3758	* Corporal W Holmes	Volunteered to carry a message to Headquarters. Did so under heavy fire and returned at once to his picquet. With five others occupied a post which was at 3.30 a.m. surrounded by enemy. Defended post till 5 a.m., then seeing that it was under fire from a house in rear, Corporal Holmes said those who wished could retire to company in rear, at the same time calling for volunteers to stay with him. Four men attempted to get away, but Walker remained, and the two held the post till 5 p.m., when all the ammunition being expended, they attempted to get away, but were captured <i>en route</i> .
