THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated January 11, from His Majesty's Representative at The Hague, enclosing the following translation of a Decree respecting quarantine:~

Netherlands Official Gazette. No. 2, 1902.

Friday, January 3.

The Minister of the Interior, having taken into consideration that by force of the Royal Decree of 12th December, 1901 (Staatsblad No. 267), to replace the Royal Decree of 20th December, 1900 (Staatsblad No. 213), it is prohibited, excepting by permission of the Minister of the Interior, and with due observance of the instructions to be given by him to prevent the spreading of

- 1. To search for the presence of plague germs in persons and merchandise by making experiments upon animals
- 2. To perform the operation of opening the bodies of persons who have died of the plague or are suspected of having had the plague.
- 3. To convey substances which are plague germs, or are suspected of being plague germs.

Having read the advice of the Inspectors for the Medical State Supervision of 16th May, 1900;

Has approved and sanctioned:

S. 1.

The examination of persons and merchandise for the presence of plague germs by making experiments upon animals.

Requests for permission for an examination of the kind may be made to the Inspector for the Medical State Supervision, in whose district the examination is to be made.

With them must be given all possible information about the arrangements of the locality where the examination is to be made, and the precautions which will be taken at the examination to

prevent the spreading of the plague germs.

Among others must be proved what precautions have been taken by the applicant-

- (a.) To make the locality where the examination will be made inaccessible to persons whose presence is not required at the examination, and to animals which are not used for it.
- (b.) To prevent the escape of animals upon
- which experiments have been made.
 (c.) To have the animals experimented upon properly killed.

(d.) For the persons' clothes and articles to be

properly disinfected.

Further shall be declared what persons will be present at the examination, and information must be given about the ability, experience, accuracy, and reliability of the persons who will assist at the examination.

The Inspector for the Medical State Supervision, after consulting (if necessary) with other experts, shall forward the request with his advice, as quickly as possible (if necessary by telegraph), to the Minister of the Interior.

The opening of the bodies of persons who have died of the plague or are suspected of

having had the plague.

Applications for permission to perform this operation may be made to the Inspector for the Medical State Supervision in whose district the operation is to take place.

With them must be given all possible informa-

tion about:

(a.) The manner in which the substances taken from the body will be kept beyond the reach of animals which might spread the infection.

(b.) The manner in which the substances will

be collected and made harmless.

(c.) The precautions against the spreading of plague germs to be taken by the persons who perform the operation of opening the body and their assistants.

The Inspector for the Medical State Supervision, after consulting (if necessary) with other experts, shall forward the application with his advice as quickly as possible (if necessary by telegraph) to the Minister of the Interior.

S. 3.

The transport of substances which are plague germs or suspected of being plague germs.

The transport of these substances unaccompanied is prohibited with every kind of con-

The transport is allowed if accompanied by an Inspector of the Medical State Supervision, by a professor, director of a pathological, hygienical, or pharmaceutical laboratium, by a medical man, or by a person having in his possession a special written authorization from an inspector, a professor, or a medical man as above mentioned, provided that-

(a.) The substance to be examined is placed in a well closed bottle with stopper, closed water tight, properly surrounded by some absorbent packing material, the whole placed in a well fastened wooden case.

(b.) The package has a distinct address, and the words "infected substance" are marked on the outside of the package.

ARTICLE 2. Ces provenances, arrivant par mer, seront soumises à la station sanitaire de l'Escaut et dans les porte d'Ostende et de Nieuport, ainsi qu'à Selzaete, au régime stipulé par les chapitres Il, III et IV du règlement sanitaire général annexé à la Convention sanitaire internationale de Venise, en date du 19 mars 1897.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 23rd JANUARY 1902.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The holding of a market fair sale or exhibition of cattle sheep or swine within the parishes of Llantwit-Major and Llanmaes, in the administrative county of Glamorgan, is hereby prohibited.

2. If a market fair sale or exhibition of cattle sheep or swine is held within either of the said parishes in contravention of this Order, the person or company holding the same, and the occupier of the place or premises where the market or fair or sale or exhibition is held, and the owner or consignee of each head of cattle and of each sheep or pig exposed thereat, and the person exposing the same thereat, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting the sale or exhibition, and the person, if any, taking entrance-money or other payment for admission thereto, and the purchaser thereat of any cattle sheep or swine, such lastmentioned person or such purchaser knowing the market or fair or sale or exhibition to be held in

contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1891.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred

and two.
