

London; as also the *Smirna Merchant*, Capt. Price Commander, for *Bristol*. Their Majesties Ship the *Swift*, sent in here on Sunday last a French Prize laden with Wine.

*Barnstable*, Feb. 1. The Earl of *Portland's* Regiment of Horse, which arrived the last Week from *Ireland*, are still here and at *Biddiford*; They intended to march yesterday towards *Salisbury*, but were hindered by the abundance of Snow that has fallen.

*Exeter*, Feb. 7. There have fallen in these Parts great quantities of Snow since Wednesday last, which by a strong Wind is so driven into heaps in some places, and has made the Ways so unpassable, that the Mail from *Plimouth* is not yet arrived here, and divers Travellers are missing and feared to be lost in the Snow. The Baron *de Bomgardem*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of *Bavaria*, went hence yesterday Morning towards *Plimouth*, to Embark there for *Spain*, but could get no farther than *Ashburton*. Several Hundred Men are at Work to clear the Roads, there not having been known so deep a Snow in the Memory of Man.

*Corves*, Feb. 3. This day was brought in here by two Privateers, a Flyboat of about 400 Tuns, bound with Masts, Pitch and Tar from *Gottenburg* to *France*.

*Harwich*, Feb. 6. On Thursday last, the *Spanish-Princess* Pacquet-Boat, who sailed from hence the Sunday before with the Fridays Mail, returned into this Port, having put the said Mail on Shoar at *Gorze*; but by reason of the abundance of Ice, and the Winds changing and blowing very hard, she could not lye on that Coast, till the Messenger that was sent to the *Brill* could return with the *Holland* Mail.

*Whitehall*, Feb. 8. His Majesty was this day graciously Pleas'd to confer the Honour of Knighthood on Captain *John Goldsborough*, who is going for the *East-Indies*, in the Quality of the Companies Committary-General.
