WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of East Suffolk) Order, 1902.

Dated 18th January, 1902.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1895, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of East Suffolk, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of East Suffolk) Order, 1902."

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of East Suffolk to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Avocet, Wheatear, Whinchat, Great Bustard, Little Bustard, Crossbill, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Marsh Harrier, Hen Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Rough Legged Buzzard, Hobby, Common Martin, Sand Martin, Swallow, Swift, Nuthatch, Redstart, Robin, Turtle Dove, Bearded Tit, Longtailed Tit, Osprey, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Blackcap, Garden Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiffchaff, Stonechat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Golden Crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), Kentish Plover.

Close Time extended.

III. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds (other than the Wild Duck) is prohibited within the Administrative County of East Suffolk, shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February and the first day of September in each year, the close time for the Wild Duck remaining as fixed by "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," namely, between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of August in every year.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following the killing or taking of the following kinds of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of East Suffolk:—

Avocet, Nightingale, Goldfinch, Nightjar, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Kingfisher, Cuckoo, Barn Owl, Tawny Owl, Long Eared Owl, Short Eared Owl, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Rough Legged Buzzard, Merlin, Hobby, Osprey, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), Swallow, Sand Martin, House Martin, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Longtailed Tit, Common (or Corn) Bunting, Black-headed Bunting (Reed Sparrow), Cirl Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Robin, Wheatear, Stonechat, Whinchat, Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Blackcap, Garden Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiffchaff, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Bittern, Redstart, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Nuthatch, Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Spoonbill, Great Bustard, Little Bustard, Thick-knee.

All Birds Protected on Sundays within a certain Area.

V. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited in the portion of the Administrative County of East Suffolk which is situated to the east of the London to Great Yarmouth main line of the Great Eastern Railway in the said Administrative County, and in the following parishes or such parts thereof as are not situated to the east of the said main line in the said Administrative County, namely:—

Akenham, Barking-cum-Darmsden and Needham Market, Barsham, Baylham, Bealings

Magna, Bealings Parva, Beccles, Belstead, Belton, Benhall, Bentley, Blakenham Great, Blakenham Little, Blaxhall, Braintree, Bramfield, Branford, Brampton, Branham, Bromeswell, Burgh Castle, Campsey Ash, Claydon, Coddenham, Darsham, Eyke, Farnham, Fritton, Glemham Little, Halesworth, Herringfleet, Holton (near Halesworth), Kelsale-cum-Carlton, Martlesham, Melton, Middleton, Pettistree, Playford, Redisham, Ringsfield, Rushmere St. Andrew (near Ipswich), Saxmundham, Shadingfield, Spexhall, Sproughton, Tattingstone, Tuddenham St. Martin, Ufford, Wenbaston-with-Mells Hamlet, Westerfield, Westhall, Weston, Wherstead, Whitton, Wickham Market, Wissett, Woodbridge, Yoxford, also so much of the following estuaries and tidal waters as are within the body of the County of Suffolk, and lie above or to the landward side of the following lines respectively, namely:—

STOUR AND ORWELL.

A line drawn straight from the Tower, in Walton-on-the-Naze, in the county of Essex, to the seaward extremity of Landguard Point, in the county of Suffolk.

Provided that nothing in the said Order shall apply to any wild duck decoy, for the time being used as such, or any pond used in connection therewith, in the said portion of the said Administrative County or in any of the foregoing parishes.

EGGS.

All Eggs Protected in certain Areas.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Birds is prohibited for a period of five years from the date of this Order in the following places within the Administrative County of East Suffolk, namely, the sea coast, beach, foreshore, sandhills, saltings, or salt marshes, situate between the sea or estuaries and the land side of the sea or estuarial wall, embankment, ditch, fence, or other artificial or natural boundary separating the same from the cultivated land, from the north side of the River Blyth to Landguard Point (excluding the estuary of the Alde above the ferry at Slaughden Quay, Aldeburgh).

Repeal of former Order.

The Order of the 19th December, 1898, is hereby repealed.

BYE-LAW (No. 18) made by the Fishery Board for Scotland, under the powers conferred on the Board by the Sea Fisheries Regulation (Scotland) Act, 1895.

1. This Bye-law shall extend and apply to the waters comprised within the following limits, viz.:—A straight line drawn from Bannan Head, Ayrshire, to a point three miles north-west (magnetic); a straight line drawn from Corsewall Point Lighthouse to a point three miles north-west (magnetic); and a straight line joining the above-mentioned points.

2. From the fifteenth day of January to the thirty-first day of March in each year succeeding the date on which this Bye-law comes into force,

it shall not be lawful to prosecute within the limits above defined, seine trawling for herrings.

8. This Bye-law shall come into force from and after the date of its confirmation by the Secretary for Scotland.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Saturday, the 25th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock, on Thursday, the 30th instant.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

**The Housing of the Working Classes Act, 1890.
Part II.**

St. Pancras (Brantome Place) Improvement Scheme, 1896.

St. Pancras (Prospect Terrace) Improvement Scheme, 1896.

THE Council of the Metropolitan Borough of St. Pancras hereby give notice that the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in them, have made an Order, dated the 7th day of December, 1901, sanctioning the above Schemes, under Part II of the above mentioned Act, by the said Borough Council, in the following words:—

We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Act, do, subject to the provisions of the Act, by this our Order, sanction, require, and order as follows, that is to say:—

ART. I. We sanction the Schemes subject to the following requirements, conditions, and modifications, namely:—

(1.) In the clause relating to the Improvement Area in the Saint Pancras (Brantome Place) Improvement Scheme, 1896, the words "(on which plan the area referred to in the above recited resolution is coloured red and the neighbouring lands are coloured blue)" shall be omitted.

(2.) The Schemes, so far as they relate to streets and other matters not provided for in this Order, shall be carried out in such manner as may be determined from time to time hereafter by plans, sections, and specifications under the seal of the local authority and approved by Us.

(3.)—(a.) The Schemes shall have effect subject to the insertion therein of the provisions of this Article for the dwelling accommodation of persons of the working class displaced by the Schemes.

(b.) Suitable dwellings according to plans to be prepared by the local authority and agreed upon between them and the London County Council shall be erected on the Brantome-place area for the accommodation of four hundred and thirty persons of the working class on the Prospect-terrace area; for the accommodation of one hundred and forty-four persons of the working class; and on the Great College-street site for the accommodation of three hundred and twenty-two persons of the working class:

Provided that in the event of a difference arising between the local authority and the London County Council with respect to such plans the same shall be referred to Us and Our decision thereon shall be final and conclusive.

(c.) The dwellings to be provided in pursuance of the provisions of paragraph (b) hereof may, if the London County Council so require, be furnished in lieu of dust shoots with such suitable ash-pits within the meaning of section 141 of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, as may be in accordance with the requirements of any bye-laws made by the London County Council under the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 39 of that Act.

(4.) One-half of the Brantome-place area, and of the Prospect-terrace area shall respectively be cleared of buildings as soon as the local authority shall have acquired the same, but until such provision as is hereinbefore mentioned shall have been made on such half of the Brantome-place area for the accommodation of two hundred and fifteen persons of the working class, and on such half of the Prospect-terrace area for the accommodation of seventy-two persons of the working class; no buildings occupied as dwelling-houses at the date of the Schemes in the remaining half of each such area shall be demolished.

(5.)—(a.) If within one year from the time when one-half of each of the said areas, or the remainder of each of the said areas as the case may be, shall have been cleared of buildings as aforesaid, such dwellings as are hereinbefore required to be erected on the said areas for persons of the working class, have not been erected, the local authority shall, unless We shall otherwise order, themselves erect such dwellings.

(b.) Within two years from the date of this Order the local authority shall, unless We shall otherwise order, themselves erect such dwellings as are hereinbefore required to be erected for persons of the working class on the Great College-street site.

(c.) For the purposes of defraying the cost of the erection of such dwellings and of the acquisition, clearance, adaption, and preparation of the Great College-street site for the erection of such dwellings the local authority may borrow money as if the said purposes

were purposes for which money may be borrowed under sub-section (2) of section 46 of the Act.

(6.)—(a.) The local authority may, for the purposes of defraying the expenses, or any part thereof, incurred or to be incurred by them of and incidental to the Schemes and of carrying into effect the Schemes, including the provisions of this Article, for the dwelling accommodation of persons of the working class displaced by the Schemes, borrow such sum or sums of money as they may from time to time require, and as regards the borrowing by the local authority of any such sum or sums and the repayment thereof the provisions of sections 183 to 191 of the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, as applied by sub-section (2) of section 46 of the Housing of the Working Classes Act, 1890, shall apply as if the said purposes were purposes for which money may be borrowed under that sub-section.

(b.) The London County Council may, for the purpose of paying or contributing any sum which they may agree to pay or contribute, or which they may be ordered by a Secretary of State, pursuant to sub-section (7) of section 46 of the Housing of the Working Classes Act, 1890, to pay or contribute towards the expenses of the local authority of carrying into effect the Schemes, including the provisions of this Article, for the dwelling accommodation of persons of the working class displaced by the Schemes, borrow under, and subject to, the provisions

of the Acts for the time being, regulating the raising of money by the Council for capital purposes, such sum or sums of money as they may from time to time require.

(7.) Such of the lands in the areas comprised in the schemes as shall not be required for the purposes of providing accommodation for persons of the working class, as aforesaid, shall be dedicated as a highway or open space unless we shall otherwise direct.

ART. II. We order that the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts shall be incorporated with this Order so as to enable the local authority to acquire compulsorily lands within the areas comprised in the schemes.
