THEREAS Henry Best Hans Hamilton, VV Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, duly appointed in pursuance of "The Sheffield Corporation Act, 1900," as Commissioner for determining the boundaries of the Wards of the City of Sheffield, and for apportioning the Councillors thereto, has transmitted to one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State his Scheme in the following

"SHEFFIELD CORPORATION ACT 1900-"MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT 1882.

" City of Sheffield.

"Whereas by section seven of a Statute passed in the sixty-fourth year of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, called The Sheffield Corporation Act 1900,' which said Act received the Royal Assent on the sixth day of August one thousand nine hundred, the boundaries of the then existing city of Sheffield were extended in the manner therein specified.

"And whereas, by the forty-ninth section of the said Act it was further enacted that the said extended city should be divided into sixteen wards and that the names or distinguishing numbers and boundaries of the said sixteen wards should be fixed and determined by a Scheme to be made by a Commissioner to be, for that purpose, appointed by Her late Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, within three months after the passing of the said Act.
"And whereas the Right Honourable Sir

Matthew White Ridley Baronet Her late Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, in pursuance of the said Act, did, on the twenty-fourth day of August one thousand nine hundred, duly warrant and appoint me Henry Best Hans Hamilton Esquire Barrister-at-Law to be such Commissioner.

"And whereas by section fifty-one of the said Act the Commissioner thus appointed was further empowered by his Scheme to apportion all the

existing Councillors among the said new wards;
"And whereas by section fifty-three it was enacted that subject to the provisions of the suid Act sub-sections eight to fifteen (both inclusive) of section thirty of 'The Municipal Corporations Act 1882, should apply, as if they were re-enacted in the said 'Sheffield Corporation Act 1900.'

Acts aforesaid, and by virtue of the said appointment, do hereby determine as hereinafter mentioned the boundaries of the said sixteen wards into which the said city is divided, which said sixteen wards are hereinafter named as

follows: that is to say:—
"(1.) Saint Peter's Ward.

"(2.) Saint Philip's Ward.

"(3.) Neepsend Ward.
"(4.) Brightside Ward.
"(5.) Burngreave Ward.

"(6.) Attercliffe Ward.

"(7.) Darnall Ward.

"(8.) Park Ward.
"(9.) Heeley Ward.

"(10.) Sharrow Ward.

"(11.) Ecclesall Ward.

"(12.) Broomhall Ward.

"(13.) Hallam Ward.

"(14.) Crookesmoor Ward.

"(15.) Walkley Ward.

"(16.) Hillsborough Ward.

"No. 1. Saint Peter's Ward.

"I do hereby determine that Saint Peter's Ward shall comprise so much of the said city of Sheffield as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the centre of Waingate at its junction with Bridge-street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Waingate to the Haymarket, thence along the centre of the Haymarket to Fitzalan-square, thence along the east side of Fitzulan-square to the centre of Baker's Hill, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Baker's Hill and Norfolkstreet to Arundel-street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Arundel-street to Howard-street, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Howard-street to Pond-street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre-of Pond-street to Suffolk-road, thence in a southeasterly direction along the centre of Suffolk-road to the River Sheaf, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the River Sheaf to Havelock Bridge, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Havelock Bridge to Bramall-lane, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Bramall lane to Porter-street, thence along the centre of Porter-street to Moorhead, thence in a northerly direction across Moorhead to Cambridge. street, thence in a northerly direction along the east side of Cambridge-street to Division-street, thence along an imaginary line to the south of Division-street in a south-westerly direction to a

point near Rockingham-lane, thence in a westerly direction crossing Rockingham-street, Trafalgarstreet, Chester-street, Chester-lane, Eldon-street, Firzwilliam-street, Broomhall-street Cavendishstreet, Bolton-street and Victoria-street to Gellstreet, thence along the centre of Gell-street in a northerly direction to Convent-walk a distance of ninety feet or thereabouts, thence in a westerly direction for a distance of ninety feet or thereabouts to a point fifteen feet south of Wilkinson-street, thence in a northerly direction across Wilkinsonstreet, Glossop-road and Leavygreave-road to a point about sixty feet south of Brook Hill, thence in an easterly direction crossing Gell-street to a point twenty feet east of Gell-street, thence in a northerly direction a distance of forty feet, thence in an easterly direction a distance of one hundred and thirty feet or thereabouts to the west side of Victoria-street forty feet south of Brook Hill, thence along the west side of Victoria-street and across Brook Hill to a point on the north side of Brook Hill one hundred feet west of the western building line of Beet-street; thence in an easterly direction along the north side of Brook Hill to the centre of Beet-street, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Beet-street to Upper Allen-street, thence along the centre of Upper Allen-street to Brocco-street, thence along the centre of Brocco-street in a south-easterly direction to and across Solly-street to Hollis Croft, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Hollis Croft to Tenter-street, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Tenter-street to Westbar Green, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Westbar Green to Westbar, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Westbar to Bridge-street, thence in an easterly direction along Bridge-street to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 2. Saint Philip's Ward. "I do hereby determine that Saint Philip's Ward shall comprise so much of the said city of Sheffield as is contained within an imaginary line commencing from a point on the north side of Brook Hill, one hundred feet or thereabouts west of the western building line of Beet-street, thence in an easterly direction along Brook Hill to the centre of Beet-street, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Beet-street to Upper Allen-street, thence along the centre of Upper Allen-street to Brocco-street, thence along the centre of Brocco-street in a south-easterly direction to and across Solly-street to Hollis Croft, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Hollis Croft to Tenter-street, thence in a northeasterly direction along the centre of Tenterstreet to Westbar Green, thence in a northeasterly direction along the centre of Westbar Green to Westbar, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Westbar to Bridge-street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Bridge-street to Waingate, thence in a northeasterly direction along the centre of Lady's Bridge to the centre of the River Don, thence in a north westerly direction along the centre of the said River Don to a point three hundred feet or thereabouts south-east of Neepsend Bridge, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of a goit from the River Don to Rutland Works, through the said Rutland Works across Penistone-road to the south-east of Bath Works to Cross Bedford-street at its junction with Portland-street, thence in a southerly direction crossing Infirmary-road, Albert-terraceroad and the grounds of the Sheffield Royal Infirmary to Upperthorpe-road, and along the south-west side of Upperthorpe-road to the centre | feet or thereabouts, thence in a northerly direction

of Port Mahon, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Port Mahon to Waterylane, thence along the north-west side of Waterylane to Fawcett-street, thence in a south-westerly direction crossing Fawcett-street and Bromleystreet to Mushroom-lane at its junction with Blyth-street, thence in a south-westerly direction along Mushroom-lane to a point one hundred and twenty feet or thereabouts from its junction with Western Bank, thence in an easterly direction along an irregular line to the north of Western Bank and Brook Hill to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 3. Neepsend Ward. "I do hereby determine that Neepsend Ward shall comprise so much of the said city of Sheffield as is contained within an imaginary line drawn from a point in the centre of the River Don where the same is crossed by the Corporation-street Bridge, thence along the centre of the bed of the River Don in a northerly direction to a point opposite the outlet of a goit proceeding from the Wardsend Steel Works, thence following the northern boundary of the city through Scraith Wood, and across Moonshine-lane to a point in Carr-lane near Longley House, thence in a southeasterly direction along the centre of Carr-lane to Longley-lane, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Longley-lane to Piper-lane, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Piper-lane to Bailey-street, thence in a south-easterly direction along Batley-street to Barnsley-road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Barnsley-road to Burngreave-road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Burngreave-road to Rock-street, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Rock-street to Chatham-street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Chatham-street to Bridge Houses, thence crossing Bridge Houses to and along the Corporationstreet Bridge to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 4. Brightside Ward. "I do hereby determine that Brightside Ward shall comprise so much of the said city of Sheffield as is contained within an imaginary line commencing from a point in the centre of Carr-lane near Longley House, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Carr-lane to Longleylane, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Longley-lane to Piper-lane, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Piper-lane to Batley-street, thence in a southeasterly direction along Batley-screet to Barnsleyroad, thence along a line in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Osgathorpe-road to Grimesthorpe-road, thence in a south-westerly direction along Grimesthorpe-road to Carwoodroad, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Carwood-road to Carwood-lane, thence along the centre of Carwood-lane in a south-easterly direction to Savile-street East, crossing Savile-street East at its junction with Princess-street, thence a distance of three hundred and fifty feet or thereabouts, along a certain new road leading from Princess-street to the premises of the Sheffield District Railway Company to the River Don, thence along the centre of the River Don in a north-easterly direction to a point one hundred and thirty feet or thereabouts to the south of Brightside Bridge, thence in an easterly direction through Messrs. Jessop Sons and Company's Works to Weedon-street, thence in a south-easterly direction along the south-west side of Weedon-street for a distance of four hundred

following the City boundary to a point in the centre of the Blackburn Brook at the commencement of the new City boundary, thence following the new City boundary in a westerly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 5. Burngreave Ward.

"I do hereby determine that Burngreave Ward shall comprise so much of the said city of Sheffield as is contained within an imaginary line commencing from a point in the centre of the River Don at Lady's Bridge, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of the River Don to Corporation-street Bridge, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Corporation Bridge across Bridge Houses along the centre of Chathamstreet to Rock-street, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Rock-street to Burngreave-road, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Burngreave-road to Barnsleyroad, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Barnsley-road to Osgathorpe-road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Osgathorpe-road to Grimesthorpe-road, thence in a south-westerly direction along Grimesthorpe-road to Carwood-road, thence in a southeasterly direction along the centre of Carwoodroad to Carwood-lane, thence along the centre of Carwood-lane, in a south easterly direction to Savile-street East, crossing Savile-street East at its junction with Princess-street, thence a distance of three hundred and fifty feet or thereabouts along a certain new road leading from Princessstreet to the premises of the Sheffield District Railway Company to the River Don, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of the River Don to the point of commencement at Lady's Bridge aforesaid.
"No. 6. Attercliffe Ward.

"I do hereby determine that Attercliffe Ward shall comprise so much of the said city of Sheffield as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the centre of the River Don where it is crossed by the tramway of the Nunnery Colliery Company Limited, near their Salmon Pastures Yard, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of the River Don to a point one hundred and thirty feet or thereabouts to the southward of Brightside Bridge, thence in an easterly direction to Weedon-street, thence in a south-easterly direction along the south-west side of Weedon-street a distance of four hundred feet or thereabouts, thence along the old City boundary to the southern embankment of the Sheffield District Railway, thence along the new City boundary to Weedon-street at its junction with Attercliffe Common, thence along the old City boundary to the centre of the canal of the Sheffield and South Yorkshire Navigation Company near Tinsley Park-road, thence in a southwesterly direction along the centre of such canal to the point where the said canal is crossed by the Nunnery Colliery Company's Tramway, thence along the centre of such tramway in a northerly

direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.
"No. 7. Darnall Ward. "I do hereby determine that Darnall Ward shall comprise so much of the said city of Sheffield as is contained within an imaginary line commencing from a point in the centre of the Canal of the Sheffield and South Yorkshire Navigation Company where the old City boundary crosses the same near Tinsley Park-road, thence following the old City boundary in a southerly direction along an imaginary line to the south side of Tinsley Park-road, thence following the new City boundary in a south-easterly and westerly direction

passes under the Great Central Railway, thence along the centre of the Car Brook in a southerly direction to the point of junction with the old boundary between the townships of Sheffield and Attercliffe-cum-Darnall, thence in a northwesterly direction along such township boundary to the railway sidings of the Nunnery Colliery Company, thence in a northerly direction to the western toe of the Woodbourn Junction of the said Great Central Railway, thence along the centre of the said Great Central Railway, in a westerly direction to the point where the said tramway of the Nunnery Colliery Company passes beneath the said railway, thence along the ce tre of the said tramway in a northerly direction to the said canal, thence along the said canal in a northeasterly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 8. Park Ward.

"I do hereby determine that Park Ward shall comprise so much of the said city of Sheffield as is contained within an imaginary line commencing from a point in the centre of the River Rivelin at Lady's Bridge, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Lady's Bridge and Waingate to the Haymarket, thence along the centre of the Haymarket to Fitzalan square, thence along the old Parliamentary and Ward boundary on the east side of Fitzalan-square to the centre of Baker's Hill, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Baker's Hill and Norfolk-street to Arundel-street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Arundel-street to Howardstreet, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Howard-street to Pond-street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Pondstreet to Suffolk-road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Suffolk-road to the River Sheaf, thence in a southerly direction along the course of the said River Sheaf to Havelook Bridge, thence (following the old Union and Ward boundary) in a south-easterly direction to the point where it joins the County and Parliamentary boundary at the eastern corner of Buck Wood, thence (following the old City boundary) in a north-easterly and northerly direction to the centre of the Car Brook at the junction of the old boundary between the townships of Sheffield and Attercliffe-cum-Darnall, thence in a north-westerly direction along such township boundary to the sidings of the Nunnery Colliery Company, thence in an imaginary line in a northerly direction to the western toe of the Woodbourn Junction of the Great Central Railway, thence along the centre of the said Great Central Railway in a westerly direction to the point where the said tramway of the Nunnery Colliery Company passes beneath the said railway, thence in a north-westerly direction along the said tramway to the centre of the River Don, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of the River Don to the point of commencement aforeșaid.

"No. 9. Heeley Ward.

"I do hereby determine that Heeley Ward shall comprise so much of the said city of Sheffield as is contained within the parish of Heeley and so much of the parish of Norton and the liberty of Beauchief as is described in the second Schedule to 'The Sheffield Corporation Act 1900,' paragraphs (G) and (H).

"No. 10. Sharrow Ward. "I do hereby determine that Sharrow Ward shall comprise so much of the said city of Shetfield as is contained within an imaginary line commencing from a point at the centre of the River Sheaf at Havelock Bridge, thence in a northerly to the centre of the Car Brook where the same direction along the centre of Havelock Bridge

aforesaid to Bramall-lane, thence along the centre of Bramall-lane to a point where it is crossed by the Porter Brook near Hereford-street, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of the Porter Brook to South-street Moor, at its junction with Ecclesall-road, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Ecclesall-road to its junction with Harrow-street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Harrow-street to the Porter Brook, thence along the Porter Brook in a southwesterly direction to the south-western boundary of the Sheffield General Cemetery, thence in a south-easterly direction along the south-western boundary of the said Cemetery to Cemetery-road, thence along the centre of Cemetery-road to Kenwood-road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Kenwood-road to Kenwood Park-road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Kenwood Park-road to Crescent-road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Crescent-road to Upper Chippinghouse-road, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Upper Chippinghouse-road and Chippinghouse-road to London-road thence in a northerly direction along the centre of London-road to Queen's-road, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Queen'sroad to Jersey-road, thence in a south-easterly dir ction along the centre of Jersey-road to Cutlers'-walk, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Cutlers'-walk to the Parliamentary boundary, thence in a north-easterly direction along such boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 11. Ecclesall Ward.

"I do hereby determine that Ecclesall Ward shall comprise so much of the said city of Sheffield as is contained within an imaginary line commencing from a point in the centre of the Porter Brook at the most westerly point of the boundary of the Sheffield General Cemetery, thence in a south-easterly direction along the south-western boundary of the said General Cemetery to Cemetery-road, thence along the centre of Cemetery-road to Kenwood-road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Kenwood-road to Kenwood Park-road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Kenwood Park-road to Crescent-road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Crescent-road to Upper Chippinghouse-road, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Upper Chippinghouse-road and Chippinghouse-road to London-road, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of London-road to Queen's-road, thence in a northeasterly direction along the centre of Queen'sroad to Jersey-road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Jersey-road to Cutlers'-walk, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Cutlers'-walk to the Parliamentary boundary, thence in a south-westerly direction along such boundary to the point where the Limb Brook flows into the River Sheaf, thence following the township and city boundary in a north-westerly direction to the township boundary between the townships of Ecclesall Bierlow and Upper Hallam, thence following such township boundary in a north-easterly direction to the point where a certain brook enters the Porter Brook near Brocco Bank, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of the Porter Brook to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 12. Broomhall Ward.
"I do hereby determine that Broomhall Ward shall comprise so much of the said city of Sheffield as is contained within an imaginary line commencing from a point in Bramall-lane where it is

crossed by the Porter Brook near Hereford-street, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of the Porter Brook to South-street Moor, at its junction with Ecclesall-road, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Ecclesall-road to Harrow-street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Harrow-street to the Porter Brook, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of the Porter Brook to the point where it is joined by a stream from Brocco Bank, thence in a nor:h-westerly direction to Brocco Bank, thence along a line on the western side of Brocco Bank to its junction with Clarkehouse-road, thence along a line in a north-easterly direction along Clarkehouse-road and Glossop-road to its junction with Wilkinson-street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Wilkinsonstreet to Upper Hanover-street, thence by an imaginary line in a south-easterly direction to a point on the south side of Conway-street about 90 feet west of Gell-street, thence in a northeasterly direction, a distance of one hundred and thirty feet or thereabouts, to the township boundary in the centre of Gell-street, thence following such township boundary in an easterly and southerly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 13. Hallam Ward.

"I do hereby determine that Hallam Ward shall comprise so much of the city of Sheffield as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at a point in Clarkehouse-road at the foot of Newbould-lane, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Newbould-lane to Nile-street, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Nile-street to Whitham-road, thence across Whitham-road to Crookes-road, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Crookes-road to a point to the north of Roslynroad, thence in a northerly direction along the embankment of the Hadfield Dam of the Sheffield Corporation Waterworks to Glebe-road, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of such road to School-road, thence easterly along the centre of School-road to Western-road, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Western-road to Northfield-road, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Northfield-road to a point opposite the footpath leading from Northfield-road across the Bole Hills to Bole Hill-road, thence along the centre of such footpath in a north-westerly direction to Bole Hill-road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Bole Hill-road to Nichol-road, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Nichol-road to the easternmost point of the Walkley Cemetery, thence in a north-westerly direction along the north-eastern boundary of the said Walkley Cemetery, thence in a southwesterly direction along the south east and southern boundaries of the Saint Michael's Cemetery to the centre of the River Rivelin, thence in a westerly direction along the northern boundary of the township of Upper Hallam to the western-most point of the city, thence easterly along the southern boundary of the township of Upper Hallam to a point in the centre of the Porter Brook opposite its junction with the stream from Brocco Bank, thence in a north-westerly direction to Brocco Bank, thence along the western side of Brocco Bank to Clarkehouse-road, thence along Clarkehouse-road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"No. 14. Crookesmoor Ward.
"I do hereby determine that Crookesmoor Ward shall comprise so much of the said city of Sheffield as is contained within an imaginary line

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Chester) Order, 1901.

Dated 29th March, 1901.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Chester, I hereby make the following Order:-

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Chester) Order, 1901."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds or any of them, is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be extended throughout the County of Chester, so as to be from the 2nd day of March to the 12th day of August in each year, both days inclusive:—

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order shall apply within the whole of the county of Chester to the Kestrel and Heron as if those species were included in the Schedule to that Act.

Other Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

IV. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, shall apply within the area named in Clause XI of this Order to the following species of Wild Birds as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Red-backed Shrike, Whinchat, Spotted Flycatcher, Sedge Warbler, Blackcap Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Wood Warbler, Garden Warbler, Missel Thrush, Common Bunting, Reed Bunting, Goldfinch, Wheatear, Chiffichaff, Goldencrested Wren, Yellow Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Water Wagtail, Skylark, and Titlark.

All Birds Protected during the Whole of the Year Within a Certain Area.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880 (as extended by Clause II of this Order) does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited within the area named in Clause XI of this Order.

Additional Protection for the Gull and Tern.

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880 (as extended by Clause II of this Order) does not apply, the killing or taking of the Gull and Tern is prohibited throughout the County of Chester.

Certain Districts Exempted from the Operation of Clause VI.

VII. I hereby exempt from the operation of Clause VI of this Order so much of the County of Chester as does not lie within the parishes of Puddington, Burton, Ness, Neston-cum-Parkgate, Gayton, Heswall - cum - Oldfield, Thurstaston, Caldy, Hoylake - cum - West Kirby, Wallasey, Lower Bebington, Bromborough, Eastham, Hooton, Netherpool, Whitby, Stanlow, Ince, Great Stanney, Frodsham Lordship, Weston, Runcorn, Halton, Norton, Moore, Acton Grange, Walton Inferior, including therein so much of the estuaries of the Rivers Dee and Mersey as lies within the Administrative County of Chester.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

VIII. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880" (as extended by Clause II of this Order), does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Chester:—

Kingfisher, Great Crested Grebe, Heron, Goldfinch, Öwl, Siskin, Twite, Brown Linnet, Lesser Redpoll, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Bittern,

Shoveller Duck, Little Grebe or Dabchick, Goat Sucker or Nightjar.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

IX. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Chester.

throughout the County of Chester :-

Owl, Bittern, Kingfisher, Kestrel, Heron, Sheldrake, Dunlin, Blackheaded Gull, Common Tern, Oyster Catcher, Shrike, Hawfinch, Twite, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Little Grebe or Dabchick, Great Crested Grebe, Redshank, Sandpiper, Goat Sucker or Nightjar.

All Eggs Protected within a Certain Area.

X. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited within the area named in Clause XI for a period of five years from the date of this Order.

Market Garden Lands exempted from the operation of this Order.

XI. And I make the following further Order, which shall apply within the portion of the hundred of Wirral, coloured pink on the maps deposited in the Home Office and in the office of the County Council, and embracing the low-lying lands and sandhills situate between the estuaries of the Rivers Dee and Mersey, of which the boundaries shall commence to the south at a point of the main highway of the county of Chester 200 yards to the west of the Dock Cottages near "Docks" Railway Station of the Wirral Railway, run along the main highway to Bidston Village, and then turn in a northerly direction and run to Bidston Railway Station of the same railway, then turn in a westerly direction and run along the Wirral Railway until it reaches the Meols Station of such railway, then run along the highway near to the Meols Railway Station in a northerly direction to the Irish Sea, then on the north along the margin of high-water mark of the Irish Sea to a point at New Brighton where the Yellow Noses joins the said Irish Sea, and then run in a southerly direction to "Warren Drive" or road, and along "Warren Drive" to the most northerly house and grounds on the west side of such drive, then along the western boundary of the houses and premises situate along the western side of such drive or road to a point 100 yards or so from Grove-road, then turning in a westerly direction along the northern boundaries of the houses and premises in Grove-road, Wallasey, until it reaches the Wirral Railway, then turning in a southerly direction along the Wirral Railway until it reaches the Wallasey Marsh, then along the edge of the marsh in a southerly direction until it reaches the Poulton Halfpenny Bridge, then turning in a westerly direction on the edge of the said marsh until it reaches along the edge of the marsh the main highway leading from Poulton to Meols; such parts within the aforesaid boundaries as are market-garden lands and are not coloured in the said maps are excepted from the operation of this Order.
