(No. 5743.) Quarantine.

UNDER the power and authority vested in him by the "Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," His Excellency the High Commissioner directs that any vessel arriving from Constantinople, Scio, Smyrna, Salonica shall be subjected to five days' quarantine to be undergone at Larnaca, unless such vessel shall have performed five days' quarantine at an intermediate port and shall be provided with a clean bill of health, and further that any such vessel which has performed quarantine for less than five days at an intermediate port and although provided with a clean bill of health, shall not be admitted to free pratique, but must complete the five days at Larnaca. All arrivals from other Turkish ports will be subjected to medical inspection at port of arrival.

DERBY CORPORATION ACT, 1901.

SCHEME DETERMINING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE WARDS OF THE EXTENDED BOROUGH OF DERBY.

WHEREAS by Section 6 of a Statute passed in the first year of the reign of His Majesty King Edward VII, called the Derby Corporation Act, 1901, which said Act received the Royal Assent on the 17th day of August, 1901, the boundary of the then existing borough of Derby was extended in the manner therein specified: And whereas by the 21st section of the said Act it was further enacted that the said extended borough should be divided into sixteen wards, and that the names or distinguishing numbers and boundaries of such wards should be fixed and determined by a scheme to be made by a Commissioner to be for that purpose appointed by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, within one week after the passing of the said Act: And whereas the Right Honourable Charles Thomson Ritchie, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, in pursuance of the said Act, did on the 19th day of August, 1901, duly warrant and appoint me, Chester Jones, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be such Commissioner: And whereas, by the 24th section of the said Act, the Commissioner thus !-

appointed was further empowered by his scheme to apportion and assign all the existing Councillors among the said new wards: And whereas by the 27th section of the said Act it was enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, sub-sections 8 to 15 (both inclusive) of section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, should apply as if they were re-enacted in the said Derby Corporation Act, 1901: Now I, the said Chester-Jones, in pursuance of the powers given me under the said Acts aforesaid, and by virtue of the said appointment, do hereby determine that the boundaries of the said sixteen wards into which the said borough is divided and the names of the said wards shall be as follows, that is to say:—

Derwent Ward. I do hereby determine that Derwent Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough (" the said borough" means and hereinafter means the borough of Derby, as extended by the Derby Corporation Act, 1901) as is bounded by a line commencing at a point in the centre of the River Derwent beneath St. Mary's Bridge, thence continuing in a northerly direction along the centre of the said river to a point where the said line meets the borough boundary in the centre of the said river; thence in a northerly, north-easterly, south-easterly, southerly, easterly, south-easterly, south-westerly, north-westerly, and southerly-direction along the boundary of the said borough, to a point where the said boundary meets the centre of the said river; thence in a northwesterly direction along the centre of the said river to the point of commencement of the said line under St. Mary's Bridge aforesaid.

Bridge Ward. I do hereby determine that Bridge Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is bounded by a line commencing at the said point under St. Mary's Bridge mentioned in the description of Derwent Ward aforesaid; thence continuing in a northerly direction along the western boundary of Derwent Ward to a point in the centre of the said river where the borough boundary meets the centre of the said river; thence in a westerly, northerly, and generally westerly direction along the borough boundary to a point where the said boundary cuts the centre of Kedleston-road; thence proceeding in a southeasterly direction along the centre of Kedlestonroad to a point in the centre of the road at its junction with Duffield-road; thence in a southeasterly direction along the centre of the Duffieldroad and King-street to a point in the centre of the road at its junction with Queen-street; thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Queenstreet, Iron Gate, and Market Head to the point of its junction with Corn Market; thence in a northeasterly direction along the centre of the roadway forming the southern boundary of the Market Place and along the centre of Derwentstreet to a point in the centre of Exeter Bridge over the centre of the River Derwent; thence in a generally northerly direction along the centre of the River Derwent to the point of commencement of the said line under St. Mary's Bridge aforesaid.

King's Mead Ward.

I do hereby determine that King's Mead Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is bounded by a line commencing at a point at the junction of Market Head and Corn Market; thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the Corn Market to a point opposite the centre of St. James's-street; thence in a direction generally north-westerly along the centre of St. James's-street, the Wardwick, and Friar Gate; to a point

in the centre of Friar Gate opposite the centre of Brick-street; thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Brick-street, Nuns-street, and Kedleston-street, to a point in the centre of Duffield-road opposite the centre of Kedlestonstreet and in the boundary of Bridge Ward; thence in a direction generally southerly along the western boundary of Bridge Ward to the point of commencement of the said line.

Markeaton Ward.

I do hereby determine that Markeaton Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is bounded by a line commencing at a point in the centre of the roadway in Friar Gate opposite the centre of Brick-street; thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Ashbourne-road to the point where the borough boundary cuts the centre of the said road; thence in a northerly, south-easterly, north-easterly, and north-westerly direction along the boundary of the said borough to the point where the said boundary cuts the centre of Kedleston-road; thence in a south-easterly direction along the south-western boundary of Bridge Ward to its point of junction in Duffield-road with the boundary of King's Mead Ward in the centre of Duffield-road opposite Kedlestonstreet; thence in a south-westerly direction along the north-western boundary of King's Mead Ward to the point of commencement of the said line.

Friar Gate Ward.

I do hereby determine that Friar-gate Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is bounded by a line commencing at the said point in the centre of Friar-gate opposite the centre of Brick-street; thence proceeding in a northwesterly direction along the centre of Ashbourneroad being the south-western boundary of Markenton Ward to the point where the boundary of the said ward meets the borough boundary in the centre of Ashbourne-road; thence in a generally southerly and westerly direction along the said borough boundary to the point where the said boundary cuts the centre of the Great Northern Railway track from Burton to Derby; thence along the centre of the said railway track in a generally easterly direction to a point in the centre of Friar-gate immediately under the centre of the said railway; thence in a generally northwesterly direction along the centre of Friar-gate to the point of commencement of the said line.

Rowditch Ward. I do hereby determine that Rowditch Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is bounded by a line commencing at a point in the centre of the Great Northern Railway from Burton to Derby where the boundary of the said borough cuts the centre of the said railway; thence in a south-westerly and generally southerly direction along the borough boundary to a point in the centre of Uttoxeter-road; thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Uttoxeter-road to a point in the centre of the said road opposite the centre of Hoult-street; thence along the centre of Hoult-street to a point in the centre of the said street opposite the centre of Bedford-street; thence along the centre of Bedford-street to a point in the centre of the roadway opposite Arundel-street; thence along the centre of Arundel-street to a point in the centre of Amy-street; thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Amy-street to a point in the roadway opposite the centre of Parliament-street; thence along the centre of Parliament-street and Werburgh-street to a point in the roadway in the centre of Monk-street; thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Monk-street, Dunkirk and Kensington-street

to a point in the centre of Curzon-street, opposite Kensington-street; thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Curzon-street to a point in the roadway opposite the centre of Stafford-street; thence along the centre of Stafford-street to the boundary of King's Mead Ward in the centre of Friar-gate; thence along the boundary of King's Mead Ward in Friar-gate to a point in the centre of Friar-gate in the centre of the Great Northern Railway track from Burton to Derby; thence in a westerly direction along the centre of the said railway track to the point of commencement of the said line.

Becket Ward.

I do hereby determine that Becket Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is bounded by a line commencing at the said point in the centre of Friar-gate opposite Stafford-street in the boundary of King's Mead Ward; thence in a south-easterly direction along the boundary of King's Mead Ward to a point in the centre of the Corn Market opposite the centre of Saint James's-street; thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the Corn Market, Saint Peter's-street, and Osmaston-road to a point in the roadway opposite the centre of Sacheverelstreet; thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Sacheverel-street to a point in the Normanton - road opposite Sacheverel - street; thence in a northerly direction along the Normanton-road to its point of junction with Burtonroad; thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Burton-road to a point in Burtonroad opposite the centre of Abbey-street; thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Abbeystreet to a point in the roadway opposite the centre of Alma-street; thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Alma-street to a point in the centre of Monk-street and in the boundary of Rowditch Ward; thence along the eastern boundary of Rowditch Ward to the point of commencement of the said line in Friar-gate.

Abbey Ward. I do hereby determine that Abbey Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as is bounded by a line commencing at a point in the centre of Burton-road opposite the centre of Abbey-street; thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Burton-road to the point where the borough boundary cuts the centre of the said road; thence in a north-westerly direction along the said borough boundary to a point in the centre of Uttoxeter-road in the boundary of Rowditch Ward; thence in a north - easterly direction along the centre of Uttoxeter-road along the centre of Hoult-street, Bedford-street, Arundel-street, Amy-street, Parliament-street, Werburgh-street, and Monk-street, being the boundary of Rowditch Ward, to a point in Monk-street opposite the centre of Alma-street; thence along the centre of Alma-street and in a southerly direction along the centre of Abbey-street to the point of commencement of the said line in Burton-road.

THE Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Halifax, acting by the Council of the said borough, do hereby, in pursuance of the Tramways Act, 1870, publish the following Bye-laws and Regulations made by the said Council on the 4th day of September, 1901, which Bye-laws and Regulations will come into force on the thirteenth day of November, 1901.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Halifax, as the Local Authority, under section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870 :--

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any carriage using any tramway laid down within the said borough, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car.

2. The driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven at an average speed of not less than four miles, and not exceeding eight miles an hour.

3. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a

less distance than forty yards.

4. Subject to the requirements of Bye-law No. 8, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers at any place appointed as a tram station by the Corporation, when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made.

5. The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

6. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause

interruption to the ordinary read traffic.

7. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

8. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the

thirteenth day of November, 1901.

Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Halifax, as the Promoters and Owners of the Halifax Tramways, under the powers conferred on the Corporation by the Tramways Act, 1870.

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Corporation, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Byelaws or Regulations.

Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise.

3. No passenger shall spit in or on any carriage,

or smoke inside any carriage.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while

travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform

upon any musical instrument.

- 5. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.
- 6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger, and any offender shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in the interior of any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carriage, upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand; pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Corporation the fare legally demandable for the journey and accept a ticket corresponding thereto, or if the carriage is provided with a money box for the receipt of fares, each passenger shall immediately on entering the carriage, or when required, deposit in the money box the fare legally payable for the journey.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do, to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such

passenger.

11. A passenger not being an artizan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Corporation, shall not use, or attempt to use, any ticket intended only for such artizans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

12. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artizans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof

of any carriage.

13. No passenger shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand on the roof, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

14. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage

whilst in motion.

15. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

16. No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Corporation with loaded fire-arms.

17. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or mpede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Corporation.

18. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws

and Regulations to the best of his ability.

19. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

20. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Corporation and having charge of a carriage.

21. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

22. These Bye-laws shall come into force on

the thirteenth day of November, 1901.
