THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 30th ultimo, from His Majesty's Representative at Petropolis, intimating that in consequence of several cases of bubonic pest having occurred in the town of Rio the city has been declared infected, and the port of Rio suspected. Quarantine has also been established against Naples, and all Italian ports have been declared suspect.
