MILITARY TRAMWAYS ACT, 1887.

CHATHAM MILITARY TRAMWAY.

PROVISIONAL ORDER made by the Board of Trade under the Military Tramways Act, 1887, authorizing one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State to construct and maintain a Tramway in the Parish of Gillingham in the County of Kent.

Preliminary.

1. This Order may be cited as the Chatham Military Tramways Order, 1901.

2.—(1) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purposes of this Order.

(2) In accordance with section thirty-one of the Interpretation Act, 1889, expressions used in this Order have, unless the contrary intention appears, the same respective meanings as in the Military Tramways Act, 1887.

(3) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

The expression "the Principal Act" means the Military Tramways Act, 1887.

The expressions "the deposited plan" and "the deposited section" mean respectively the plan and section deposited in respect of this Order with the Board of Trade and signed by an Assistant Secretary of the Board.

(4) In the construction of the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, which are incorporated with this Order—

(a) In accordance with section twelve of the principal Act the expressions "tramway duly authorized" and "tramway" shall mean the tramway authorized by this Order, and the expression "promoters" shall mean the Secretary of State; and

(b) The expression "road" shall have the same meaning as in the principal Act.

Tramway and Works.

3.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Order His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department (in this Order referred to as the Secretary of State) may construct and maintain in the line and according to the levels shown on the deposited plan, and the deposited section, and with all works necessary or suitable to the use or working thereof the following tramway or any part of it, namely:—

A tramway at or near Chatham from the Royal Engineers Field Park, running along the west and south-west borders of the Great Lines to a point near Darland Hill.

(2) Subject to the provisions of this Order, the Secretary of State may construct and maintain the tramway on land belonging to him, and also construct and maintain it across the roads or ways marked 1 A, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 6 A, 7, 8 and 9, and A, B, B 1, C, D, E upon the deposited plan.

(3) The Secretary of State may, subject to the provisions of this Order, deviate in making the tramway from the line and levels shown on the deposited plan and section, either laterally or vertically—

(a) where the tramway crosses any road being a carriage way to such extent as the Board of Trade approve, but if the deviation exceeds fifty feet laterally or five feet vertically, the consent of the road authority shall also be necessary; and

(b) where the tramway crosses any road or way marked upon the plan not being a carriage way to such extent as the Board of Trade approve; and

(c) in any other case to such extent within land belonging to the Secretary of State, as the Secretary of State thinks fit.

4.—(1) The tramway shall be carried over the roads and ways mentioned in the first column of the first part of the Schedule to this Order by means of bridges of a single span of not less than that set opposite to the number of the bridge in the second column of that part of that Schedule, and having a clear headway above the surface of the road or way for the space of not less than the span over the road or way of not less than that set opposite to the number of the bridge in the third column of that part of that Schedule.

(2) The roads and ways mentioned in the first column of the second part of the Schedule to this Order shall be carried over the tramway by means of bridges of such width between the fences thereof as the Secretary of State thinks fit not less than the width set opposite to the number of the road or way in the second column of that part of that Schedule.

(3) The tramway shall be carried across the road marked 9 on the plan by means of a level crossing.

(4) Such provision shall be made for the convenient crossing of the tramway by foot passengers using the roads or ways marked A to E on the plan as the Board of Trade direct.

5. The tramway shall be on such gauge as the Secretary of State, with the approval of the Board of Trade, determines, and may be laid with single or double line as the Secretary of State thinks fit, subject to the approval of the Board of Trade as to any part of the tramway which is laid upon a road.

6.—(1) The carriages used on the tramway may be moved by animal power, or with the consent of the Board of Trade, by steam power, electrical power, or any mechanical power, and the power so authorized shall accordingly be the power prescribed by the Provisional Order within the meaning of section six of the principal Act.

(2) The consent of the Board of Trade, under this section, to the use of any power, may be given for such period and subject to such terms and conditions as the Board think fit.

(3) A power other than animal power shall not be used as a motive power on the tramway until bye-laws or regulations have been made with regard thereto under Section 8 of the principal Act, and shall not be used otherwise than in accordance with those regulations.

7.—(1) A person shall not wilfully injure, obstruct, or trespass on the tramway or any engine or carriage used upon it.

(2) If any person acts in contravention of this provision, that person shall, for each offence, be liable to a fine not exceeding five pounds.

8. Sections 49 and 50 of the Tramways Act, 1870, which provide penalties in the case of obstruction in laying out the tramway, and in the case of wilful injury or obstruction to the tramway shall apply in the case of the tramway authorized by this Order as they apply in the case of a tramway under the said Act.

9. The Secretary of State shall cause notice of any bye-laws or regulations made with regard to the tramway under Section 8 of the principal Act to be published in such manner as the Board of Trade direct.

10. In the event of the tramway or any portion thereof being worked by electricity, the Secretary of State shall conform with any conditions the Board of Trade may impose with a view to prevent injury caused by fusion or electrolytic action, or the interference with any electric wire, line, or apparatus, and with any conditions which the Postmaster-General may impose for the protection of any electric wire, line, apparatus, or work belonging to or used by him.

Provisions as to Roads.

11. The provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, mentioned in paragraph (a) of section four of the principal Act, being Sections 26 to 33 (both inclusive) of the said Tramways Act, 1870, are incorporated with and form part of this Order so far as regard the construction and maintenance of the tramway where it is laid across any road being a carriage way on the level, subject as follows:—

The provisions of Sections 27 and 30 of the Tramways Act, 1870, with respect to penalties, and so much of Section 28 of the said Act as authorizes the road authority, in the event of the promoters failing to comply with the provisions of the said section, themselves to do the works therein mentioned at the expense of the promoters, shall not be incorporated with this Order, and the following provisions shall apply and have effect in lieu thereof, viz. :—

In any case in which it is represented in writing to the Board of Trade by the road authority of any district in which the tramway is situate, or by twenty inhabitant ratepayers of that district, that the Secretary of State has made any default in complying with any of the requirements of Sections 27 or 28 of the Tramways Act, 1870, as respects any road in the district, the Board of Trade may, if they think fit, direct an inquiry as to the matters in dispute by an officer to be appointed by the Board, and that officer shall make a report in writing to the Board, and if the Board certify that the default mentioned in the representation has been proved to their satisfaction, the Secretary of State shall make good the default in the manner and within the time specified in the certificate, and if he fail to do so the road authority may themselves at any time after seven days' notice to the Secretary of State make good the default in the manner so specified, and the expense incurred by the road authority in so doing shall be repaid to them by the Secretary of State out of any moneys to be provided by Parliament and applicable for that purpose.

12. The following provisions shall, in addition to the other provisions of this Order, and of any enactments incorporated therewith, apply with respect to such parts of the tramway as are by

this Order authorized to be laid across any road being a carriage way on the level, viz. :—

(1) The rails shall be such as the Board of Trade approve.

(2) The tramway shall be laid and maintained in such manner that the uppermost surface of the rail shall be on a level with the surface of the road, and if any road authority hereafter alter the level of the road whereon any of such tramways is laid or authorized to be laid, the Secretary of State shall alter or (as the case may be) lay the rails so that the uppermost surface thereof shall be on a level with the surface of the road as altered.

(3) The Secretary of State shall at all times maintain and keep in good condition and repair to the satisfaction of the road authority, and so as not to be a danger or annoyance to traffic, the rails of which any of such tramways for the time being consist, and the substructure upon which the same rest, and if the Secretary of State fails to comply with this provision, the same provisions shall apply as apply under this Order in the case of the failure by the Secretary of State to comply with the requirements of Sections 27 or 28 of the Tramways Act, 1870, as incorporated with this Order.

13. Every local authority shall at all times have free access to and communication with all their sewers and drains underneath any part of a road across which the tramways are laid on the level, and power to lay lateral and private drains to communicate therewith without the consent or concurrence of the Secretary of State, and the provisions contained in Sections 32 and 33 of the Tramways Act, 1870, shall be applicable in the case of any such sewer or drain of or under the control of the local authority as if the same were a pipe for the supply of gas or water.

14. Sections 61 and 62 of the Tramways Act, 1870, which relate to the right to regulate traffic on roads, and the right of the public to use roads shall apply with reference to any road across which the tramway is laid under this Order as they apply with reference to roads across which a tramway is laid under that Act.

15. Nothing in this Order shall take away any power of any road authority to widen, alter, divert, or improve any road across which the tramway is laid.

16. Notwithstanding anything in this Order, the Secretary of State shall not acquire or be deemed to acquire any right other than that of user of any road across which the tramway is laid.
