And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the thirty-first day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and one, in the words following, that is to say:—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Cuthbert Hebburn and of the new parish of Saint John Hebburn both in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham.

“Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the seventeenth day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five and published in the London Gazette on the nineteenth day of the same month a certain part of the parish of Jarrow in the said county and diocese of Durham was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Cuthbert situate at Hebburn in the said parish of Jarrow and the said district chapelry was named ‘The District Chapelry of Saint Cuthbert Hebburn.’

“And whereas the said district chapelry of Saint Cuthbert Hebburn has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and four become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act and by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-seven and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four.

“And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-seventh day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five and published in the London Gazette on the thirtieth day of the same month a certain part of the said

new parish of Saint Cuthbert Hebburn was constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and was named ‘The District of Saint John Hebburn.’

“And whereas the said district of Saint John Hebburn has under the provisions of the said Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-seven also become a new parish of the character aforesaid.

“And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Cuthbert Hebburn and of the said new parish of Saint John Hebburn should be altered in the manner herein-after described.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Brooke Foss Bishop of the said diocese of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint John Hebburn shall be altered so as to dis sever therefrom all that portion thereof which is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and is thereon coloured pink and so as to restore all that same portion to and to comprise it within the limits of the said new parish of Saint Cuthbert Hebburn and that from and after the same date and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said portion of the said new parish of Saint John Hebburn so to be dis severed therefrom as aforesaid shall be restored to and shall again form part of the said new parish of Saint Cuthbert Hebburn.

“And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“The territory to be dis severed from the new parish of Saint John Hebburn in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham and to be restored to the new parish of Saint Cuthbert Hebburn in the same county and diocese being:—

“All that portion of the said new parish of Saint John Hebburn which is bounded on the south-east by the parish of Jarrow upon the north-east by the new parish of Saint Oswald Hebburn both in the said county and diocese and upon the north-west by the new parish of Saint Cuthbert Hebburn aforesaid and upon the remaining side that is to say upon the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the last-named new parish from the new parish of Saint John Hebburn aforesaid at the point where Shields-road is joined by Pitt-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Canning-street and with Quarry-road and extending thence south-eastward to and along the north-eastern side of the last-named road for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to a point upon the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of Hebburn Hall Quarry and extending thence first north-eastward then south-eastward and then again north-eastward along the last-described wall or fence for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to its north-
