Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour

Department), London, June 10, 1901. THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following Quarantine Notices from the Cyprus Gazette of the 10th May: (No. 5592.)

Under the power and authority vested in him by the "Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," His Excellency the High Commissioner directs that any vessel arriving from any port or place on the coast of Egypt shall be subjected to medical inspection with disinfection to be undergone at Larnaca.

3rd May, 1901.

(No. 5593.) Under the power and authority vested in him by the "Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," His Excellency the High Commissioner orders that all direct arrivals from Constantinople be subjected to five days' quarantine, to be undergone at Larnaca, and that the importation of very susceptible goods, i.e., rags, worn clothing, and empty used sacks, except gypsum sacks, is prohibited.

3rd May, 1901. (No. 5594.)

Under the power and authority vested in him by the "Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," His Excellency the High Commissioner directs that any vessel arriving from any port or place on the coast of Egypt, which left on or after the 5th instant, shall be subjected to five days' quarantine, to be undergone at Larnaca, unless such vessel shall have performed five days' quarantine at an intermediate port, and shall be provided with a clean bill of health, and, further, that any such vessel which has performed quarantine for less than five days at an intermediate port, and although provided with a clean bill of health, shall not be admitted to free pratique, but must complete the five days at Larnaca.

The High Commissioner further directs that all quarantine must be performed on board ship. Sth May, 1901.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in

exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Provisions of Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 applied to the City of Norwich.

1.—(1.) The provisions of the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 shall apply to the city of Norwich, but no swine, fat or store, shall be moved out of the said city, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

(2.) Nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine where they are moved through that city by railway from a place outside that city to another place outside that city without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within

that city.

(3.) Swine may be moved with a Licence of an Inspector of the Board or of a person authorized by the Board to grant the same, which Licence will only be granted where the Board, after inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render the movement necessary or expedient.

Exclusion of City of Norwich from Scheduled Order.

2. From and after the commencement of this Order, the city of Norwich shall cease to form part of the Swine-Fever Infected Area declared by the Order described in the Schedule hereto: Provided that such withdrawal shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under such Order and the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

Offences.

3. If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person tausing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one.

5. This Order may be cited as the Norwich (Swine-Fever) Order of 1901.

- 5. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.
- 6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.
- 7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.
- 8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in the interior of any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Council the fare legally demandable for the

journey.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Council, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. A passenger, not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Council, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics,

or daily labourers.

12. Personal cr other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage.

13. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Council shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

14. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

15. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the con-

ductor not to do so.

16. When a carriage contains the full licensed number of passengers, a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the carriage.

17. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the licensed number to enter or mount or remain in or upon any part of a carriage.

- 18. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage whilst in motion.
- 19. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Council with loaded fire-arms.

21. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Council in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Council.

22. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and

Regulations to the best of his ability.

23. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.
