The German Government has given further notice, dated 5th October, 1901, that as the wreck of H.L.G.M.S. "Wacht," sunk in a d.p.h. of 24 fathoms, to the north-eastward of Cape Arkona is no longer dangerous, the raft carrying a red flag and the buoys marking the position have been withdrawn.

Brentons Grund—Particulars of.

THE Russian Government has given notice, dated 27th August, 1901, of the existence of a rocky shoal, named Brentons Grund, about 1½ cables in extent, with a least depth of 2½ fathoms over it, situated with Hellmans Light bearing S. 72° E., distant 4 miles; it is marked on its western side by a black and white spar buoy with an upturned broom under a down-turned broom as a topmark moored in a depth of 9 fathoms.

No. 789.—WEST INDIES.

Jamaica—Bank Reported North-Eastward of.

INFORMATION, dated 10th October, 1901, has been received from the West India and Panama Telegraph Company that Captain Boreham, of that Company's steamship "Grappler," reports the existence of a bank of live coral about 1 mile in extent, on which a sounding of 18 fathoms was obtained, about 25 miles north-eastward from North-east End, Jamaica, in latitude 18° 23' 25" N., longitude 76° 0' 25" W. As the bottom was clearly seen in calm weather, it is possible there may be less water over this bank.

Another sounding of 33 fathoms, coral bottom, was obtained about 1 mile south-eastward of the above.

Registration of Births and Deaths.

NOTICE is hereby given, that in pursuance of the provisions of the twenty-first section of an Act passed in the thirty-eighth year of the reign of Her late Majesty, intituled "The Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874," I, Reginald MacLeod, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, have, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, ordered and declared that on and after the 1st day of November next, in order that the Sub-Districts of Wincanton Registration District may again be made co-extensive with the three Relief Districts of Wincanton Poor Law Union, as recently altered :—
