COURT OF CLAIMS.

Council Chamber, Whitehall, July 1, 1901.

ALL persons desirous of presenting Petitions or Claims concerning Services to be done or performed by them at the time of the ensuing Coronation, pursuant to His Majesty's Royal Proclamation of the 26th June last, may send the same under cover to the Clerks of the Court of Claims, Privy Council Office, Whitehall.

The Commissioners are required by the Proclamation to exclude from their consideration such claims as may be submitted to them in respect of rights or services connected with the parts of the Ceremonial heretofore performed in Westminster Hall and with the Procession, the Ceremony being confined to Westminster Abbey.

Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour Department), London, July 13, 1901.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a Quarantine Notice, dated 5th July (No. 174), issued by the Governor of Malta, amending section 3 of Government Notice No. 165 of the 28th June, 1901, so that it shall read as follows :—

3. Swine.

(a.) Swine arriving from Prevesa may be imported subject to 90 days' quarantine at the lazaretto.

(b.) Swine arriving from all other ports of Turkey and Greece will be subjected to eight days' observation at the lazaretto.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a Quarantine Notice, dated July 5 (No. 175), issued by the Governor of Malta, amending Government Notice No. 168 of the 1st July, 1901, by the addition of the following provision :—

"Passengers arriving at Malta shall, before being allowed to land, declare on oath before an Inspector of Marine Police or other Superior Officer, that they have not been in Egypt or in Constantinople within 10 days; whenever they do not make this declaration on oath, they shall undergo quarantine for 10 days."
