enumerated in the Fourth Schedule to that Order should be united for the administration of the laws for the relief of the Poor by the name of the New Winchester Union.

Winchester Union;

And whereas by a further Order issued by the Poor Law Commissioners, and by Orders issued by the Poor Law Board, and by Us, the Local Government Board, and in pursuance of Orders made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, 1888 and 1894, and duly confirmed by Us, certain changes have been made in the constitution of the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient that the name of the said Union should be changed as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore We, the Local Government Board in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—From and after the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and one, the name of the said Union shall be changed to the Winchester Union.

ARTICLE II.—The Guardians of the Poor of the New Winchester Union shall cause this Order to be published in each of the two weeks next following the date hereof in some newspaper circulating within the Union.

The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 and the Order described in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.
- 2. This Order shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and one.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of former Order and Alteration
of Boundaries of Scheduled District.
1.—(1.) The Suffolk (Foot-and-Mouth Disease)
No. 27295.

Order of 1901 (No. 3) is hereby modified in

manner hereinafter appearing.

(2.) The Scheduled District for the purposes of the above-mentioned Order and this Order shall after the commencement of this Order be the District described in the Schedule to this Order.

Movement within Scheduled District with Licence for Slaughter.

2.—(1.) An animal (not being in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place) may be moved from any premises in the Scheduled District to a slaughter-house within such District provided that the animal is marked as required by this Article and accompanied by a Movement Licence (in the form set forth in the Schedule to the Suffolk (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1901 (No. 3) or to the like effect) granted by an
