Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to inquire into the extent and available resources of the coal fields of the United Kingdom; the rate of exhaustion which may be anticipated, having regard to possible economies in use, by the substitution of other fuel or the adoption of other kinds of power: the effect of our exports of coal on the home supply, and the time for which that supply, especially of the more valuable kinds of coal, will probably be available to British consumers, including the Royal Navy, at a cost which would not be detrimental to the general welfare: the possibility of a reduction in that cost, by cheaper transport, or by the avoidance of unnecessary waste in working through the adoption of better methods and improved appliances, or through a change in the customary term and provisions of mineral leases: and whether the mining industry of this country, under existing conditions, is maintaining its competitive power with the coal fields of other countries.

Naw know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these presents authorize and appoint, you the said William Lawies Jackson, Sir George John Armytage, Sir William Thomas Lewis, Sir Lindsay Wood, Thomas Bell, William Brace, Arthur Currer Briggs, Harold Baily Dixon, James Stedman Dixon, Clement Le Neve Foster, Edward Hull, Charles Lapworth, Joseph Paton Maclay, Arthur Sopwith, Jethro Justinian Harris Teall, and Ralph Young to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said inquiry.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these presents give and grant unto you, or any five or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers, and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do, by these presents, authorize and empower you, or any five or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid, and to employ such persons as you may think fit to assist you in conducting any inquiry which you

may hold.

And We do further by these presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you Our said Commissioners, or any five or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any five or more of you, have linerty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hand, and seals, or under the hands and seals of any five or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

And for the purpose of aiding you in your inquiries, We hereby appoint Our trusty and well-beloved William Russell, Esquire, Barristerat-Law, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Berks) Order, 1901.

Dated 27th December, 1901.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896. and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Berks, I hereby make the following Order:-

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Berks) Order, 1901."

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The provisions of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County of Berks to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the

Schedule to the Act:—
Bearded Titmouse, Harrier, Hobby, Honey Buzzard, Kite, Merlin.

All Birds protected during the whole of the Year within a certain Area.

III. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited within the area known as Abingdon Common, and lands adjoining, the boundary of which area commences at a point on the main road leading from Abingdon towards Marcham about 180 yards from the boundary of the borough of Abingdon, and runs thence along the said main road in a westerly direction as far as the stream which runs under the said road at the north-western corner of an enclosure known as Knight's Ham, thence in a southerly direction along the said stream to the river Ock, thence along the northern bank of the river Ock to the south-western corner of the meadows adjoining the Ock Mill, and thence in a straight line to the said first-mentioned point on the said road.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout

the County of Berks:—

Bearded Titmouse, Bittern, Buzzard. Honey
Buzzard, Goldfinch, Harrier, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kite, Merlin, Nightjar, Oriole, Owl (all species), Woodpecker.

All Birds Protected on Sundays in certain Districts.

V. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited in such parts of the county of Berks as lie within the districts of the several undermentioned Urban and Rural District Councils: - Urban District Councils-Abingdon, Newbury, Wallingford, Wokingham; Rural District Councils-Cookham, Easthampstead, Hungerford, Newbury, Wallingford, Wokingham.

Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour Department), London, December 28, 1901. THE Board of Trade have received the following Notices (Nos. 311 and 312) relating to Quarantine issued by the Governor of Malta:— Government Notice (No. 311).

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Council of Health, has been pleased to repeal Government Notice No. 307 of the 11th December, 1901, and to direct that the following Regulations be observed as regards vessels and passengers, viz. :-

Infected Places. 1. The following countries are, for purposes of quarantine, to be treated as infected:

(a.) Arabia (excepting Perim and Aden).

(b.) China.

(c.) Egypt (except Port Said and Suez).

(d.) India.

2. And the following ports:-

(a.) Ports in the Persian Gulf.(b.) Ports in the Sea of Marmora and the Bosphorus.

(c.) Smyrna.

(d.) Batoum.

Infected Vessels.

3. Infected vessels are vessels which have, or have had, on board during the voyage or the preceding 20 days, cases of cholera, yellow fever, plague, or any disease with symptoms which, in the opinion of the Chief Government, Medical Officer, resemble the symptoms of the said diseases.

Vesse's which are not allowed to enter the Harbour, but are allowed to communicate wi h Quarantine Establishment.

Infected vessels.

5. Vessels with pilgrims from the East, when not carrying a recognized Medical Officer.

6. Vessels from infected places, when not carrying a recognized Medical Officer.

Vessels allowed to load in Quarantine.

8. Infected vessels when carrying a recognized Medical Officer, and not having on board an actual case of the diseases mentioned in paragraph 3.

9. Vessels from infected places not having on board an actual case of the diseases mentioned in paragraph 3 when arriving within 10 days from departure.

10. Vessels with pilgrims from the East when carrying a recognized Medical Officer.

Vessels from Infected Places admitted to Pratique.

11. Vessels without a clean bill of health, or from infected places, will be admitted to pratique after 10 days from date of departure.

Medical Inspection. 12. All vessels and passengers on arrival are subject to medical inspection.

Passengers.

13. Passengers before landing must declare on oath before a Marine Police Officer that they have not been in, or have not communicated with, an infected place within 10 days. Otherwise they shall remain in quarantine to complete 10 days from departure.

14. Passengers arriving on vessels without a clean bill of health shall complete 10 days' quar-

antine from departure.

15. Passengers arriving from infected places more than 10 days after departure are allowed to land in free pratique after strict medical inspection and thorough disinfection of their persons, effects, and luggage, if the Inspecting Medical Officer is satisfied that they are in good health.

16. Passengers not otherwise provided for are subject to the restrictions applicable to the vessels

on which they arrive.

17. When 20 days have elapsed from the last case of plague, cholera, or other disease, against which restrictions have been in force with regard to a country or place declared to be an infected place, a notice will be issued by the Collector of Customs to the effect that the place or port is no longer to be dealt with as infected.

N.B.—Vessels that carry a doctor and pass through the Suez Canal without taking on board either cargo or passengers will not be considered infected by contact with canal pilots taken on board from a disinfecting station, or by coaling and provisioning at Port Said under restrictions approved by the Chief Government Medical Officer. Government Notice (No. 312).

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Council of Health, has been pleased to repeal Government Notice No. 307 of the 11th December, 1901, and to direct that the following Regulations be observed as regards goods:-

1. The importation is prohibited of

(a.) Coffee, in beans or ground, coloured with substances injurious to health;

(b.) Rags;
(c.) Susceptible goods which do not admit of being disinfected arriving on board infected vessels, vessels without a clean bill of health or vessels from infected places;

(d.) Hides from any port subject to quarantine, or from any place in which cattle disease exists;

(e.) Vines, vine shoots, and fruit packed in vine leaves ;

(f.) Hoofs and hair, raw silk, wool and human

7. Vessels arriving at Malta without a clean hair, skins raw, fresh or untanned, when such articles arrive from infected ports;

(g.) Cotton seed arriving from countries in

which anthrax is epidemic.

2. The importation is prohibited unless the goods be accompanied by a satisfactory certificate from the British Consular Authority that Phylloxera is not known to exist in the place of origin

Plants or roots from any port in the Mediterranean

3. The importation is allowed, after disinfect

(a.) Wearing apparel, soiled linen, and clothing, articles of bedding, feathers, bones, and jute goods, whatever be the port whence such articles may Lave arrived.

(b.) Used sacks, carpets, and embroideries which have been used when such articles arrived

from infected ports.

(c.) Goods which admit of being disinfected or are not susceptible to infection, arriving on infected vessels, vessels without a clean bill of health, or vessels from infected places.

4. Cereals imported from infected ports are to be kept for 21 days at the lazaretto or any other place to be appointed by the Collector of Customs, to be aired under the direction of the Quarantine

Authorities.

5. Infected vessels are vessels which have or have had on board during the voyage or the preceding 20 days, cases of cholera, yellow fever, plague, or any disease with symptoms which, in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer, resemble the symptoms of the said disease.

6. For the purposes of this notice the words "infected places" mean those countries or ports which are by Government Notice published in the Government Gazette from time to time declared to be infected. By command,

Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour Department), London, December 28, 1901.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Telegram, dated December 24, from His Majesty's Representative at Constantinople:-" Quarantine on arrivals from Egypt reduced to four days."

Bye-Laws as to Tramways.

OTICE is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Liverpool, being the promoters of the Tramways in the City of Liverpool, and in the Urban District of Litherland, and also the lessees of the Tramways in the Borough of Bootle, at a meeting of the Council of the said city, held on the 4th day of December, 1901, did pursuant to the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, make the following Bye-Laws:

Repeal of Former Bye-Laws and Regulations.

1. From and after the date of these Bye-Laws coming into force, all Bye-Laws and Regulations heretofore made by the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens with respect to the Tramways within the said City shall be repealed, but any proceedings pending at the time of such repeal may be continued and prosecuted as if such repeal had not taken effect.

Interpretation.

2. Throughout these Bye-Laws the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Liverpool, and shall include any lessees or persons, for the time being working the Tramway System hereinafter referred to; the expression "the Town Clerk" means the Town Clerk of the City of Liverpool; the word "Tramways" means the Tramway System worked by the Corporation, whether situate in the City of Liverpool, the Borough of Bootle or the Litherland District; the word "Car" means any carriage or car run by the "Car" means any carriage or car run by the Corporation upon the Tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the word "Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of a Car; and the word "Driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a Car.

Penalty. 3. Any person infringing any of the following Bye-Laws shall be liable to a penalty of not penalty, for every day during which such offence | continues.

Offensive Language or Conduct.

- 4. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any Car, or spit or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any Car or Tramway Station, or premises used in connection with the Tramway system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. No person shall play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any Car. Objectionable Persons.
- 5. Any person who is in a state of intoxication, or who from that or any other cause is in the opinion of the Conductor, unfit to be a passenger on a Car, shall not be allowed to board or enter upon any Car, and if any such person be found in or upon any Car, he or she shall be requested by the Conductor to leave the Car, failing which it shall be lawful for the Conductor or any other officer or servant of the Corporation to remove such person from the Car.
- Dogs. 6. No person shall take a Dog or other animal into any Car after baving been requested not to do so by the Conductor or other authorised officer of the Corporation. Any Dog or other animal taken into or found on any Car shall be removed by the person in charge thereof from the Tramway Car immediately upon request by the Conductor.

Damaging Cars.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or on any Car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise, wilfully damage any Car. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-Laws, for the amount of any damage so done.

Smoking.
8. No person shall smoke or carry lighted pipes, cigars, or cigarettes inside any car except in a compartment specially set apart for the purpose.

Payment of Fares.

9. Each passenger shall before leaving the Car, pay to the Conductor the fare legally payable for his or her journey and obtain a ticket therefor. Any person leaving a Car shall be deemed to have completed his or her journey.

No child under five years of age who is sitting on the lap of a passenger shall be liable to pay a fare, provided that this provision shall apply only to one such child accompanying any one passenger; any additional child, irrespective of age, accompanying such passenger shall pay the full ordinary fare.

Tickets.

10. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his Ticket to any officer or servant of the Corporation, and shall also when required so to do, either deliver up his Ticket or pay the fare for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Tickets shall not be transferable and shall only be available by the Car on which they are

issued.

· Interference with the Duties of the Conductor or Driver.

11. No person other than the Conductor or Driver shall change or remove the route indica- | person so to do.

tors or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a Car or its equipment, or signal a car to start.

Luggage.

12. No luggage or parcels of any description unaccompanied by a passenger shall be conveyed upon any Car by any Driver or Conductor.

Entering Full Cars.

13. When any Car contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to carry, no additional person shall enter, board, or remain in or upon any such Car. The Conductor shall not permit any person beyond the licensed number of passengers to enter, board, or remain in or upon any part of a Car. All such persons shall leave the Car immediately upon the request of the Conductor.

Disabled Cars.

14. If at any time a Car becomes disabled, or in any way injured, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the Conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid. No person shall, except with the leave of the Conductor, enter a disabled or injured

The Corporation shall not be bound to complete any journey in any specific time.

Cars Proceeding to Sheds.

15. No person shall travel upon a car which is proceeding to a shed and is not on its usual route unless permitted so to do by the Conductor, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare payable on such route.

Travelling on Steps, &c.

16. No person not being an officer or servant of the Corporation, shall travel or ride on the Steps, Platforms, Outside Rails, Buffers or Guards of any Car, and no person, not being an officer or servant of the Corporation, shall stand either on the platforms or on the outside or in the interior of any Car, except in accordance with the regulations of the Corporation exhibited upon such Car.

No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or board a Car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a Car.

Firearms.

17. No person shall travel in or on any Car with Firearms, or dangerous articles or things, provided that nothing contained in this Bye-Law shall apply to persons in the Naval, Military Reserve, or Auxiliary Forces carrying unloaded Firearms.

Entering and Leaving Cars.

18. Every person shall enter or depart from a Car by the step of the hindermost or Conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the Conductor.

All persons desiring to alight from any Car shall do so before any person boards the Car for the purpose of travelling thereon, and all persons desiring to board the Car shall permit such persons to alight as afcresaid.

Entering a Car when in Motion.

19. No person shall enter, board or leave, or attempt to enter, board or leave any Car whilst in motion.

Persons Suffering from Disease not to Travel on Cars.

20. No person afflicted with any infectious or contagious disease shall board, enter or travel on any Car, or attempt so to do. And no Driver or Conductor shall suffer or permit any such

Power to Remove Passengers Committing Offence.

21. Any person who shall commit, whilst on any Car, any legal offence, or any breach of these Bye-Laws, shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the Car, and if such person shall have paid his fare, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid.

Conductors and Drivers to Enforce Bye-Laws. 22. Every Conductor and Driver shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-Laws and Regulations, and prevent the breach thereof; and if any such Conductor or Driver fails to enforce the same as aforesaid, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.
