**T**HE King has been graciously pleased to signify His intention to confer the decoration of the Victoria Cross on the undermentioned Soldier, whose claims have been submitted for His Majesty's approval, for his conspicuous bravery in South Africa, as stated against his name:—

Regiment.	Name.	Act of Courage for which recommended.
1st Battalion Derbyshire Regiment	Private W. Bees ...	Private Bees was one of the Maxim-gun detachment, which at Moedwil, on the 30th September, 1901, had six men hit out of nine. Hearing his wounded comrades asking for water, he went forward, under a heavy fire, to a spruit held by Boers about 500 yards ahead of the gun, and brought back a kettle full of water. In going and returning he had to pass within 100 yards of some rocks also held by Boers, and the kettle which he was carrying was hit by several bullets.

Bye-law as to Towing Barges by Steam Tugs, &c.

**W**HEREAS the Lee Conservancy Board, in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by the "Lee Conservancy Acts, 1868 and 1900," made a Bye-law as to towing barges by steam tugs, &c., and pursuant to section 124 of the first named Act (a copy of which is given below) did publish such Bye-law and gave all persons an opportunity of making objections thereto, and took the same into consideration, and whereas the said Bye-law was duly amended and altered. And notice is hereby given, that pursuant to sub-section 4 of the said section 24, the Board will in due course submit the same for the allowance of His Majesty in Council in the form as under, namely:—

"Not more than three barges shall be towed at any one time by one steam or electric tug or other mechanical power on the River Lee Navigation between the Tail of Tottenham Lock, and not more than one abreast; and in any part of the River Lee Navigation above Tottenham Lock not more than two barges shall be so towed at any one time, and then only one abreast; the speed to be that only as prescribed by Bye-law X of the 'Lee Conservancy Bye-laws,' dated the 5th April, 1871. The 'Master,' or any person for the time being having the command, charge, or care of any such steam or electric tug or other mechanical power shall be liable for the infringement of any of the foregoing regulations, the penalty for the breach of which is five pounds."
