*Cape Sèpet—Intended New Light; Exhibition of Temporary Light.*

THE French Government has given notice, dated 11th September, 1901, that towards the end of the present year, the light, white with red flashes, now shown from the lighthouse on Rascas Point, Cape Sèpet, will be discontinued and replaced by a white group flashing light, showing three flashes in succession every fifteen seconds, thus:—flash, one second; eclipse, two and a half seconds; flash, one second; eclipse, two and a half seconds; flash, one second; eclipse, seven seconds, and visible from a distance of 20 miles.

The new light will be dioptric and have a power of 10,000 candles.

During the progress of the necessary work for installing the new light, the present light will be discontinued and temporarily replaced by a red fixed light, visible 4 miles, shown from the upper platform of the lighthouse.

Further notice will be given of the date on which the present light will be discontinued and the temporary light exhibited.
