A PROCLAMATION.

EDWARD, R.I.

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to enable His Most Gracious Majesty to make an Addition to the Royal Style and Titles in recognition of His Majesty's Dominions beyond the Seas," which Act enacts that it shall be lawful for Us, with a view to such recognition as aforesaid of Our Dominions beyond the seas, by Our Royal Proclamation under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom issued within six months after the passing of the said Act, to make such addition to the Style and Titles at present appertaining to the Imperial Crown of the United Kingdom and its Dependencies as to Us may seem fit: And whereas Our present Style and Titles are, in the Latin tongue, "Edwardus VII Dei Gratia Britanniarum Rex, Fidei Defensor, Indiæ Imperator," and in the English tongue, "Edward VII, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India." We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to appoint and declare, and We do hereby, by and with the said advice, appoint and declare that henceforth, so far as conveniently may be, on all occasions and in all instruments wherein Our Style and Titles are used, the following addition shall be made to the Style and Titles at present appertaining to the Imperial Crown of the United Kingdom and its Dependencies; that is to say, in the Latin tongue, after the word "Britanniarum," these words, "et terrarum transmarinarum quæ in ditione sunt Britannicâ"; and in the English tongue, after the words "of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland," these words, "and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas."

And Our will and pleasure further is, that all gold, silver, and bronze moneys, now current and lawful moneys of the United Kingdom, and all gold, silver, and bronze moneys which shall, on or after this day, be coined by Our Authority with the like impressions, shall, notwithstanding such addition to Our Style and Titles, be deemed and taken to be current and lawful moneys of the said United Kingdom; and further, that all moneys coined for and issued in any of the Dependencies of the said United Kingdom, and declared by Our Proclamation to be current and lawful money of such Dependencies, respectively

bearing Our Style or Titles, or any part or parts thereof, and all moneys which shall hereafter be coined and issued according to such Proclamation, shall, notwithstanding such addition, continue to be lawful and current money of such Dependencies respectively, until Our pleasure shall be further declared thereupon.

Given at Our Court at *Saint James's*, this fourth day of *November*, one thousand nine hundred and one, in the first year of Our Reign.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is expedient to define the duties of the principal Officers who may hereafter from time to time under the Secretary of State for War be charged with the administration of the departments of the Army;

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that subject to such regulations as may be made by the Secretary of State for War, the Officers hereinafter named shall be charged with the duties herein assigned to them.

I.—DUTIES OF THE COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF.

The Commander-in-Chief shall exercise general command over His Majesty's Military Forces at home and abroad, shall issue "Army Orders" and hold periodical inspections of the troops.

He shall be the principal adviser of the Secretary of State on all military questions, and shall be charged with the control of the departments of the Adjutant-General, Director-General of Mobilization and Military Intelligence, and Military Secretary, and the general supervision of the other military departments of the War Office.

He shall be charged with the general distribution of the Army at home and abroad, and with the selection and proposal to the Secretary of State for War of fit and proper persons to be recommended for commissions in the Regular Forces and of fit and proper Officers, whether of the Regular or Auxiliary Forces, for promotion, for staff and other military appointments, and for military honours and rewards.

In the absence of the Commander-in-Chief the Senior Officer of the Headquarter Staff shall act for him.

(a.) *The Adjutant-General's Department.*

The Adjutant-General shall be charged, under the control of the Commander-in-Chief, with the discipline, military education, and training of the Officers, Warrant Officers, non-commissioned officers and men of the Regular and Reserve Forces, Militia, and Yeomanry of the United Kingdom, and of the Volunteer Force of the United Kingdom when subject to military law or when

assembled for training, exercise, inspection, or voluntary military duty;

With matters relating to the general efficiency of the Army, and the effective strength of its units;

With the allocation of the troops to their respective duties;

With patterns of clothing and necessaries, and with the maintenance of returns and statistics connected with the personnel of the Army;

With enlisting men for and discharging men from the Regular and Auxiliary Forces;

With annually submitting proposals to the Commander-in-Chief for the establishments for all the above services.

(b.) *The Department of the Director-General of Mobilization and Military Intelligence.*

The Director-General of Mobilization and Military Intelligence shall, under the control of the Commander-in-Chief, be charged with the preparation and maintenance of detailed plans for the Military Defence of the Empire and for the organization and mobilization of the Regular and Auxiliary Forces;

With the preparation and maintenance of schemes of offensive and defensive operations; the collection and distribution of information relating to the military geography, resources, and armed forces of foreign countries, and of the British Colonies and possessions.

(c.) *The Military Secretary's Department.*

The Military Secretary shall, under the control of the Commander-in-Chief, deal with appointments, promotions, and retirements of Officers of the Regular and Auxiliary Forces, the educational qualifications required from candidates for commissions in the Army, and is charged with the administration of the educational establishments.

II.—THE QUARTERMASTER-GENERAL'S DEPARTMENT.

The Quartermaster-General, under the supervision of the Commander-in-Chief, shall be charged with supplying the Army with food, forage, fuel, and light, and quarters, with land and water transport, conveyance of stores, and provision of remounts; with the movement of troops, and with the distribution of their barrack stores and equipment; with administering the Army Service Corps, the Pay Department, the Veterinary Department, and the establishments employed on the above Services. He shall submit proposals for the Annual Estimates for the above Services, and shall advise the Secretary of State on all questions connected with the duties of his department. He shall make such inspections as may be necessary to secure the efficiency of the Services under his control.

III.—DEPARTMENT OF THE INSPECTOR-GENERAL OF FORTIFICATIONS.

The Inspector-General of Fortifications shall under the supervision of the Commander-in-Chief, be charged with the selection of sites for barracks, ranges and manœuvring grounds, with the construction and maintenance of fortifications, barracks, and store buildings, and the inspection of Ordnance Factory buildings and Engineer stores; with military railways and telegraphs and Engineer stores; with the purchase of land and the custody of War Office lands and unoccupied buildings; with advising as to the design and issue of Royal Engineer and submarine mining stores. He shall submit proposals for the Annual Estimates for Engineer Services, including Engineer stores, and shall advise as to the general distribution of the Corps of Royal Engineers, and

as to the appointment of Officers to, or their removal from, responsible positions in connection with works. He shall advise on all questions relating to the technical instruction of the Corps of Royal Engineers, and shall make such inspections as may be necessary to test the professional training of the Officers and men of the Corps, and to secure the efficiency of the Services under his control. He shall advise the Secretary of State on questions connected with the duties of his department.

IV.—DEPARTMENT OF THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL OF ORDNANCE.

The Director-General of Ordnance shall, under the supervision of the Commander-in-Chief, be charged with supplying the Army with warlike stores, except Engineer stores, equipment, and clothing; with the direction of the Ordnance Committee and Manufacturing Departments of the Army; with dealing with questions of armament, of patterns of inventions and designs, and with the inspection of all stores, except Engineer, Medical, and Veterinary stores, whether supplied by the Manufacturing Departments or by contractors. He shall administer the Army Ordnance Department and Army Ordnance Corps, and shall make such inspections as may be necessary to secure the efficiency of the Service under his control. He shall submit proposals for the Annual Estimates for the above Services, and shall advise the Secretary of State on questions connected with the duties of his departments.

V.—DEPARTMENT OF THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL, ARMY MEDICAL DEPARTMENT.

The Director-General, Army Medical Department, shall, under the supervision of the Commander-in-Chief, be charged with the administration of the Medical Establishments of the Army and of the Royal Army Medical Corps, with dealing with sanitary questions relating to the Army, with the preparation of medical and sanitary statistical returns, and with the supply of medical stores to the Army. He shall advise the Secretary of State as to the general distribution of the Royal Army Medical Corps, as to the appointment of Officers to, or their removal from, responsible positions therein, and on all other matters connected with his department. He shall make such inspections as may be necessary to ensure the efficiency of the Services under his control, and shall submit proposals for the Annual Estimates for the Medical Services.

VI.—THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S DEPARTMENT.

The Financial Secretary shall be charged—

With financially reviewing the expenditure proposed to be provided in the Annual Estimates for Army Services, and with compiling those Estimates for submission to Parliament;

With financially reviewing any proposals for new expenditure, or for any proposed redistribution of the sums allotted to the different sub-heads of the votes for Army Services;

With seeing that accounts of all expenditure of cash and stores are correctly and punctually rendered; with auditing and allowing all such expenditure, and recording the same under its proper head of Service in the annual account for Parliament; with issuing all warrants for the payment of moneys; with making all imprests to accountants and others;

With the financial control of the Manufacturing Departments of the Army, and with controlling and recording all contracts for Army Services;

And with advising the Secretary of State on all questions of Army expenditure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is further pleased to direct that the Order in Council of the seventh March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, defining the duties of the Principal Officers under the Secretary of State for War charged with the administration of the Departments of the Army, be revoked.

And the Right Honourable St. John Brodrick, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the eleventh section of the Volunteer Act, 1863, it is, amongst other things, enacted that "Her Majesty in Council may, from time to time, declare what is requisite to entitle a Volunteer to be deemed an efficient Volunteer by an Order in Council defining for that purpose the extent of attendance at drill to be given by the Volunteer, and the course of instruction to be gone through by him, and the degree of proficiency in drill and instruction to be attained by him and his corps, such proficiency to be judged of by the Inspecting Officer at the annual inspection of the corps, or otherwise, as by Order in Council is from time to time directed"; and that "the draft of any scheme to be from time to time submitted to Her Majesty in Council for approval under the present section shall have been laid before both Houses of Parliament for one lunar month at least, either before or after, or partly before and partly after, the passing of this Act during the present or for the like period during any subsequent Session of Parliament, before such scheme receives the approval of Her Majesty in Council":

And whereas it is deemed expedient that a fresh Order in Council be substituted for the Order in Council bearing date the thirty-first day of July one thousand eight hundred and eighty, as amended by the Orders in Council bearing date fourteen h April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, fifteenth September one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, twenty-eighth May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, thirtieth June one thousand eight hundred and ninety, twenty-first October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, twenty-eighth June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, thirtieth April one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, seventh August one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, fourteenth August one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, twentieth October one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and fourteenth July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, declaring what is requisite to entitle a Volunteer to be deemed an efficient Volunteer.

And whereas a draft of the said new Order in Council was on the nineteenth day of July last laid before both Houses of Parliament in the words mentioned and set forth in the schedule to this Order annexed, and, one lunar month having elapsed since that time, the said amendment of the said scheme hath this day been submitted to His Majesty in Council for His approval thereof.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, having this day taken the said amendment into consideration, doth, in pursuance and exercise of the power in His Majesty by the said Act of Parliament in that behalf vested, and by and with the advice of His

Privy Council, hereby direct the substitution of the said draft scheme of amendment forming the schedule to this Order annexed, for the aforesaid Order in Council of the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, as amended by the Orders in Council bearing date the fourteenth April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, fifteenth September one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, twenty-eighth May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, thirtieth June one thousand eight hundred and ninety, twenty-first October one thousand eight hundred and ninety, twenty-eighth June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, thirtieth April one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, seventh August one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, fourteenth August one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, twentieth October one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and fourteenth July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and doth declare His Royal approval of the amendment, and of the cancellation of the aforesaid Order in Council of the thirty-first day of July one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and of the amendments thereto, except the conditions of efficiency for submarine miners and electrical engineers, laid down in the Order in Council of twentieth October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight. *A. W. FitzRoy.*

SCHEDULE referred to in the foregoing Order.

To substitute the accompanying "Scheme relative to and Certificates of Efficiency" for the corresponding Scheme and Certificates now in force:—

1. A Volunteer who is a member of a corps on the 1st November in any year shall be entitled to be deemed an efficient Volunteer during the ensuing twelve months if, subject to the conditions hereinafter prescribed, he has during the preceding year fulfilled the requirements stated in the schedule hereto.

2. In the course of each year ending the thirty-first October, the Adjutant of each corps shall select such Volunteers as in his opinion have fulfilled the requirements and possess the qualifications aforesaid, and submit their names to the Commanding Officer of their Corps, with a view to their being returned as efficient.

3. If the Adjutant refuses to return any Volunteer as efficient, and the Volunteer considers himself aggrieved thereby, the Volunteer may appeal to the Commanding Officer of his corps.

4. If the Commanding Officer differs from the opinion of the Adjutant, he shall refer the matter to the Officer appointed by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State to act in that behalf, whose decision shall be final.

5. Where the situation and circumstances of an Artillery Volunteer or Rifle Volunteer Corps in any particular year are such, as in the opinion of one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, to create serious obstacles to the fulfilment by any of the Volunteers belonging to that corps of the requirement of attendance at gun or musketry practice, the Secretary of State shall have power to dispense with the requirement from any of the Volunteers belonging to such corps in such year.

6. Where the situation and circumstances of a Rifle Volunteer Corps are such as, in the opinion of one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, to create serious obstacles to the fulfilment

by the Volunteers belonging to the corps of the requirement of attendance at battalion parade such number of times within twelve months as may be prescribed, the Secretary of State shall have power to reduce for such corps the number of battalion parades, and to increase proportionately the number of company parades requisite to entitle the Volunteers belonging to the corps to be returned as efficient.

7. Where any corps shall have been precluded by an epidemic from complying with the requirements herein prescribed, or shall in the first year of its service have encountered exceptional difficulties in the completion of its organization and efficiency of its members, it shall be competent to the Secretary of State to modify, so far as applies to such year of service, the stipulated conditions of efficiency of any members of such corps.

8. No Volunteer who is absent from the annual inspection of his corps, except in case of sickness duly certified, or by leave granted in writing for special cause by the Commanding Officer, shall be entitled to be deemed efficient.

9. Where a corps is by its own default not inspected during the year, or where the officer inspecting a Volunteer Corps at the annual inspection in any year reports that the corps is not efficient in training and instruction to his satisfaction, or that irregularities have occurred in its training and administration, then, notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State shall have power to direct that none of the Volunteers belonging to the corps shall be deemed efficient.

10. No corps or individual Volunteer will be exempted from attending a camp for two consecutive years.

11. The Inspecting Officer at the annual inspection in any year shall have power to direct that a Volunteer shall be deemed non-efficient if he considers it proper to do so, on account of the want of efficiency in training or instruction of that Volunteer, or on account of his rifle or other arm being in bad order and condition.

12. In case any alteration in the conditions for efficiency should from time to time appear expedient, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State may make the same by regulation, so as no alteration be thereby made in the amount of the requirements and qualifications, and so as none of the provisions of this Order be thereby altered.

13. Terms used in this Order, or in the schedule hereto, have the same meanings as they have when used in the Volunteer Act, 1863.

The term "recruit" used in the schedule means a Volunteer who has never served either for two months in the Royal Navy, Regular Army, Army Reserve, Royal Marines, or Royal Irish Constabulary, nor has attended the preliminary drill, or drill on enlistment, or annual training of a Militia unit, nor has performed one year's efficient service in the Imperial Yeomanry, the Volunteers, or the permanent forces of a colony, nor in the year immediately preceding his enrolment has attended as a member of a cadet corps or cadet battalion, sanctioned by the Secretary of State, the number of drills prescribed for recruits of the arm of the service which he has joined.

14. The provisions herein contained shall take effect from the first November, one thousand nine hundred and one.
