

and Trade Marks (Amendment) Act 1885" it is amongst other things provided.—

That if His Majesty is pleased to make any arrangement with the Government or Governments of any Foreign State or States for mutual protection of inventions, designs and trade marks, or any of them, then any person who has applied for protection for any invention design or trade mark in any such State shall, subject to the conditions further provided and set forth in the said Act, be entitled to a patent for his invention, or to registration of his design or trade mark (as the case may be) under the said Act, in priority to other applicants, and such patent or registration shall have the same date as the date of the application in such Foreign State:

And whereas it pleased Her late Majesty Queen Victoria to make an arrangement with the Republic of Honduras of the nature contemplated by the said Act by and in virtue of a Treaty of friendship commerce and navigation signed and sealed by Her late Majesty's Minister Resident and Consul-General to the Republic of Honduras and sealed by the Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of the said Republic at Guatemala in the Republic of Guatemala on the twenty-first day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven ratifications whereof together with two explanatory protocols dated respectively the twenty-first day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven and third day of February one thousand nine hundred were duly exchanged at Guatemala aforesaid on the third day of February, one thousand nine hundred:

And whereas it is provided by Article VIII of the said Treaty that the subjects or citizens of each of the contracting parties shall have in the dominions and possessions of the other the same rights as natives or as subjects or citizens of the most-favoured-nation in regard to patents for inventions trade marks and designs and the protection of industrial property upon the fulfilment of the formalities prescribed by law:

Now therefore His Majesty by and with the advice and consent of His Privy Council and by virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said Act, doth declare and it is hereby declared that from and after the date of this Order the provisions of the said Act amended as aforesaid and hereinbefore specified shall apply to the following country, viz.:—

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the twenty-fifth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and one, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Article two thousand one hundred and seventy-three, paragraph six, of the Regulations for the Government of Your Majesty's Naval Service, money allowances at the rate of one

shilling or two shillings a week, according to circumstances, may be paid from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to naval pensioners admitted into hospitals or infirmaries, and whereas we deem it expedient to extend the payment of the allowance to men who may not be naval pensioners,

"We beg leave to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize the payment of the allowance at the minimum rate of one shilling a week to non-pensioners—to take effect from the twelfth day of November one thousand nine hundred."

And whereas the provisions of section one of "The Rules Publication Act, 1893," have been complied with.

His Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the five hundred and eighty-second and five hundred and eighty-third sections of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," it is enacted that a Pilotage Authority may, by Bye-law made under Part X of that Act, do all or any of the things specified in the said five hundred and eighty-second section; but that a bye-law so made shall not take effect until it is submitted to His Majesty in Council and confirmed by Order in Council:

And whereas the Corporation of the Guild or Brotherhood of Masters and Pilots Seamen of the Trinity House in Kingston-upon-Hull, being a Pilotage authority within the meaning of the said Act, have in exercise of the powers vested in them by that Act, made certain bye-laws fixing the rates to be demanded and received for Pilotage between the Ports of Hull and Goole, and for reducing the Commission formerly payable to the Pilot Master at Goole for collection of Pilotage, keeping the accounts, and general management:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the said bye-laws should be confirmed for a limited period:

And whereas the immediate operation of this Order is urgent:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and by and with the advice of His Privy Council is pleased to approve of and doth by this Order confirm the said bye-laws as set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed, and to declare that they shall be in force until the second day of September, one thousand nine hundred and four, and be *provisional* within the meaning of "The Rules Publication Act, 1893."
