**T**HE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, information to the effect that the following Quarantine Regulations are in force in Roumania:—

Le Gouvernement Roumain a décidé qu'à l'avenir les provenances de Bassorah, du Golfe de Perse, d'Alexandrie et de l'Egypte en général, subiront à leur entrée en Roumanie une quarantaine de dix jours, et qu'en outre des objets énumérés au titre IV, Chap. II du Règlement annexé à la Convention sanitaire de Venise, l'importation des laines, fourrures, cotons, cordages, prints, légumes et conserves sera prohibée.

En même temps il a été décidé que la quarantaine pour les provenances de Constantinople sera remplacée par une visite médicale.

Les ports de Constanza et Mangalia sont de nouveau ouverts aux provenances de Constantinople; le service des bateaux-poste continuera comme par le passé, et les mesures sanitaires pour désinfecter la correspondance venant de Turquie à Verciorova, sont supprimées.
