Since the Evacuation of Roinberg and Kesserways by the Troops of Holland, Brandenburg, and Munster, those that were in Garison at Dorsten, the Chief Town of the County of Recklinhusen, have also quitted that place; and 'tis not doubted, but that in pursuance of the Orders sent from hence the like has been done by the Troops of Munster, who were at Werel and Arensperg in the Saurlandt; so that the Elector of Cologne is at prefent possessed of all the Places and Fortresses belonging to him. We are still assured, that the faid Elector, with his Brother the Elector of Bavaria, will be here about the 20th of the. next Month. The Elector Palatin gives our Commissions for new Levies-

Edinburgh, Jan. 7.
