Poor Law Parishes of Fulham and Hammersmith, as they will be constituted, under the provisions of the London Government Act, 1899, on and after the 25th of March, 1901;

(2) All the areas lying outside the outer boundary of the combined two Poor Law Parishes and coloured green on the official maps for Fulham and Hammersmith Metropolitan Boroughs, shall cease to form part of Fulham Registration District;

(3) The added area coloured red and numbered 2 on the official Fulham map shall form part of South Fulham Sub-District;

(4) The added areas coloured red and numbered 1, 3, and 5 on the official Hammersmith map shall form part of North Hammersmith Sub-District;

(5) The added area coloured red and numbered 8 on the official Hammersmith map shall form part of South Hammersmith Sub-District;

(6) The areas on the inner boundary between the two parishes coloured red and numbered 3 and 5 on the official Fulham map (and coloured green and numbered 13 and 11 on the official Hammersmith map) shall form part of North-West Fulham Sub-District and shall cease to form part of South Hammersmith Sub-District;

(7) The areas on the inner boundary between the two parishes coloured red and numbered 9 and 10 on the official Hammersmith map (and coloured green and numbered 7 and 6 on the official Fulham map) shall form part of South Hammersmith Sub-District, and shall cease to form part of North-East Fulham Sub-District; and

(8) The area on the inner boundary between the two parishes coloured red and numbered 12 on the official Hammersmith map (and coloured green and numbered 4 on the official Fulham map) shall form part of South Hammersmith Sub-District, and shall cease to form part of North-West Fulham Sub-District.—Witness my hand this 4th day of February, 1901.
