69th Battery Royal Field Artillery	Driver F. G. Bradley	During the action at Itala, Zululand, on the 26th September, 1901, Major Chapman called for volunteers to carry ammunition up the hill; to do this a space of about 150 yards swept by a heavy cross fire had to be crossed. Driver Lancashire and Gunner Bull at once came forward and started, but half-way across Driver Lancashire fellwounded. Driver Bradley and Gunner Rabb without amoment's hesitation ran out and caught Driver Lancashire up, and Gunner Rabb carried him under cover, the groundbeing swept by bullets the whole time. Driver Bradley then, with the aid of Gunner Boddy, succeeded in gettingthe ammunition up the hill.

### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 24TH DECEMBER 1901.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. From and after the commencement of this Order it shall not be lawful to hold any market fair sale or exhibition of cattle sheep or swine within the district mentioned in the Schedule hereto, in or on any highway or thoroughfare or in or on any market, fair-ground, saleyard, or place of exhibition, unless the premises are so paved as to permit of the same being thoroughly cleansed with water.

2. If a market fair sale or exhibition of cattle sheep or swine is held within the said district in contravention of this Order, the person or company holding the same, and the occupier of the place or premises where the market or fair or

sale or exhibition is held, and the owner or consignee of each head of cattle and of each sheep or pig exposed thereat, and the person exposing the same thereat, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting the sale or exhibition, and the person, if any, taking entrance-money or other payment for admission thereto, and the purchaser thereat of any cattle sheep or swine, such lastmentioned person or such purchaser knowing the market or fair or sale or exhibition to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and two.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901: Prescribing Form of Requisition for copy Certificate of Birth:

To all Superintendent Registrars, and Registrars of Births and Deaths in England and Wales:

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by section 134 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, it is enacted as

"Where the age of any young person under the age of sixteen years or child is required to " be ascertained or proved for the purposes of this "Act, or for any purpose connected with the "employment in labour or elementary education " of the young person or child, any person shall " on presenting a written requisition in such form " and containing such particulars as may be from "time to time prescribed by the Local Govern-"ment Board, and on payment of a fee of six-"pence, be entitled to obtain a certified copy "under the hand of a registrar or superintendent "registrar of the entry in the register, under the "Births and Deaths Registration Acts, 1836 to "1874, of the birth of that young person or child; "and such form of requisition shall, on request, "be supplied without charge by every superia-"tendent registrar and registrar of births, deaths, "and marriages."

Now therefore, we. the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as

follows:

ART. I. The requisition to be made to entitle any person to obtain a certified copy of an entry

of a registry of birth under the section above cited shall be in the Form set forth in the Schedule to this Order.

ART. II. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and two.
