Peste à Odessa (Russie).

Le Ministre de l'Agriculture,

Vu l'arrêté royal du 5 Avril, 1897, relatif à la peste;

Vu l'existence de la peste officiellement constatée à Odessa;

Considérant qu'il y a lieu dès lors, de confirmer les mesures provisoires prises à l'égard d'Odessa dès le 16 Novembre.

Arrête:

ART. 1er. Les dispositions qui font l'objet des Articles 1er à 4 de l'arrêté royal du 5 Avril, 1897, susvisé sont rendues applicables, à partir du 4 courant aux provenances d'Odessa, contaminé par la peste bubonique.

ART. 2. Ces provenances, arrivant par mer, seront soumises à la station sanitaire de l'Escart et dans les ports d'Ostende et de Nieupoort, ainsi qu'à Selzaete, au régime stipulé par les chapitres II, III, et IV, du règlement sanitaire général annexé à la Convention sanitaire internationale de Venise, en date du 14 Mars, 1847.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated November 19, from His Majesty's Representative at Sofia, enclosing the following Order of the Bulgarian Minister of the Interior:—

"Le Ministre de l'Intérieur vu la décision du Conseil Sanitaire Supérieur en date de ce jour, arrête les mesures quaranténaires suivantes:—

1. Les bateaux provenant des ports contaminés russes de la Mer Noire, arrivant par le Danube, ne seront admis en libre pratique dans les ports bulgares du Danube qu'après avoir subi la quarantaine établie à Souliua et après une sévère visite médicale à Silistria.

2. Les voyageurs arrivant en Bulgarie, par la voie du Danube, seront soumis à une visite dans le port de Silistria ceux d'entre eux qui arrivent des ports contaminés russes ne seront admis librement dans la Principauté qu'après avoir produit un certificat constatant qu'ils ont purgé la quarantaine à Souliua et que leurs effets et bagages y ont subi la désinfection.

3. Les marchandises provenant des ports contaminés russes de la Mer Noire ne seront admises dans les ports bulgares du Danube que si elles ont subi la quarantaine établie à Souliua et qu'elles sont, par ce fait admises à l'introduction en Roumanie."
