Arrêté No. 265.

Le Secrétaire Général, chargé des affaires courantes du Ministère de l'Intérieur, ayant en vue que, d'après les informations officielles le Gouvernement Ottoman a renforcé les mesures quaranténaires applicables aux provenances de Constantinople destinées pour l'intérieur de la Turquie et pour l'étranger, ordonne, conformément à la décision du Conseil Médical Supérieur prise le 7 de ce mois, que les mesures quaranténaires édictées par les arrêtés sub Nos. 224, 228, 239, 242 et 260, en date du 21, 23 et 27 Juin dernier, 4 et 6 Juillet courant soient modifiées comme il suit.

1° Seront considérées à l'avenir contaminées la ville de Constantinople avec ses environs et l'île de Chios.

2° Les voyageurs venant de Constantinople ou d'autres localités contaminées par bateau ou par

chemin de fer seront admis par Bourgas et Hébibtchévo, ceux venant des autres localités de la Turquie non contaminées seront admis par Varna, Dévé-Bair, Kotchérinovo ou Tzaribrod. Tous les autres points de la frontière sont fermés pour les voyageurs arrivant de Constantinople ou d'autres localités contaminées.

3° Les voyageurs de Constantinople ou d'autres localités contaminées sont admis après avoir été soumis à Bourgas ou à Hébibtchévo à une quarantaine de sept jours et à la désinfection par la vapeur de leurs bagages et de tous leurs effets; sont soumis aux mêmes mesures les voyageurs, avec leurs bagages qui, venant de localités non contaminées, ont eu, durant le voyage, contact avec des voyageurs arrivant de pays contaminés. Les provisions de tels voyageurs seront détruites par le feu.

4° Après avoir quitté la quarantaine, les voyageurs qui resteront en Bulgarie, doivent être soumis à une observation pendant 4 jours dans leur lieu d'arrêt ou de séjour. L'observation sera faite conformément aux instructions indiquées dans la circulaire de la Direction Sanitaire en date du 3 Juin 1899 No. 2965.

Les voyageurs qui sont restés dans les points quaranténaires plus de sept jours doivent être autorisés à en sortir.

5° Les voyageurs venant des localités non contaminées de la Turquie par Varna, Dévé-Bair, Kotchérinovo et Tzaribrod, seront soumis à une visite médicale sévère et à l'observation pendant onze jours dans leur lieu d'arrêt ou de séjour.

6° Les voyageurs arrivant par voie de mer des ports ottomans de la Mer Noire non contaminés, ne seront admis que par Bourgas et Varna, après avoir été soumis à une visite médicale sévère et à la désinfection de leurs bagages.

7° Les quarantaines fonctionnent toujours comme hôpitaux; toutes les personnes qui y sont admises, seront nourries, conformément à l'arrêté du 29 Décembre, 1900, No. 693. La taxe par jour reste 2 fra.

8° Les sujets bulgares indigents seront admis gratis. En sortant de la quarantaine ils doivent prouver leur état d'indigence par des certificats délivrés par leurs communes; à défaut de quoi, la taxe sera perçue par la voie exécutive. Le personnel des points quaranténaires sera nourrie aux frais de l'état.

9° Les trains venant de Turquie doivent stopper devant la quarantaine de Hébibtchévo et après avoir déchargé les voyageurs et leurs bagages doivent retourner en Turquie.

10° Les wagons servant au transport des marchandises, non chargés, qui viennent d'Andrinople-Dédéagatch, seront admis en Bulgarie après avoir été soumis à une désinfection minutieuse pour le compte de leurs propriétaires. Ces wagons doivent toujours être accompagnés de certificats délivrés par les autorités sanitaires et constatant qu'ils arrivent de Dédéagatch-Andrinople et non pas de Constantinople.

11° Les trains de "l'Orient-Express" sont autorisés jusqu'à nouvel ordre à passer transit en Bulgarie. Ils seront accompagnés jusqu'à la frontière serbe d'un médecin qui y montera lors de l'arrêt à Hébibtchévo et veillera sur l'état sanitaire des voyageurs et du personnel dans le train.

12° Il est expressément défendu aux voyageurs et au personnel de "l'Orient-Express" de descendre du train durant son voyage en Bulgarie et de communiquer avec qui que ce soit dans les gares du pays. Toutefois, les personnes qui désireraient se rendre de la Principauté à l'étranger, peuvent monter dans ces trains.

13° Les water-closets des trains de "l'Orient-

Express" doivent être adaptés de façon à retenir les matières fécales qui ne seront jetées qu'après avoir été désinfectées.

14° Les effets du personnel qui a accompagné les trains et qui restera en Bulgarie, doivent être désinfectés à Tzaribrod.

15° Les voyageurs qui quittent la quarantaine monteront dans des trains neis à destination de l'intérieur de la Principauté.

16° Les voyageurs venant de Constantinople qui, pour se soustraire aux mesures quaranténaires à Hébibtchévo, passent transit en Serbie et de là retournent en Bulgarie, seront soumis à Tzaribrod aux mesures quaranténaires édictées dans le § 3 du présent arrêté.

17° Les navires arrivant de Constantinople ou d'autres localités contaminées seront admis en libre pratique après avoir été soumis à une quarantaine de onze jours et à une désinfection minutieuse. L'équipage de ces bateaux avec ses effets est soumis aux mêmes mesures. Les navires à patente nette qui viennent de localités non contaminées et passent les Dardanelles jusqu'à Cavak avec des gardiens sanitaires à bord et sans s'arrêter dans un des ports de Constantinople, seront admis en libre pratique après visite médicale sévère.

18. L'entrée de toutes marchandises venant de Constantinople est interdite en Bulgarie.

19. Les marchandises venant des localités non contaminées de la Turquie d'Europe seront admises en Bulgarie si elles n'ont pas été en contact avec des marchandises arrivant de Constantinople, ou d'autres pays contaminés. Toutefois, les mesures édictées dans le 1er § de la circulaire de la Direction Sanitaire en date du 5 Octobre 1899 No. 4213, ne seront pas appliquées aux marchandises sorties des ports ottomans—à l'exception de Constantinople et de l'île de Chios—après la date à laquelle ils ont été déclarés contaminés par l'arrêté du 23 Juin dernier No. 228.

20. Les marchandises de Constantinople destinées à l'Europe Occidentale seront admises à passer transit par le pays dans des wagons séparés qui seront désinfectés extérieurement et plombés à Hébibtchévo. Les plombs seront enlevés à Tzaribrod. Pour ces mêmes wagons, à leur retour en Bulgarie, on doit présenter des preuves qu'ils ont été désinfectés avant leur arrivée à Tzaribrod; sinon, ils ne seront admis qu'à passer transit après avoir été plombés à Tzaribrod. Le médecin quarantenaire de Hébibtchévo et le médecin de l'arrondissement de Tzaribrod sont tenus de prendre note de pareils wagons.

21. Les habitants de la frontière ayant des propriétés mixtes seront admis d'entrer en Bulgarie; mais on doit veiller à ce que des personnes venant de Constantinople ou d'autres localités contaminées ne pénètrent pas avec eux. Les médecins d'arrondissement, les infirmiers et les maires des communes compétents sont tenus de veiller sur l'état sanitaire de ces habitants, conformément aux instructions ad hoc données par la Direction Sanitaire.

22. Les maires des communes doivent avoir la liste exacte des habitants qui viennent de la Turquie en Bulgarie ou se rendent de la Bulgarie en Turquie pour cultiver leurs propriétés.

23. Messieurs les Préfets et les Sous-Préfets sont tenus de prêter aux autorités quaranténaires le concours et le personnel nécessaires.

24. La correspondance arrivant de la Turquie ne sera admise que par Hébibtchévo. Celle destinée pour l'intérieur du pays et les colis-postaux à destination de l'Europe, seront retenus dans la quarantaine de Hébibtchévo et après avoir

été désinfectés minutieusement seront réexpédiés par le train suivant. La correspondance internationale, après désinfection extérieure à Hébibtchévo, sera réexpédiée sans autre retard.

25. Les colis-postaux venant de localités contaminées et destinés pour la Bulgarie ne sont pas admis.

26. Toutes les dispositions antérieures en contradiction avec le présent arrêté sont abrogées.

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE PERTH MINT.

AMENDED NOTICE.

THE Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that at a Trial of the Pyx, begun at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, on the 17th June, and concluded on the 3rd July, 1901, in accordance with the provisions of the Orders in Council of the 29th June, 1871, and the 30th January, 1901, the following Verdict of the Pyx Jury was delivered to the King's Remembrancer, viz.:—

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE PERTH MINT.

VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the seventeenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the Assays and Trials of His Majesty's Gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint, at Perth, in the Colony of West Australia, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred, to the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and one, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins in each packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of such packets of Gold coins, amounting altogether to one hundred and fifty-five Sovereigns or Twenty-shilling pieces, and to six Half-Sovereigns or Ten-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891.

We found that the amount of variation from the Standard of Weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was minus one thousandth of an ounce (-001 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said Gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the Standard of Fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was plus three ten thousandths (or $+0003$), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said Gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue sixteen Sovereigns, and four Half-Sovereigns, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such Sovereigns weighed respectively, —the first 123·277 grains, the second, 123·107 grains, the third, 123·325 grains, the fourth, 123·270 grains, the fifth, 123·327 grains, the sixth, 123·277 grains, the seventh, 123·277 grains, the eighth, 123·227 grains, the ninth, 123·277 grains, the tenth, 123·272 grains, the eleventh 123·307 grains, the twelfth, 123·227 grains, the thirteenth, 123·277 grains, the fourteenth, 123·277 grains, the fifteenth, 123·270 grains, and the sixteenth, 123·270 grains, and that such Half-Sovereigns weighed respectively, —the first, 61·620 grains, the second, 61·640 grains, the third, 61·640 grains, and the fourth, 61·610 grains. We then assayed the said sixteen Sovereigns and four Half-Sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such Sovereigns to be, —the first, 916·90, the second, 916·96, the third, 916·80, the fourth, 916·90, the fifth, 916·86, the sixth, 916·86, the seventh, 916·90, the eighth, 916·86, the ninth, 916·90, the tenth, 917·06, the eleventh, 916·60, the twelfth, 916·76, the thirteenth, 916·66, the fourteenth, 916·86, the fifteenth, 916·90, and the sixteenth, 916·76 respectively, and the millesimal fineness of such Half-Sovereigns to be, the first, 916·60, the second, 916·70, the third, 916·70, and the fourth, 916·60, respectively.

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

THE following Draft Rules are published pursuant to the Rules Publication Act:—

DRAFT RULES for the amalgamation of the Taxing Departments of the Supreme Court with a view to uniformity in the taxation of costs.

General Rules pursuant to the Supreme Court of Judicature (Officers) Act, 1879, and the Judicature Acts, 1873 to 1899.

1. There shall be amalgamated with the Central Office the following Offices, namely:—

The Chancery Taxing Office.
The Bankruptcy Taxing Office.

The Taxing Department of the Office of the Masters in Lunacy.

The Taxing Department of the Office of the Registrar in Companies Winding-up.

2. There shall be transferred to the Central Office—

(a.) The existing Chancery Taxing Masters and the existing Bankruptcy Taxing Master with their respective clerks and messengers or the clerks and messengers employed in their respective offices.

(b.) The existing clerks in the Taxing Department of the Office of the Masters in Lunacy.

3. Clause 4 of the Scheme to Order 61, Rule 1, shall be read as if words "in the Queen's Bench Division except such costs as have heretofore been taxed in the Queen's Remembrancer's Office or the Crown Office," were omitted therefrom.

SUPREME COURT.

4. Order V, Rule 6, shall be read as if the word "except" were inserted therein in lieu of the word "including."

5. Order 54, Rule 9A, shall be read as if the words "of the same Division of the High Court" were omitted therefrom.

6. The following paragraph shall be added at the end of Order 65, Rule 2:—

And an order giving a party costs except so far as they have been occasioned or incurred by or relate to some particular issue or part of his proceedings shall be read and construed as excluding only the amount by which the costs have been increased by such issue or proceedings.

7. Order 65, Rule 18, is hereby annulled and the following Rule is substituted therefor:—

The Lord Chancellor may by order from time to time direct that the taxation of costs in any particular class of business to be specified in the Order shall be referred to one or more Taxing Masters or Taxing Officers to be named or described in such Order, but subject to any such direction the business of the Taxing Department of the Central Office of the Supreme Court shall be regulated and distributed by the Taxing Masters in such manner and order as the Taxing Masters may deem expedient. Provided that in any case where there shall have been any former taxation in the same cause or matter or in any summons under Order LV, Rules 3 or 4 relating to the same estate or trust, the taxation shall go to the Taxing Master before whom such former taxation took place.

7A. Order LXV, Rule 23, shall be read as if instead of the words "In interlocutory applications" the words "In any case" were inserted.

8. Regulation 17 of Order 65, Rule 27, is hereby annulled, and the following Regulation is substituted therefor:—

The costs of inspection of documents shall be in the discretion of the Taxing Master, but no allowance is to be made for any inspection unless it is shown to the satisfaction of the Taxing Master that there were good and sufficient reasons for making such inspection.

8A. The Taxing Officers of the Supreme Court or of any division thereof shall have power and authority to make one or more interim certificate or certificates, allocator or allocators in any taxation for any portion or portions of the taxed costs directed to be taxed, without waiting until a certificate for the full amount can be made.

9. Regulation 29 of Order LXV, Rule 27, is hereby annulled and the following Regulation is substituted therefor:—

On every taxation the Taxing Master shall allow all such costs, charges, and expenses as shall appear to him to have been necessary or proper for the

attainment of justice or for defending the rights of any party, but save as against the party who incurred the same no costs shall be allowed which appear to the Taxing Master to have been incurred through over caution, negligence or mistake or by payment of special fees to Counsel or special charges or expenses to witnesses, or other persons or by other unusual expenses, or by a preference for the services of particular persons in their profession or business.

10. The following paragraph shall be added at the end of Order 65, Rule 27, Regulation 37:—

But the Taxing Master shall have power to revise and regulate the practice in regard to taxation of costs, and the allowance of fees so as to assimilate the allowances for costs, and to secure uniformity upon all taxations so far as may be practicable and expedient.

11. Order LXV, Rule 27, Regulation 38A, is hereby annulled and the following Regulation is substituted therefor:—

If upon any taxation it shall appear that the costs have been increased by unnecessary delay or by improper, vexatious, prolix or unnecessary proceedings, or by other misconduct or negligence, or that from any other cause the amount of the costs is excessive having regard to the nature of the business transacted or the interests involved or the money or value of property to which the costs relate or to the other circumstances of the case the Taxing Master shall allow only such an amount of costs as may be reasonable and proper and may assess the same at a gross sum, and shall (if necessary) apportion the amount among the parties if more than one.

The provisions as to the review of taxations shall apply to allowances and certificates under this Rule.

12. Regulation 39 of Order 65, Rule 27, shall be read as if after the word "signed" the words "or such earlier time as may in any case be fixed by the Taxing Master" were inserted, and as if after the word "same" the following words were inserted, "The Taxing Master may if he shall think fit issue pending the consideration of such objections a certificate of taxation or allocatur for or on account of the remainder of the bill of costs and such further certificate or allocatur as may be necessary shall be issued by the Taxing Master after his decision upon such objections."

13. Clause No. 184 of Appendix N of the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1883, is hereby annulled.

14. Order 71, Rule 1, shall be read as if the words from "Taxing Officer," to "respectively" inclusive were omitted therefrom, and the words "Taxing Master or Taxing Officer refers to and includes the Masters of the Supreme Court for the time being acting as Taxing Masters of the Taxing Department of the Central Office of the Supreme Court or other person whose duty it is to tax costs in any Division or Department of the Supreme Court" were inserted and as if after the words "Central Office of the Supreme Court of Judicature" the words "The Taxing Department of the Central Office shall be known as the Supreme Court Taxing Office" were added.

Companies.

General Rules pursuant to the Companies (Winding-up) Act, 1890, and the Judicature Acts, 1873 to 1899.

1. Rule 30 of the Companies Winding-up Rules, 1890, shall be read as if the words "of the Chancery Division" were omitted therefrom.

2. Rule 28 of the Companies Winding-up Rules, 1892, shall be read as if the words "con-

sidered and allowed by the Registrar" were omitted therefrom, and the words "taxed or allowed by the Taxing Officer" were inserted.

3. Rule 2 of the Companies Winding-up Rules (August), 1892, shall be read as if the words "Chief Clerk or Taxing Master" were omitted therefrom, and the words "or Chancery Master and may if in any case he shall think it expedient, exercise the powers of a Taxing Officer" were inserted.

4. These Rules may be cited as The Companies Winding-up Rules, 1901, and shall come into operation on the day of 190 .

Bankruptcy.

General Rules pursuant to the Bankruptcy Act, 1883, and the Judicature Acts, 1873 to 1899.

1. Rules 104, 105, and 106 are hereby annulled and the following Rule is substituted therefor:—

The Masters of the Supreme Court for the time being acting as Taxing Masters of the Taxing Department of the Central Office of the Supreme Court shall be the Prescribed Officers for the taxation of all such Bills of Costs and charges, fees and disbursements in matters under the Act as heretofore have been taxed by the Bankruptcy Taxing Masters and all other taxable bills in other matters in which the High Court may exercise bankruptcy jurisdiction and such taxable bills as may be specially referred to them for taxation by any County Court and generally for the transaction of the business heretofore transacted by the Bankruptcy Taxing Masters, and the expression Bankruptcy Taxing Masters or Taxing Officer shall mean and include the said Masters of the Supreme Court.

2. This Rule shall come into operation on the day of 190 .

3. This Rule may be cited with the Bankruptcy Rules, 1886 to 1890, as Rule 104.

Lunacy.

General Rules pursuant to the Lunacy Act, 1890, and the Judicature Acts, 1873 to 1899.

1. Rule 110 of the Rules in Lunacy, 1892, is hereby annulled and the following Rule is substituted therefor:—

The Rules of the Supreme Court as to costs and as to fees and percentages upon the taxation of costs for the time being in force shall apply to the costs of proceedings under the Lunacy Acts, 1890 and 1891.

2. Rules 111, 115, and 149 of the said Rules are hereby annulled.

3. Rule 114 of the said Rules is hereby annulled, and the following Rule is substituted therefor:—

Costs of proceedings under the Lunacy Acts, 1890 and 1891, shall be taxed by the Masters of the Supreme Court, for the time being acting as Taxing Masters of the Taxing Department of the Central Office of the Supreme Court, or such Taxing Officer as the Lord Chancellor may from time to time appoint.
