THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 14th October, from His Majesty's Representative at Rio de Janeiro, inti-

imating that by Decree, dated September 30, the period for rigorous quarantine in the ports of the Republic has been reduced to ten days, instead of twenty formerly imposed.

It is also intimated that all vessels leaving Rio for other Brazilian ports are required to remain to the quarantine station at Ilha Grande for disinfection, and those carrying passengers must have a medical officer on board. At port-of-entry they are at once granted free pratique when the sanitary conditions on board are satisfactory.

Passengers and crews are submitted to medical inspection before leaving the port of Rio.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 2nd instant, from His Majesty's Representative at Sofia, stating that, by an Order of the Bulgarian Minister of the Interior, the town of Naples has been declared free from plague.

By the same Order the town of Batoum is declared to be infected with plague from the 29th of October, and arrivals from Batoum are to be subjected to certain measures of quarantine.
