ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 11TH JUNE 1901.)

LUTON (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1901.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Provisions of Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 applied to the Borough of Luton.*

1.—(1.) The provisions of the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 shall apply to the borough of Luton, but no swine, fat or store, shall be moved out of the said borough, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

(2.) Nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine where they are moved through that borough by railway from a place outside that borough to another place outside that borough without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within that borough.

(3.) Swine may be moved with a Licence of an Inspector of the Board or of a person authorized by the Board to grant the same, which Licence will only be granted where the Board, after

inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render the movement necessary or expedient.

**Exclusion of Borough of Luton from Scheduled Order.**

2. The borough of Luton shall cease to form part of the Swine-Fever Infected Area declared by the Order described in the Schedule hereto: Provided that such withdrawal shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under such Order and the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

*Offences.*

3. If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Commencement.*

4. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one.

*Short Title.*

5. This Order may be cited as the LUTON (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1901.

WHEREAS the population of the Parish of Great Berkhampstead Urban exceeds two thousand persons:

And whereas the Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish, pursuant to a Resolution of the Vestry at a Meeting on Thursday, the 22nd day of November, 1900, have applied to Us, the Local Government Board, for an Order putting in force in the said Parish so much of the Vestries Act, 1850, as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—So much of the Vestries Act, 1850, as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said Parish of Great Berkhampstead Urban.

ARTICLE II.—It shall be the duty of the Vestry Clerk for the time being appointed for the said Parish—

To give notice of and attend the Meetings of Vestry and Committees appointed thereat.

To summon and attend Meetings of the Overseers, when required, and to enter the minutes thereof respectively.

To keep the Account of all Charity Monies which the Overseers are authorized or are accustomed to distribute.

To keep the Vestry Books and the Parish deeds and documents, and the Rate Books and Accounts which are closed, and to give copies of and extracts from the same to any person entitled thereto, such person paying for the same at the rate of fourpence for every seventy-two words or figures, and to permit any person or persons rated to the relief of the Poor of the said Parish at all reasonable times to inspect the same or any of them, on pain of dismissal for neglecting to give such copies or permit such inspection.

To assist the Overseers in making out their Accounts (whenever required by them).

To attend the Audit of Accounts of the Overseers and conduct all correspondence arising therefrom.

To ascertain and make out the list of persons liable to serve on Juries, and to cause the same to be printed and duly published and returned to the Justices.

To give the notices for claims to vote for Members of Parliament and to make out lists of voters, and get the same printed and published and duly returned according to law, and to attend the Court for revising them.

To make all returns required of the Overseers by law or proper authority.

To advise the Overseers in all the duties of their office, and also to perform such other duties and services of a like nature as the Local Government Board shall from time to time prescribe and direct to be performed by such Vestry Clerk.

ARTICLE III.—Every person for the time being appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk for the said Parish shall give to the Guardians of the Poor of the Berkhampstead Union a Bond, in a penal sum of not less than One Hundred Pounds, in the names of himself and two sufficient sureties, not being officers of that Union, conditioned for the due and faithful performance of the duties of the office; and shall give immediate notice to the said Guardians of the death or bankruptcy of either of such sureties, or of either of them having compounded with his creditors or liquidated his affairs by arrangement, and shall, when required by the said Guardians, produce a certificate, signed by two householders, that his sureties are alive and believed by them to be solvent, and shall supply a fresh surety in the place of any such surety who may die, or become bankrupt, or who may have compounded with his creditors or liquidated his affairs as aforesaid:

Provided that the said Guardians may accept as a security the guarantee of any Company or Association which shall undertake to guarantee the good conduct of such officer, and shall give their guarantee in a security, the form whereof shall have been approved by the Poor Law Board or the Local Government Board under their Seal.

ARTICLE IV.—The Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish shall pay to the person for the time being appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk, under the authority of this Order, a salary at the rate of Ten Pounds per annum, or such other remuneration for the performance of the duties of that office as We may from time to time direct or approve.

ARTICLE V.—Such remuneration, in the case of an annual salary, shall be considered as accruing from day to day, and be apportionable in respect of time accordingly, in pursuance of the

provisions of the Apportionment Act, 1870, and shall be paid quarterly on the usual Quarter Days in each year, namely, Midsummer Day, Michaelmas Day, Christmas Day, and Lady Day.

Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Birkenhead, as the Local Authority of the said Borough, and also as the Promoters of the Tramways belonging to them with respect to such Tramways under the powers conferred upon them by "The Tramways Act, 1870."

##### Repeal of Former Bye-Laws.

1. From and after the date of these Bye-laws coming into force the Bye-laws with respect to the tramways within the said Borough, made and passed by the Corporation of the borough of Birkenhead, at a meeting of the Town Council, held on Wednesday, the 5th day of April, 1882, and the Regulations with respect to the said tramways, made and passed by the said Town Council at the said meeting on the 5th day of April, 1882, shall be repealed; but any proceeding pending at the time of such repeal may be continued and prosecuted as if such repeal had not taken effect.

##### Application of Bye-laws and Regulations.

2. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Corporation, and to all vehicles authorized by the Corporation used upon the tramways, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations.

##### Conductor.

3. The expression "Conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Corporation in connection with their tramways.

##### Entering and Leaving Carriages.

4. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindmost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise.

##### Smoking.

5. No passenger shall smoke inside a carriage except in a compartment provided for that purpose.

##### Playing Musical Instruments.

6. No passenger shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, sound or play upon any musical instrument.

##### Intoxicated Persons.

7. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and, if found in or upon any carriage, may be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

##### Offensive Language, &c.

8. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

##### Damaging Carriages.

9. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions, or the linings, or remove or deface any number, plate, printed or other notice, in or on any carriage, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation, shall be liable to pay the amount of any damage done in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations.

##### Objectionable Persons.

10. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter in or remain in or upon any carriage, and may be prevented from mounting any carriage, and shall not mount any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found upon any carriage shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the carriage, upon the fare (if previously paid) being returned.

##### Payment of Fares.

11. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly authorized servant of the Corporation, the fare legally demandable for the journey.

##### Tickets.

12. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do, to the conductor, inspector, or other duly authorized servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

##### Wrongful use of "Workmen's" Tickets.

13. A passenger, not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Act of Parliament relating thereto, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

##### Luggage.

14. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed upon the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage. The conductor may decline to take into or upon the carriage any luggage which, from its size or otherwise, is not, in the opinion of the conductor, suitable for conveyance in or upon the carriage.

##### Travelling on Steps, &c.

15. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Corporation employed in the tramway service, shall travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the



roof of any carriage, if requested not to do so by the conductor.

**Interfering with Bells, Brakes, &c.**

16. No unauthorized person travelling in or upon any carriage shall wilfully touch, or interfere or meddle in any way with any bell or brake or any other appliance, machinery or mechanism fixed to, connected with, or in anywise belonging to such carriage.

**Entering full Carriages.**

17. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is authorized to carry, no additional person, not being a servant of the Corporation employed in the tramway service, shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

**Mounting or Dismounting from Carriages in Motion.**

18. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage whilst it is in motion.

**Dogs, &c.**

19. No dog or any other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal found in or on any carriage in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and, in default of compliance with such request, such dog or other animal may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

**Fire-arms.**

20. No person shall travel in or on any carriage whilst in possession of any loaded fire-arm.

**Obstructing Officials in Exercise of Duty.**

21. No passenger or other person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Corporation.

**Stations and Stopping Places.**

22. It shall be lawful for the Corporation, from time to time, in such streets as they may think expedient, to appoint and vary junctions and stations and other places where the carriages shall start from or stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers, and it shall not be incumbent upon the conductor of a carriage to stop the same for the purpose of taking up or setting down passengers, except when requested so to do at any of such places.

**Impeding Traffic.**

23. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on any of the tramways of the Corporation.

**Penalty.**

24. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and, in the case of a continuing offence, to a penalty not exceeding ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the first day of September, 1901.
