Council Chamber, Whitehall, September 30, 1901. CORONATION OF THEIR MAJESTIES.

THE Right Honourable the Commissioners appointed by His Majesty to hear and determine all Claims of Services to be performed at the time of the ensuing Coronation (except those dispensed with by His Majesty's Royal Proclamation of the 26th day of June last), and of fees to be received for the same, at their last meeting held at the Council Office, Whitehall, on the 17th day of July last, resolved as follows:-

1. All Claims must be made by Petition. Petitions may be sent under cover to the Clerks of the Court of Claims, Privy Council Office,

Whitehall.

2. Petitioners are not required to appear in person before the Court, unless summoned.

Petitioners may appear by Solicitors, Agents, or Counsel.

4. If a Claim was admitted in 1838, the Court will forthwith admit such Claim, provided the Commissioners are satisfied that the present Petitioner represents the person whose Claim was admitted in 1838, and that there is no counter-claim.

5. Petitioners to be requested to present their Claims on or before the 31st day of October,

The Court stood adjourned till some day in the month of November next, of which notice will be

given in the London Gazette.

The Commissioners are required by the Proclamation to exclude from their consideration such claims as may be submitted to them in respect of rights or services connected with the parts of the Ceremonial heretofore performed in Westminster Hall and with the Procession, the Ceremony being confined to Westminster Abbey.

HE Earl Marshal's Order concerning the Robes, Coronets, &c., which are to be worn by the Peers at the Coronation of Their Most Sacred Majesties King Edward the Seventh and Queen Alexandra.

These are to give notice to all Peers who attend at the Coronation of Their Majesties, that the robe or mantle of the Peers be of crimson velvet, edged with miniver, the cape furred with miniver pure, and powdered with bars or rows of ermine i.e., narrow pieces of black fur), according to their degree, viz.:-

Barons, two rows.

Viscounts, two rows and a half.

Earls, three rows.

Marquesses, three rows and a half.

Dukes, four rows.

The said mantles or robes to be worn over full Court dress, uniform, or regimentals.

The coronets to be of silver gilt; the caps of crimson velvet turned up with ermine, with a gold tassel on the top; and no jewels or precious stones are to be set or used in the coronets, or counterfeit pearls instead of silver balls.

The coronet of a Baron to have, on the circle

or rim, six silver balls at equal distances.

The coronet of a Viscount to have, on the circle, sixteen silver balls.

The coronet of an Earl to have, on the circle, eight silver balls, raised upon points, with gold

strawberry leaves between the points.

The coronet of a Marquess to have, on the circle, four gold strawberry leaves and four silver balls alternately, the latter a little raised on points above the rim.

The coronet of a Duke to have, on the circle, eight gold strawberry leaves.

THE Earl Marshal's Order concerning the Robes, Coronets, &c., which are to be worn by the Peeresses at the Coronation of Their Most Sacred Majesties King Edward the Seventh and Queen Alexandra.

These are to give notice to all Peeresses who attend at the Coronation of Their Majesties, that the robes or mantles appertaining to their respective ranks are to be worn over the usual full Court

That the robe or mantle of a Baroness be of crimson velvet, the cape whereof to be furred with miniver pure, and powdered with two bars or rows of ermine (i.e., narrow pieces of black fur); the said mantle to be edged round with miniver pure two inches in breadth, and the train to be three feet on the ground; the coronet to be according to her degree, viz.:-a rim or circle with six pearls (represented by silver balls) upon the same, not raised upon points.

That the robe or mantle of a Viscountess be like that of a Baroness, only the cape powdered with two rows and a half of ermine, the edging of the mantle two inches as before, and the train a yard and a quarter; the coronet to be according to her degree, viz.: - a rim or circle with pearls (represented by silver balls) thereon, sixteen in

number, and not raised upon points.

That the robe or mantle of a Countess be as before, only the cape powdered, with three rows of ermine, the edging three inches in breadth, and the train a yard and a half; the coronet to be composed of eight pearls (represented by silver balls) raised upon points or rays, with small strawberry leaves between, above the rim.

That the robe or mantle of a Marchioness be as before, only the cape powdered with three rows and a half of ermine, the edging four inches in breadth, the train a yard and three quarters; the coronet to be composed of four strawberry leaves and four pearls (represented by silver balls) rai-ed upon points of the same height as the leaves, alternately, above the rim.

That the robe or mantle of a Duchess be as before, only the cape powdered with four rows of ermine, the edging five inches broad, the train two yards; the coronet to be composed of eight strawberry leaves, all of equal height, above the

And that the caps of all the said coronets be of crimson velvet, turned up with ermine, with a tassel of gold on the top.

Note.—Only those Peers and Peeresses who reply to the above intimation before the first day of January, 1902, will receive the Royal Command to attend the Ceremony of the Coronation.

It is to be understood that the above Orders refer to all English, Scottish, and Irish Peers (except Peers who are minors, and Irish Peers who have seats in the House of Commons), Peeresses in their own right, the widows of Peers, and the wives of living Peers, including the wives of Irish Peers who have seats in the House of Commons.

With respect to such widows of Peers who have remarried under the rank of the Peerage, they, according to former precedent, are considered as

not entitled to such summons.

As to widows of Peers who have remarried with a Peer of lower degree, their precedence, according to precedent, is that of their last husband.

Peers and Peeresses in their own right whose highest dignity is in the Peerage of Scotland or Ireland will wear robes and coronet of such dignity, as also the wife or widow of such Peer.

THE King has been graciously pleased to signify His intention to confer the decoration of the Victoria Cross on the undermentioned Non-Commissioned Officer and Soldiers whose claims have been submitted for His Majesty's approval, for their conspicuous bravery in South Africa, as stated against their names :-

Regiment.	Name.	Act of Courage for which recommended.
2nd Battalion Liverpool Regiment  18th Hussars	Sergeant H. Hampton  Private H. G. Crandon	On the 21st August, 1900, at Van Wyk's Vlei, Sergeant Hampton, who was in command of a small party of Mounted Infantry, held an important position for some time against heavy odds, and when compelled to retire saw all his men into safety, and then, although he had himself been wounded in the head, supported Lance-Corporal Walsh, who was unable to walk, until the latter was again hit and apparently killed, Sergeant Hampton himself being again wounded a short time after.  On the 4th July, 1901, at Springbok Laagte, Privates Berry and Crandon were scouting towards a kopje when the Boers suddenly opened fire on them at a range of 100 yards. Private Berry's horse fell and became disabled, and he was himself shot in the right hand and left shoulder. Private Crandon at once rode back under a heavy fire to his assistance, gave up his horse to the wounded man to enable him to reach shelter, and followed
2nd Battalion Highland Light Infantry	Private C. Kennedy	him on foot, having to run for 1,100 yards, all the time under fire.  At Dewetsdorp on the 22nd November, 1900, Private Kennedy carried a comrade, who was dangerously wounded and bleeding to death, from Gibraltar Hill to the Hospital, a distance of three-quarters of a mile, under a very hot fire.  On the following day, volunteers having been called for to take a message to the Commandant across a space over which it was almost certain death to venture, Private Kennedy at once stepped forward. He did not, however, succeed in delivering the message as he was severely
2nd Battalion Rifle Brigade	Private E. Durrant	wounded before he had gone 20 yards.  At Bergendal, on the 27th August, 1900, Acting-Corporal Wellar having been wounded, and being somewhat dazed, got up from his prone position in the firing line, exposing himself still more to the enemy's fire, and commenced to run towards them. Private Durrant rose, and pulling him down endeavoured to keep him quiet, but finding this impossible he took him up and carried him back for 200 yards under a heavy fire to shelter, returning immediately to his place in the line.

and Royal Marine Board, to all the Imperial and Royal Officers and Subordinate Port and Sanitary Offices and Officers:-

With reference to the certified cases of plague at Naples, the Imperial and Royal Ministry of the Interior in conjunction with the Imperial and Royal Hungarian Ministries, have, by Telegraphic Despatch of October 1 of this year, No. 48561, decreed as follows:

All vessels arriving from the above-mentioned port will have to undergo a rigorous medical inspection, from the result of which will depend the further sanitary treatment of the vessel.

Should any case of illness or other unfavourable hygienic conditions be discovered - for instance, should any passenger be suspected from a sanitary point of view-the medical inspection on board will have to be repeated.

A declaration containing a list of the passengers, together with the name of their next port of destination, will have to be handed to the competent authorities.

The other regulations of the Sanitary Convention of Venice, contained in the Government Circular of June 17th, 1897, No. 5684, will have to be stringently carried out.

On the arrival of a vessel from the port of Naples the report of the result of the medical inspection will have immediately to be submitted to the undersigned, with a view to the prescription of any other further sanitary measures.

In consequence of telegraphic instructions received from the Imperial and Royal Ministry for Commerce, dated October 4 of this year, No. 3661/H.M., the Marine Board (at Trieste) have decreed, with reference to the cases of plague verified at Smyrna, that vessels arriving from the above-mentioned port must be treated in the same manner as those arriving from Constantinople, that is to say, in accordance with the procedure detailed in Government Circular of October 4, 1901, No. 12651.

Translation of Circular No. 12789 of the Imperial and Royal Marine Board, to all the Imperial and Royal Offices and Officers and Subordinate Port and Sanitary Offices and Officers:

Cases of plague having been verified at Naples, and for the purpose of preventing the introduction of contagious diseases, the Imperial and Royal Ministries of the Interior, of Commerce, and of Finance, in conjunction with the Hungarian Government, have extended to the territory and port of Naples by Ministerial Decree of October 2nd, 1901 (B.L.I., No. 154), the Prohibitional Decree of August 3rd, 1901 (No. 118), regarding the importation and transit of certain specified goods and articles emanating from Constantinople.

The present order comes into force on the day of its reception by the Custom House and Marine

Sanitary Offices respectively.

The above publication is made with reference to the Government Circular of August 5th, 1901, No. 10076, with the following addition: The above-mentioned goods, as well as in general those that would be considered of a suspicious character from a sanitary point of view, and which are being imported into Austria-Hungary during the time the present decree is in force, will be sent to the nearest lazaretto at the expense of the owners, and there be destroyed or subjected to disinfection as the case may require. allowance will be made for damage to goods. The owners of the goods will be liable to the

expenses incurred, and no compensation claims will be entertained.

Quarantine. - No. 5756.

Under the power and authority vested in him by the "Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," His Excellency the High Commissioner directs that any vessel arriving from Constantinople, Scio, Smyrna, or Salonica shall be subjected to 48 hours' quarantine to be undergone at Larnaca, unless such vessel shall have performed 48 hours' quarantine at an intermediate port and shall be provided with a clean bill of health, and further that any such vessel which has performed quarantine for less than 48 hours at an intermediate port and although provided with a clean bill of health, shall not be admitted to free pratique, but must complete the 48 hours at Larnaca. All arrivals from other Turkish ports will be subjected to medical inspection at port of arrival.

Quarantine Regulation.—No. 5775.

With reference to the Quarantine Regulation of the 10th July, 1901, published in the Official Gazette, No. 704, of the 19th July, 1901, whereby the importation, amongst other things, of used sacks of Egyptian origin (not being gypsum sacks) was prohibited, His Excellency is pleased to direct that the importation of empty barley sacks of Egyptian origin will be permitted at the Port of Larnaca provided that the same are submitted to disinfection by the Quarantine Authorities.

A fee after the following rate will be charged for the disinfection of such sacks
