

his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(4.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a head of cattle or a sheep or goat or pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the KENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1901 (No. 3).

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 27TH FEBRUARY 1901.)

SUFFOLK (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1901 (No. 3).

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Movement into out of or within Scheduled District.

1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be landed in, or moved into or out of, the District described in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District).

(2.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

Movement within Scheduled District with Licence between different parts of a Farm.

2.—(1.) Where it is impossible to move animals from one part of a farm to another part of the same farm otherwise than along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare, and the Local Authority of the district in which such animals are considered that it is necessary or expedient that movement of the animals should be permitted within the Scheduled District—

(i.) to a particular part of the farm, and on a particular occasion ; or

(ii.) between the several parts of the farm as often as occasion may require ;

such movement may be authorized by a licence (in the form set forth in the Third Schedule to this Order or to the like effect) granted by an Inspec-

tor of such Local Authority to the occupier of the farm, provided that the animals are not in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place and their movement is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

(2.) Where the movement authorized by the Licence is movement between the several parts of the farm as often as occasion may require, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence" and shall be in force until it is revoked by the Local Authority by a Notice to the occupier of the farm. In other cases the Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.

(3.) The Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorized to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorized to be moved.

(4.) The animals shall be moved between the several parts of the farm by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and shall be accompanied by the Licence authorizing the movement.

(5.) The expression "farm" means any premises occupied by the same person as one farm whether all the premises are held of the same landlord or not, but does not include any common or other land occupied by such person together with other persons.

Movement of Animals by Railway through Scheduled District.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of an animal into or out of the Scheduled District where it is moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animal being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Saving for Orders of the Board and Regulations of Local Authority.

4. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any Order of the Board relating to any disease other than Foot-and-Mouth Disease and to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals, but nothing in any such Regulation shall permit the movement of animals in contravention of any Order of the Board.

Production of Licences ; Names and Addresses.

5.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

(3.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
