Translation of Circular No. 7805 of the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste to all the Imperial and Royal Offices and Officers and Subordinate Port and Sanitary Offices and Officers.

The Imperial and Royal Ministry for Commerce, in union with the Imperial and Royal Ministry of the Interior, has ordered, by a telegraphic despatch dated 22nd June, 1901, No. 2424/H.M., that the regulations issued by their telegram, dated 6th June, 1899, No. 30561, and published by Government Circular of 7th June, 1899, No. 6462, respecting arrivals from Egypt, are to be observed again, therefore vessels arriving from all Egyptian ports will be subjected to it.

It is also made known that the prohibition of importation and transit of certain specified goods and effects from Egypt, issued by Government Circular of June 7th, 1899, No. 6513, is still in force.

This is made known for direction and guidance in addition to Government Circulars of November 5th, 1900, No. 13835, and of May 4th and June 10th, 1901, Nos. 5429 and 7161, which by the present Circular are abrogated.

FOREIGN ANIMALS (AMENDMENT)
ORDER OF 1901 (No. 2).

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Prohibition of Landing of Carcases, &c.

1. It shall not be lawful to land in Great Britain—

- (i.) a carcase of an animal which has been carried alive from a port in a prohibited country; or
- (ii.) the dung of any such animal; or
- (iii.) any partly consumed or broken fodder that has been supplied to any such animal; or
- (iv.) any litter that has been used for or about any such animal.

Power of Seizure and Detention.

2. The Principal Officer of Customs may seize and detain any carcase, dung, fodder, or litter landed in contravention of this Order, and he shall forthwith report the facts to the Commissioners of

Customs who may give such directions as they think fit for the destruction or disposal thereof.

Offences.

3. If any carcase, dung, fodder, or litter is landed in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place of landing where such carcase, dung, fodder, or litter is landed, and also the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Interpretation.

4. In this Order—

“Prohibited Country” means a scheduled country within the meaning of the Foreign Animals Order of 1896:

“Animal” means a head of cattle, or a sheep, goat, or pig:

“Carcase” means the carcase of an animal, and includes part of a carcase, and the meat, bones, hide, skin, hoofs, horns, offal, or other part of an animal, separately or otherwise, or any portion thereof:

“Fodder” means hay or other substance commonly used for food of animals:

“Litter” means straw or other substance commonly used for bedding or otherwise for or about animals:

“Master” includes a person having the charge or command of a vessel.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the fourth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and one.
