

In Parliament—Session 1902.

West Gloucestershire Water.

(Extension of Limits of Supply; Rates and Charges; Purchase of Lands; Additional Capital; Application of Funds; other Powers; Amendment or Repeal of Acts.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the West Gloucestershire Water Company (hereinafter called "the Company") for leave to bring in a Bill for all, or some of the following, among other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the limits within which the Company may supply water and exercise the powers conferred upon them by the West Gloucestershire Water Act, 1884, the West Gloucestershire Water Act, 1887, and the West Gloucestershire Water Act, 1899, and within which those Acts shall be in full force, and have effect so as to include within such limits the parishes and places following, or some of them, or some part or parts thereof respectively (that is to say):— Acton Turville, Alderley, Great Badminton, Tormarton and Didmarton, all in the county of Gloucester, and to enable the Company within and throughout such extended limits to have and exercise all the powers, rights, privileges, and authorities, conferred upon them by the said Acts, and which may be conferred upon them by the intended Act, whether with reference to the supply of water, the levying and recovery of rates and charges for and in relation to such supply, or otherwise howsoever.

2. To authorise the Company to levy rates, rents, and charges, differential or otherwise, to alter existing rates, rents, and charges, and to confer exemptions from the payment of rates, rents, and charges.

3. To authorise the Company to purchase and acquire lands, waters, and other hereditaments and property, and also easements, rights, and privileges in, over, or affecting lands, waters, and property, for the purposes of their undertaking, and to sell, let, or otherwise dispose of any lands, hereditaments, or property belonging to them, and

not required for the purposes of their undertaking.

4. To authorise the Company to raise further moneys for the purposes of the Bill, and for the general purposes of their undertaking by the creation and issue of new shares or stock, with or without a preference priority or guarantee in payment of interest or dividend, or other rights or privileges attached thereto, and by borrowing on mortgage or bond, and by the creation and issue of debenture stock, or by any of those means, and to apply to any of the purposes of the Bill any moneys now belonging to the Company, or which they have power to raise.

5. To confer upon the Company all powers, rights, authorities and privileges which are, or may become, necessary for carrying the powers of the Bill into execution; to vary or extinguish all rights and privileges inconsistent with, or which would in any manner impede or interfere with the carrying into complete effect any of the objects and purposes of the Bill, and to confer other rights and privileges.

6. To incorporate with the Bill (with such variations, modifications, and exceptions as may be deemed expedient) all or some of the provisions of the Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, the Companies Clauses Act, 1863, the Companies Clauses Act, 1869, the Lands Clauses Acts, and the Waterworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1863.

7. To alter, extend, amend, enlarge, or to repeal the provisions or some of the provisions of the West Gloucestershire Water Acts, 1884 to 1899, and all other Acts and Orders (if any) which may in any way relate to, or be affected by, the Bill.

And notice is hereby further given, that on or before the 21st day of December next, printed copies of the Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.
