RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

THE following draft Rules are published pursuant to the Rules Publication Act :—

1. Order XXII, Rule 17, shall have effect as if the following investments were included therein :—

2½ Per Cent. Metropolitan Consolidated Stock.

2½ Per Cent. London County Consolidated Stock.

3 Per Cent. London County Consolidated Stock.

2. Rule of the Supreme Court under the London Government Act, 1899, Section 29.

(1.) The summary proceeding for submitting any question for decision to the High Court of Justice under the 29th section of the London Government Act, 1899, shall be (by special case to be agreed upon by the parties, or in default of such agreement to be settled by an arbitrator agreed upon by the parties, or, if necessary, appointed by a Judge at Chambers, or to be settled by a Judge in Chambers.
