**T**HIS day has been pleased to receive, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following Quarantine Notices from the Cyprus Gazette of the 10th May :—

Under the power and authority vested in him by the "Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," His Excellency the High Commissioner directs that any vessel arriving from any port or place on the coast of Egypt shall be subjected to medical inspection with disinfection to be undergone at Larnaca.

Under the power and authority vested in him by the "Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," His Excellency the High Commissioner orders that all direct arrivals from Constantinople be subjected to five days' quarantine, to be undergone at Larnaca, and that the importation of very susceptible goods, i.e., rags, worn clothing, and empty used sacks, except gypsum sacks, is prohibited.
