Rio Grande Do Sul and Mostardas Lighthouses — Position of.

WITH reference to Notices to Mariners Nos. 727 of 1899 and 648 of 1900:—

Information, dated 1st June, 1901, has been received from Commander H. D. Laxton, His Majesty's ship "Nymphæ," that from good astronomical observations he has ascertained that Rio Grande do Sul Lighthouse is in lat. 32° 7' 25" S., long. 52° 4' 33" W.

The position of Mostardas Lighthouse was reported in 1900 by Her Majesty's ship "Swallow" to be approximately in lat. 31° 16' S., long. 50° 54' W., or about 7 miles further to the eastward than charted.

These two positions have been accepted, and the coast line on the Chart adjusted to agree with them.

A new edition of Chart No 2522 will be issued.
