The Count de Thaun is gone to Bohemia to ha-ften the Recruits and new Levies that are mak-

ing there for the Emperor's Service.

Hydelberg, Jun. 14. There are lately come to Eppingen 1000 Saxons to reinforce the Garifon of that place. The Count de Stirum is daily expected at Eslingen to command there in the absence of General Caprara, who is going to Vienna. We were told the last week, that some kiench Troops were moving between Landau and Christophura, upon which a Devachement of Imperiodital Philipsburg, upon which a Detachement of Imperialits was fint out to observe them; but we have heard nothing

more of them.
