The last Advices from the frontiers confirm the Accounts we had by our former Letters of the Defeat of a great Convoy of Provifons which the Tartars were conducting to Caminiec; and of 400 Moldavians by a Party of our Gamon in Campolongo; but withal, tell us, That the Hospodar of Moldavia ontinued to draw what Troops he ould together, with a Resolution mattack the Polish Garisons in that Province, and to force them to quit his Country; upon which, the King has ordered Reinforcements to be fent thither, being resolved to maintain those Places, which are 6 necessary to the Prosecution of his great Design, of annexing the Principality of Moldavia to the Crown of Poland. The Envoy of Moscowy has not yet had Audience of the King, he pretending to several Ceremonies which were never granted to

the Crown of Poland, and to Concert the Measures for carrying on the War against the Turks and Tartars the next year.
