

tion as the said parish was subject to before being so enlarged.

"That the said benefices of Penrice and Porteynon shall respectively retain all the emoluments to which they were respectively entitled.

"That there is no vicarial tithe rent charge charged upon and issuing out of the said portion of the parish of Penrice so to be separated from that parish and united to the said parish of Porteynon and that the rectorial tithe rent charge charged upon and issuing out of such portion of the parish of Penrice shall as heretofore continue to be paid to the lay impropiator for the time being of the said parish of Penrice.

"That marriages in respect of the inhabitants of the said portion of the parish of Penrice so to be separated from that parish and united to the said parish of Porteynon shall hereafter be performed in the parish church of Porteynon and that the fees for all such marriages usually payable to the Incumbent of a benefice shall belong to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Porteynon.

"That baptisms churchings and burials in respect of the inhabitants of the said portion of the parish of Penrice so to be separated from that parish and united to the said parish of Porteynon shall hereafter be performed in the parish church of Porteynon and that the fees for all such offices in relation thereto usually payable to the Incumbent of a benefice shall belong to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Porteynon but that the inhabitants of the said portion of the parish of Penrice shall retain the right of burial in the churchyard of the said parish of Penrice and that the fees for any such burials in Penrice churchyard shall belong to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Penrice.

"That the Incumbent of the said parish of Porteynon shall also have cure of souls within the limits of the said portion so to be united to such parish as part of his parish.

"That the right of patronage or presentation to the said benefice of Porteynon shall remain as heretofore.

"That the inhabitants of the said portion of the parish of Penrice so to be separated therefrom and united to the said parish of Porteynon shall be exonerated from all liability (if any such now exists) to repair the parish church of Penrice or any other church or chapel now or hereafter to be erected in the said parish of Penrice.

" CONSENTS.

" I Emily Charlotte Talbot of Margam Park and Penrice Castle in the county of Glamorgan Spinster as the patron entitled to present or nominate to the vicarage or perpetual curacy of Penrice, in the said county of Glamorgan,

" And I Hardinge Stanley Earl of Halsbury the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain as the patron entitled to present to the rectory of Porteynon in the said county of Glamorgan,

" And I the Reverend Richard Henry Talbot the vicar or perpetual curate of the said vicarage or perpetual curacy of Penrice,

" And I the Reverend David Price the rector of the said rectory of Porteynon,

" Do hereby signify to your Grace our consent to the scheme above proposed for separating the said portion of the parish of Penrice from that parish and uniting the same to the adjoining parish of Porteynon for ecclesiastical purposes.

" As witness our respective hands this twenty-first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and one.

And whereas the said scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration.

And whereas the said Archbishop being satisfied with the said scheme hath certified the same and the consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his report dated the sixth day of March one thousand nine hundred and one which said report is in the words and figures following:—

" We the undersigned Frederick, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council.

" That the Right Reverend John Lord Bishop of Saint David's has represented unto Us (amongst other things):

" That there are in the county of Glamorgan and his diocese of Saint Davids the vicarage or perpetual curacy of Penrice and the rectory of Porteynon.

" That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that a certain district including the hamlet of Horton part of the parish of Penrice and more particularly set out in the map or plan attached to the scheme hereunto annexed may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Penrice and annexed to the contiguous parish of Porteynon for ecclesiastical purposes only under the provisions of 'The Pluralities Act 1838.'

" That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all persons interested which scheme together with the consents in writing of Emily Charlotte Talbot of Margam Park and Penrice Castle in the county of Glamorgan Spinster as the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefice of Penrice if the same were now vacant and of the Reverend Richard Henry Talbot the vicar or perpetual curate of the said parish of Penrice and of the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefice of Porteynon in right of the Crown if the same were now vacant and of the Reverend David Price the rector of Porteynon has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration.

" The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop of Saint Davids and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

" And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act 1838 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

" As witness our hand this sixth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and one.
