No. 129.—ENGLAND—RIVER THAMES.

Jenningtree Point—Intended Light.

THE Trinity House, London, has given notice that, on 6th May, 1901, it is intended to exhibit a white light occulting every four seconds (light three and a half seconds, eclipse half a second) from an iron framework tower, 44 feet high, painted red, erected on Jenningsree Point, Erith Reach, River Thames. It will be of 60 candle-power, elevated 35 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 11 miles. From it Belvedere Tower bears S. 20° W., distant $9\frac{1}{2}$ cables, and Coldharbour Lighthouse, S. 25° E.

Further notice will be given when the light is exhibited.

Approximate position, lat. 51° 30' N., long. 0° 10' E.

Registration of Births and Deaths.

NOTICE is hereby given, that in pursuance of the provisions of the twenty-first section of an Act passed in the thirty-eighth year of the reign of Her late Majesty, intituled "The Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874," I, Reginald MacLeod, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, have, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, ordered and declared that on and after the 1st day of April next—

(1.) The area of Lewisham Registration District shall be made identical with that of Lewisham Poor Law Union, as it will be constituted under the provisions of the London Government Act, 1899, on and after the 25th of March, 1901;

(2.) The areas lying outside the proposed new Union boundary, and coloured green on the official maps of the Metropolitan Boroughs of Lewisham and Woolwich shall cease to form part of Lewisham Registration District;

(3.) The added area coloured red and numbered 2 on the official Woolwich map shall form part of Eltham Sub-District;

(4.) The added areas coloured red and numbered 11, 15, and 17 on the official Lewisham map shall form part of Lee Sub-District;

(5.) The added areas coloured red and numbered 3A, 5, 7, and 9 on the official Lewisham map shall form part of Lewisham Sub-District;

(6.) The added area coloured red and numbered 2 on the official Lewisham map shall form part of Sydenham Sub-District;

(7.) The areas on the inner boundary between the two Metropolitan Boroughs of Lewisham and Woolwich, coloured red and numbered 20 and 22 on the official Lewisham map (and coloured green and numbered 5 and 7 on the official Woolwich map) shall cease to form part of Eltham Sub-District, and shall be added to and form part of Lee Sub-District; and

(8.) The areas on the inner boundary between the said Boroughs coloured red and numbered 3, 4, and 6 on the official Woolwich map (and

coloured green and numbered 18, 19, and 21 on the official Lewisham map) shall cease to form part of Lee Sub-District, and shall be added to and form part of Eltham Sub-District.—Witness my hand this 20th day of February, 1901.

Llanelly Electric Lighting Order, 1891.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Llanelly Urban District Council (formerly known as the Local Board of Health for the Local Government District of Llanelly, and hereinafter described as "the Undertakers"), intend to transfer to the Llanelly and District Electric Lighting and Traction Company, Limited, the powers, duties, and liabilities conferred on the Undertakers by the Llanelly Electric Lighting Order, 1891 (hereinafter called "the said Order," which was confirmed by the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 4) Act, 1891), subject to the exceptions and modifications, and upon such terms and otherwise as in a certain draft deed of transfer (hereinafter more particularly referred to) are contained or are hereinafter indicated.

The area in respect of which the transfer is proposed to be made is the area of supply prescribed by the said Order. The period for which the transfer is proposed to be made is the currency of the said Order, subject to certain powers of pre-emption reserved to the Undertakers hereinafter referred to. The rent or other pecuniary consideration in respect of the transfer is the payment to the Undertakers of the amount expended by them in obtaining the said Order, and the further payment of the costs of the said transfer and applications to the Board of Trade in connection therewith.

A general description of the powers, duties, or liabilities of the Undertakers proposed to be excepted or modified, and of the terms upon which the transfer is proposed to be made are respectively as follows:—

The following sections of the said Order shall not be applicable to the proposed transfer—

Section 7, as to purchase and use of lands.

Section 28, as to remuneration of electric inspectors.

Section 52, as to application of revenue.

Section 53, as to application of capital moneys.

Section 54, so far as it relates to the authentication of any notice, order, or document by the Undertakers.

Section 59, as to transfer of powers, save as provided in the said draft deed of transfer.

Section 68, incorporating sections 264 and 265 of the Public Health Act, 1875.

The said Llanelly and District Electric Lighting and Traction Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Purchasers") are to supply energy for both public and private purposes at the prices mentioned or contained in the said deed of transfer and those particulars set out in clause 12 thereof.

The Purchasers are within 12 months from date of the said deed of transfer to build and equip the necessary generating station and carry out a complete electric lighting scheme for the district of the Undertakers, and lay down suitable and sufficient distributing mains for the purposes of general supply throughout the streets specified in the second schedule of the said Order.

The Undertakers may re-purchase the electric lighting Undertaking at the end of 7, 14, or 21 years or any subsequent period of 7 years from
