MEMORANDUM.

Lieutenant Robert James Thomas Digby Jones, Royal Engineers, and No. 459, Trooper H. Albrecht, Imperial Light Horse, would have been recommended to His Majesty for the Victoria Cross had they survived, on account of their having during the attack on Waggon Hill (Ladysmith), of 6th January, 1900, displayed conspicuous bravery and gallant conduct in leading the force which re-occupied the top of the hill at a critical moment just as the three foremost attacking Boers reached it, the leader being shot by Lieutenant Jones, and the two others by Trooper Albrecht.

Now therefore, by virtue of the powers in me vested, I hereby order that all vessels arriving from the said place shall be placed in quarantine, and that no person or thing shall be relieved from quarantine until released by the Colonial Surgeon and approved by the Governor, and it is further ordered that no licensed trader or humboatman shall be permitted to board or go alongside any passing vessel from the aforesaid place.

Any person contravening any of the foregoing restrictions shall be liable to the penalties laid down in Her Majesty's Order in Council dated 11th July, 1889.

Treasury Department, March 15, 1901.

To Collectors of Customs and others:—

The attention of Officers of the Customs is invited to the Act approved March 3, 1901, printed below, granting additional quarantine powers to the Marine Hospital Service, and relating to bill of health in certain cases. Regulations relating to bills of health and the infliction of penalties for failure to produce such documents in certain cases were embodied in the Depart-

ment's Circulars dated April 24, 1899, July 15, 1899, and February 9, 1900, respectively.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That an Act granting additional quarantine powers and imposing additional duties upon the Marine-Hospital Service, approved February 15, 1893, be amended by addition of the following sections:—

"Sec. 10. That the Supervising Surgeon-General, with the approval of the Secretary of the Treasury, is authorized to designate and mark the boundaries of the quarantine grounds and quarantine anchorages for vessels which are reserved for use at each United States quarantine station; and any vessel or officer of any vessel or other person, other than State or municipal health or quarantine officers, trespassing or otherwise entering upon such grounds or anchorages in disregard of the quarantine rules and regulations, or without permission of the officer in charge of such station, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanour and subject to arrest, and upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not more than 300 dollars or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both, in the discretion of the court. Any master or owner of any vessel, or any person violating any provision of this Act or any rule or regulation made in accordance with this Act, relating to inspection of vessels or relating to the prevention of the introduction of contagious or infectious diseases, or any master, owner, or agent of any vessel making a false statement relative to the sanitary condition of said vessel or its contents or as to the health of any passenger or person thereon, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanour and subject to arrest, and upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not more than 500 dollars or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both, in the discretion of the court.

"Sec. 11. That any vessel sailing from any foreign port without the bill of health required by section two of this Act, and arriving within the limits of any collection district of the United States, and not entering or attempting to enter any port of the United States, shall be subject to such quarantine measures as shall be prescribed by regulations of the Secretary of the Treasury, and the cost of such measures shall be a lien on said vessel, to be recovered by proceedings in the proper district court of the United States and in the manner set forth above as regards vessels from foreign ports without bills of health and entering any port of the United States.

"Sec. 12. That the medical officers of the United States, duly clothed with authority to act as quarantine officers at any port or place within the United States, and when performing the said duties, are hereby authorized to take declarations and administer oaths in matters pertaining to the administration of the quarantine laws and regulations of the United States."

2. 3. These examinations are open, under such general restrictions as may be laid down, to all natural-born subjects of His Majesty, being of the requisite age, health, and character. The under-mentioned special conditions are at present in force :—

(i.) The following classes of persons are ineligible, viz. :—

(a.) Persons actually serving in the Army or Navy.

(b.) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of less than five years' service.

(ii.) The following classes of persons are eligible under certain conditions only, that is to say :—

(c.) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service.

(d.) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary, of more than five years' service.

(e.) Apprentices and Engineer Students in His Majesty's Dockyards.

(f.) Persons who have been trained in Training Colleges at the public expense.

(g.) Persons who have been trained in the Inland Revenue Branch of the Government Laboratory.

Persons comprised in the classes (c), (d), (e) must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination, before the commencement of the competition.
