N Monday last the Cardinal de Fourbin had a long Audience of the Pope, to whom he delivered a Letter from the French King (which he had received that Morning by Express) on the Subject of the Differences between the two Courts. The Congregation of Cardinals, appointed for the Exmination of this Affair, met the next day, and agin yesterday, when after a long discussion of the Points in Question, they came finally to this Resolution, That the Pop's Bails should be dispatched for such of the French Bishos as had not essibled at the Assembly of the Clercy in 1682, nor right of the four Propositions against the Auterity of the Church of Rome.
