

junction with Elmfield-road aforesaid and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of four and a half chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the house and premises known as No. 197 Balham High-road and extending thence north-eastward for a distance of five and three-quarter chains or thereabouts along the last-described wall or fence and along the walls or fences forming the south-eastern boundaries of the houses and premises known respectively as Nos. 195, 193, 191, 189 and 187 Balham High-road to the junction of the wall or fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned house and premises (i.e., No. 187 Balham High-road) with the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the same house and premises and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line for a distance of two and three quarter chains or thereabouts to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the house and premises known as No. 179 Balham High-road and extending thence north-eastward for a distance of two and a half chains or thereabouts along the last-described wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the house and premises known as No. 177 Balham High-road to its junction with the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned house (i.e. No. 177 Balham High-road) and continuing thence in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to a point at or near to the eastern end of the Balham Railway Station in the middle of the Croydon and Balham Line of the London Brighton and South Coast Railway and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned line of railway for a distance of forty-six chains or thereabouts to the boundary on Tooting Common aforesaid which boundary divides the said new parish of Saint Mary Streatham from the parish of Streatham aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been laid before and approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter sixty; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared for the purpose of being laid before Her said late Majesty in Council a representation,

bearing date the sixth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter sixty; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Paul Widnes situate within the limits of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Mary Widnes in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Liverpool.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Paul Widnes situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Francis James Bishop of the said diocese of Liverpool (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Mary Widnes which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Paul Widnes situate as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Paul Widnes.'

"And with the like consent of the said Francis James, Bishop of the said diocese of Liverpool (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Paul Widnes situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that so long as the Reverend Charles Edmund Stocks Clerk in Holy Orders, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Mary Widnes shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication solemnization or performance at the said church of Saint Paul Widnes situate as aforesaid shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Charles Edmund Stocks, and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.
