

of any Regulations made under those Articles, until superseded or replaced by Regulations made hereunder, or the enforcement of any penalty for any breach of such Regulations while in force.

10. This Order shall come into operation on the day on which it is first publicly exhibited in the office of the Consul-General.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter one hundred and twenty-four duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-fourth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and one, in the words and figures following, that is to say :—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter one hundred and twenty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Bicton situate in the county of Salop and in the diocese of Lichfield for the patronage of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Leighton-under-the-Wrekin situate in the said county of Salop and in the said diocese of Lichfield :

“Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Bicton is vested in the vicar or incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of the parish of Saint Chad, Shrewsbury in the said county of Salop and in the said diocese of Lichfield.

“And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Leighton-under-the-Wrekin is vested in Charles Ralph Borlase Wingfield, of Onslow, near Shrewsbury aforesaid Esquire and his heirs and assigns.

“And whereas the Venerable Charles Bulmer Maude, Archdeacon of Salop, the present vicar or incumbent of the said vicarage of the said parish of Saint Chad Shrewsbury and the said Charles Ralph Borlase Wingfield have respectively signified

to us their desire that the patronage of the said two benefices of Bicton and Leighton-under-the-Wrekin may be rearranged by way of exchange in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“And whereas we have made due enquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two benefices and vicarages are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

“Now therefore with the consent of the said Charles Bulmer Maude and with the consent of the said Charles Ralph Borlase Wingfield (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Bicton and the church thereof, shall be assigned and transferred from the said Charles Bulmer Maude the vicar or incumbent of the said vicarage of the said parish of Saint Chad Shrewsbury and from his successors vicars or incumbents of the same vicarage and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Charles Ralph Borlase Wingfield and his heirs and assigns for ever and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Leighton-under-the-Wrekin and the church thereof, shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said Charles Ralph Borlase Wingfield and from his heirs and assigns and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Charles Bulmer Maude vicar or incumbent of the said vicarage of the said parish of Saint Chad Shrewsbury and his successors, vicars or incumbents of the same vicarage for ever.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.
