Persons they have lately sent to Temeswaer and Beigrade, do not return very quickly with an account that the Succors are actually marching to their Relief, they will Capitulate. In the mean time, they write from Debrezin of the 30th past, that Major-General Coun. d'Aversberg would return in two or three days to the Blockade of Great Waradin, and take with him 400 Bombs to be employed against that place. The Elector of Bivaria is against that place. The Elector of Bavaria is expected here the beginning of the next Week. Prince Eugene of Savor, has since his arrival had feveral Conferences with the Ministers of this Court, about the Affairs of Savoy, and the necelfary disposition of things for the next Campagne. The Emperor has made the Count of Nostitz of his Council of State, who took the affual Oath, and was admitted into the same on Juesday last. The Jubilee that has been Published by the prefent Pope was begun here the 13th with the usual Procefficne.

Berne, Jan. 19 Monsieur Anulos the French Ambissador Employs all his Skill to remove the Jealousie which the Suis Cantons have of the Progresses of the French in Savoy. He assures them of his Mafters good intentions towards the City of Geneva, and that he will continue his Favour and Protection to it. That he has a great concern for the welfare of the whole Helvetique Body, and that his Successes shall always turn to their Advantage; That he is willing to enter into an Accommodation with the Duke of Savoy, for the securing the Peace of Italy, and to receive them as Mediators and Guarands of it. But the French are known to be so liberal of such fort of Professions, when they are of use to them in carrying on their D figns, that these which are now made by Monsieur Ameloe, carry little weight with them, and are confidered no otherwife than as an Attifice to divert the Cantons from taking fuch Measures as are necessary for their own Security, as well as for the benefit of the Common Interests of Christendom.

Hidelberg, Jan. 22. We continue very quiet in fe Parts. They write from Basle, that the Mathife Parts. gistrates of that City were going to Publish a General Aninestie, and that several of the Burghers, who happened there, would be discharged. The Advices from Suisserland say, That the Canton of Ziricke has fent 200 Men more to reinforce the Garison of Geneva. We are told, that the French are drawing Detachements out of their Garisons in Alface, which

are faid to be defigned for Flanders.
