WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared for the purpose of being laid before Her said late Majesty in Council a representation bearing date the thirteenth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Alban the Martyr situate at West Cliff, Southend-on-Sea, within the limits of the parish of Prittlewell in the county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Alban the Martyr situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Wogan Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Albans (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Prittlewell, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Alban the Martyr, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Alban the Martyr, West Cliff, Southend-on-Sea.'

"And with the like consent of the said John Wogan, Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Albans (testified as aforesaid) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Alban the Martyr situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being:

Provided always that so long as the Reverend Thomas Osmotherley Reay Clerk in Holy Orders the present Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Prittlewell shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance at the said church of Saint Alban the Martyr, situate as aforesaid shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Thomas Osmotherley Reay; and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Alban the Martyr West Cliff, Southend-on-Sea, being:—

"All that portion of the parish of Prittlewell in the county of Essex, and in the diocese of Saint Albans, wherein the present Incumbent of such parish still possesses the exclusive cure of souls, which is bounded upon the south by the estuary of the River Thames, upon the east partly by the new parish of Saint John the Baptist Southend, and partly by the district of All Saints, Prittlewell, both in the county and diocese aforesaid, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the west by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the said district of All Saints Prittlewell, from the parish of Prittlewell aforesaid, at the point where North-road is joined by a road known as Albany-avenue and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of six chains and a half, or thereabouts, to its junction with the road called or known as Salisbury-avenue, and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the intended course of a proposed new road, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said intended course of the said proposed new road for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sallendines-lane and extending thence northward along the middle of the said lane for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to its junction with West-road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Leigh-road and with Medina-road, and extending thence southward for a distance of thirty-six chains or thereabouts along the middle of the last-named road, and along the middle of Valkyrie-road (thereby crossing by a bridge the main line of the London Tilbury and Southend Railway) to the junction of the last-named road with Station-road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with Manor-road and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nine and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Clifton Drive, and continuing thence southward in a straight line to the southern boundary of the said parish of Prittlewell in the estuary of the River Thames aforesaid."
