FEES to be taken in respect of transactions under the Tithe Acts, 1836 to 1891, in accordance with the provisions of the Inclosure, &c., Expenses Act, 1868 (31 and 32 Vict., cap. 89).

REDEMPTIONS OF RENTCHARGE UNDER THE TITHE ACTS, 1836 TO 1891.

REDEMPTION of a Rentcharge where the apportionment and collection of the consideration money is undertaken by the Board of Agriculture:—

On the amount of consideration for each £1 or fractional part of £1:—

Where the rentcharge does not exceed—

4s. per acre ... 0 5 0

Where the rentcharge exceeds 4s. but does not exceed 5s. 6d. per acre ... 0 4 0

Where the rentcharge exceeds 5s. 6d. per acre ... 0 3 0

The amount of rentcharge and tithe acreage are, for the purposes of the above fees, to be taken from the apportionment in force.

Redemption of a rentcharge where the collection of the consideration money without apportionment is undertaken by the Board of Agriculture ... A fee equal to three times the amount of the rentcharge.

Redemption of a rentcharge where the consideration money is apportioned and collected by a surveyor or valuer appointed under the above Acts:—

Where the consideration money does not exceed £2 ... 0 5 0

Where the consideration money exceeds £2 and does not exceed £5 ... 0 10 0

Where the consideration money exceeds £5 and does not exceed £10 ... 1 0 0

Where the consideration money exceeds £10 and does not exceed £15 ... 1 10 0

Where the consideration money exceeds £15 and does not exceed £20 ... 2 0 0

For each additional £10 or fractional part of £10 to £50 ... 0 10 0

For each £10 or fractional part of £10 beyond £50 to £100 ... 0 7 6

For each £10 or fractional part of £10 beyond £100 ... 0 5 0

Order for redemption of a rentcharge in any other case:—

Where the consideration money does not exceed £2 ... 0 2 6

Where the consideration money exceeds £2 and does not exceed £5 ... 0 5 0

Where the consideration money exceeds £5 and does not exceed £10 ... 0 10 0

Where the consideration money exceeds £10 and does not exceed £15 ... 0 15 0

Where the consideration money £ s. d.
exceeds £15 and does not exceed £20 ... 1 0 0
For each additional £5 or fractional part of £5 to £100 ... 0 2 6
For each £20 or fractional part of £20 beyond £100 ... 0 2 6

The above fees are to be taken in respect of the business transacted by the Board on and after the sixteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and one.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 24TH AUGUST 1901.)

(SWINE FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Contraction of Limits of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

1. The limits of the Swine-Fever Infected Area declared by Order of the Board, dated the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and one, are hereby contracted so as to comprise only the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area so described is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-ninth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and one.
