Hailsham-avenue and extending thence north-westward along the said wall or fence for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to the point at the western end of the railway tunnel aforesaid upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Peter Streatham from the new parish of Christ Church Streatham aforesaid and extending thence westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts (thereby following the middle of the said line of railway) to the firstly herembefore-mentioned point in the middle of the said road called or known as Streatham Hill opposite to Streatham Hill Railway Station aforesaid at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and sevent-enth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-fourth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and one, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter one hundred and twenty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Cold Waltham the alternate patronage of the benefice (being a vicarage) of East Dean with Friston, the patronage of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Ferring with Kingston and East Preston and of the benefice (being a rectory) of Fittleworth and the alternate patronage of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Selmeston with Alciston, all situate in the county of Sussex and in the diocese of Chichester for the patronage of the benefice (being a rectory) of Birdham, of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Bosham, of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Funtington, and of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Rumboldswyke, and the alternate patronage of the benefice (being a vicarage) of West Firle with Beddingham all situate in the said county of Sussex and in the diocese of Chichester aforesaid.

"Whereas the whole advowsons or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Cold Waltham the said benefice of Foring with Kingston and East Preston and the said benefice of Fittleworth, and one morety of the advowson of each of the said benefices of East

Hailsham-avenue and extending thence north- Dean with Friston and Selmeston with Alciston westward along the said wall or fence for a distance are vested in the Bishop for the time being of the of twelve chains or thereabouts to the point at the said diocese of Chichester.

"And whereas the whole advowsons or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefices of Birdham. Bosham, Funtington and Rumboldswyke and one moiety of the advowson of the said benefice of West Firle with Beddingham, are vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Chichester and their successors.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Ernest Roland, now Bishop of the said diocese of Chichester and the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Chichester have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said ten benefices may be rearranged by way of exchange in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we have made due enquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said ten benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively, and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said ten benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Ernest Roland Bishop of the said diocese of Chichester acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and affixed his epi-copal seal thereto) and with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Chichester (in testimony whereof they have affixed their common or corporate seal to this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowsons or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Cold Waltham the said benefice of Ferring with Kingston and East Preston and the said benefice of Fittleworth and the said moiery of the advowson of each of the said benefices of East Dean with Friston and Selmeston with Alciston shall be assigned and transferred from the said Ernest Roland Bishop of the said diocese of Chichester and from his successors Bishops of the same diocese and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall andmay from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Chichester and their successors for ever, and that in exchange for the same the whole advowsons or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Birdham, the said benefice of Bosham, the said benefice of Funtington and the said benefice of Rumboldswyke and the said moiety of the advowson of the said benefice of West Firle with Beddingham shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Chichester and from their successors and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Ernest Roland Bishop of the said diocese of Chichester and his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parlia-
