

ording to the report of all the Deserters, and Prisoners that have been taken coming out of the place, they cannot possibly hold out above 3 weeks or a Month longer. From *Transylvania* they write, that the Cham of *Tartary* was returned with all his Hords towards *Budzack*, to secure his Country against the Invasions of the Moscovites and the Poles, but that several Melengers had been sent after him from the *Part*, to desire he would repair to *Adrianople* to assist at a great Council of War that is designed to be held there, to regulate the Affairs of the next Campaign: That *Tuckeley* was with several Hundred Men about *Vipalanka*: And that the Body of the late Marquis of *Doria*, who staid with him as one of the Hostages for payment of General *Heusler's* Ransom, was brought to *Hermersstadt*, and would be there buried. We are told from *Croatia*, that the Turks were drawing some Troops together in *Dysia*, with a design, as 'twas believed, to make an attempt upon *Gradisca*; but that the Garrison of that place was in a very good posture to receive them. The Count de *Thaun* is gone to *Bohemia* to hasten the Recruits and new Levies that are making there for the Emperor's Service.

*Hydelberg*, Jan. 14. There are lately come to *Eppingen* 1000 Saxons to reinforce the Garrison of that place. The Count de *Stirum* is daily expected at *Esslingen* to command there in the absence of General *Caprara*, who is going to *Vienna*. We were told the last week, that some French Troops were moving between *Landau* and *Philipsburg*, upon which a Detachment of Imperialists was sent out to observe them; but we have heard nothing more of them.

*Cologne*, Jan. 15. The French continue to send several Detachements from *Lorraine* towards *Flanders*; and we hear that part of the Garrison of *Luxemburg* is all marched towards the *Meuse*. The Troops of *Mosier* have evacuated *Werel* and *Arensberg*.

*Edinburg*, Jan. 14. Yesterday Their Majesties Commission, Constituting the Earl of *Tweeddale* Lord High Chancellor of this Kingdom, was delivered to his Lordship, by the Earl of *Crawford* Elected President of Their Majesties Council for that Meeting, and after taking the Oaths required by Law, he took his Place as Chancellor at the Council Board. This day arrived here the Earl of *Lothian* Their Majesties High Commissioner for the General Assembly in this Kingdom.

*Pembroke*, Jan. 15. Two Troops of Danish Horle are come into this Harbour from *Iceland*; and another into *Tenby*.

*Barnstaple*, Jan. 15. Several Troops of Danish Horle have landed here this and the last week from *Ireland*; and the Transport Ships are returned to *Cork* to fetch more.

*Falmouth*, Jan. 14. The *James* of *London*, *John Matthews* Commander; the *Zant* Frigate, Captain *Darby*; and the *Vineyard* of *Fowey*, bound for the *Streights*, are come in here, in order to proceed under the Convoy of Sir *Ralph Delaval* who is hourly expected to pass by this Port with the Ships under his command.

*Plymouth*, Jan. 17. On the 13th Instant Sir *Ralph Delaval* sailed from hence with a Squadron of English and Dutch Men of War, (being himself in the *Torke*) and about 50 Sail of Merchant Ships under his Convoy, for *Cadix*. And the 14th in the morning the Ships that had lain several days in *Torbay*, joined him. The 14th also came in from the Eastward about 14 Sail of Merchant Ships with their Convoy bound

for *Biboa*. The 15th Their Majesties Ships the *Monke* and *Sepire* arrived here from the Eastward with two Prizes, one of about 250 Tuns laden with Provisions; and the other of about 150 Tuns in Ballast.

*Fortsmouth*, Jan. 17. Their Majesties Ships the *Monmouth*, *Moumaue*, and *Flope*, sailed on the 15th Instant out of this Harbour to *Spithead*.

*Whitehall*, Jan. 19. This day Sir *Evan Cameron* of *Locheal* went to *Kensington*, and had the Honour to kiss Their Majesties Hands, giving them all possible Assurance of his own and the rest of the Highlanders their Security, in submitting to Their Majesties Government.
